The World has no hesitation in warning Canadians of the dangers of the present situation. Never before in our estimation were the times so critical in its race with Russia, France and other European powers. We are sorry to note that many English statesmen are thinking more of an Anglo-American alliance or "good understanding" with our neighbors than of a federation of the Mother Country and her daughter states—colonies no longer are, Mr. Chamberlain found time to spend weeks in the States, but not a day in Canada.

Canada it was that first created the idea of the solidification of the mother country and her daughter states. Canadians have contributed more to the thought on this question than any other portion of the empire. Canadians have made sacrifices to this end and are prepared to make more. But no more say we in face of how things are moving to-day. English statesmen, on the contrary, were only beginning to grasp the idea of federation, were only beginning to see what a preferential tariff, improved postal facilities, meant when all their energies were suddenly diverted—almost abjectly diverted—toward the cultivation of "an alliance" with the United States.

The people of the United States, and especially their politicians, stop at nothing. Under the pretext of a war to free Cuba they have driven Spain out of America, captured her colonies, set up some kind of colonial government in the Antilles, have declared for a policy of "imperial expansion" and have repudiated in a single night all the teachings and practices in connection with their policy for over 100 years.

We are not at all hasty in sounding the alarm under these circumstances, and especially when it is known that one of the most aggressive speeches in this direction yet made was made in the hearing of the President of the U. S. on his recent trip to the south. Major McKinley made a tour of Alabama and Georgia the other day, having in his entourage a number of the "heroes of the Spanish war" and everywhere they were received with loudest acclaim and all kinds of patriotic demonstrations.

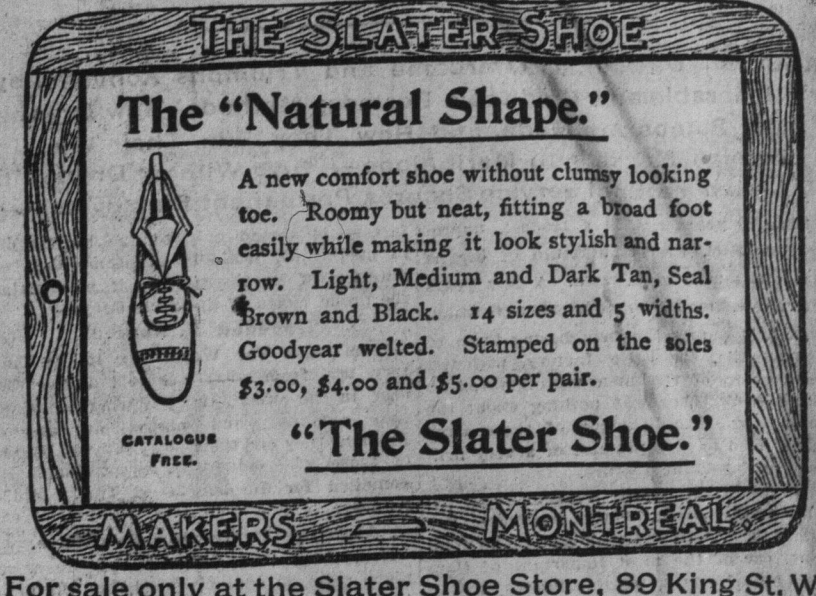
Now, just one word more. The President has come among you; your President and my President, and he comes as the exemplar and the head of the great American nation. [Cheers.] He has done more for it than any President since the days of Washington, for he has added vastly to its extent and striven to make it a continental republic, as the fathers designed it to be. [Cheers.] He has extended its borders to such a distance that the sun rises upon it in the east before it sets upon the west.

This speech was published on the editorial page of the New York Sun, and is described as a "notable speech," and is published under the heading "Continental Enlargement." We believe that these words of Gen. Wilson only voice too well the opinions of a great many Americans, who, if once their appetite for expansion is aroused in the direction of the north and if once they get it into their heads that they only have to go far enough in their great game of bluff, which seems to be their best and strongest card in diplomacy, will force Canada willy-nilly into annexation.

AN OBJECT LESSON FROM RUSSIA. The country that is geographically most similar to Canada is Russia. The two countries occupy practically the same latitude and their climate is virtually the same. The greatest public work ever undertaken in Canada was the building of the C.P.R. from the Atlantic to the Pacific, so the most gigantic undertaking ever prosecuted in Russia. The C.P.R. was visited by Russian railway engineers, and the information obtained by them proved of service in the construction of the railway through Siberia.

WORLD'S GOLD YIELD, 1898

How the Different Countries Figure in It.

Transvaal to the Front and Canada a Real Factor—Capt. Hale on Ontario Mines—Says Golden Star is All Right—More Rich Finds Near Rat Portage—Mining Exchange Sales.

According to present information there is no prospect of a large increase in the world's gold production of 1898. The Transvaal, which was a little behind the United States in 1897, is going to far outstrip that country this year. It looks as if its output would be upwards of 3,500,000 fine ounces. It is doubtful whether the United States will show an increase or a decrease. There has been undoubtedly a large increase in the production of Colorado, but owing to the drought on the Pacific Coast, California will show a heavy decrease. However, the Black Hills and some other districts have been doing well, so that on the whole there are disposed to look for an increase in the production of the United States, but it is not likely to be large. With respect to Australia, the different colonies are showing different results, but in general there is an increase in its production. This will not be very large in New South Wales, Victoria and New Zealand, but in Queensland it will be a very large one. In Western Australia it will be immense. Tasmania alone will show a decrease. British India will show an increase, but not a large one. British Guiana will show a considerable decrease. Rhodesia appears as a gold producer for the first time, its output promising to be about 10,000 ounces. Canada will show a large increase on account of the Klonklat and Klondike. The latter of which has been a really important producer. Information is still scanty as to Mexico, but we expect an increase there. As to Russia, no figures are yet available, but there is no reason yet to anticipate a large increase in its production. This is not to be looked for probably until after another decade, perhaps a half a century. For the present the great empire which once ranked as the leading gold producer of the world has slipped to the position of a minor producer, but it is not likely that its relative position as a gold producer will be changed materially this year. It will not be long before Ontario and British Columbia will rank Canada figures as a leading producer.

Ontario to the Front.

Capt. Hale who has been for some time in the New Klondike district of Ontario, operating up mining properties on behalf of a syndicate, in which he is interested, has been in Toronto for a few days. He is now on his way to Buffalo. The New Klondike is situated south of the St. Lawrence and the P. R. track, near Wabigoon station. Capt. Hale is well satisfied with the prospects in that country. He is a practical miner and has had a large experience in mining all over the world. He thinks the property over the whole St. Lawrence River country are excellent, and during the next couple of years a great development will take place. He refers to the property which he is operating as "The Klondike." It is owned by H. W. 418, controlled by the Hon. Mr. Watson of Winnipeg. He stated a shaft has been sunk 110 feet, and that construction was let for doing 300 feet of drifting. Mr. Watson refused \$100,000 for another property in the New Klondike, owned by an English company. One vein has been exposed for one mile in width, and from 8 to 12 feet in width. The assays in this place run from \$8 to \$10 per ton. According to Capt. Hale American capitalists are after iron properties in the Adirondack district. He says that over 200 acres have already been purchased by them. The iron in these deposits is as rich as anything in Minnesota. Speaking of the Golden Star, Capt. Hale said it was a very good find. He thought it was a very good find. It was of a rotten character, and would assay high in gold, not less than \$20 in his opinion.

Rainy Lake Herald.

The Rainy Lake Herald has come out with a special mining edition, handsomely printed and illustrated. It conveys interesting information regarding the gold fields of Northwestern Ontario and of the Selkirk River district in particular.

More Rich Strikes.

Mr. Z. S. Williams, mining engineer of Rat Portage, writes under date of Dec. 20, as follows: News has just come from the Black Sturgeon mine, siting the Princess, of an enormously rich strike in the bottom of the shaft, about 180 feet from the surface. The men say the quartz is simply laid to bed with a little gold. Yesterday night came from the Boulder location, south of the Sultana, of a very rich strike. It is now this of the Black Sturgeon, on the back of the Mikado. In fact there is no doubt that as strikes are being discovered this is turning out one of the richest gold producing centres in the world, and as work goes on others quite as rich will be found.

Childwell Knew Nothing of It.

The Mail yesterday took back its story of a sale of the Sultana. It published a letter from Mr. J. E. Childwell, owner of the mine, saying that he knew nothing of the deal reported by that journal. The World showed the story up as false as day after its publication.

Good News from the Yukon.

Mr. H. Manley of this city, who has spent the greater part of the year in the Yukon gold district, has just returned from Dawson City, and after a brief stay in Toronto, will next month sail by the Empress of Canada on business connected with the mining interests with which he is associated. He reports everywhere signs of improvement, and says of the Klondike mine, in which he is personally interested, that its prospects are of the most gratifying character. He gave a very glowing account of this and other mines in the district, and said that the very operations have been very successful. He spoke highly of the administration of Mr. Ogilvie, and believed that next season would be one

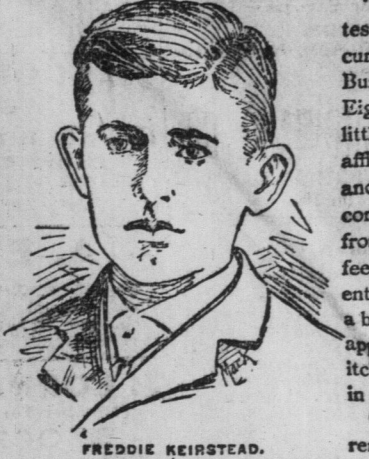
