MEET IN STRATFORD NEXT

Knights of Pythias Elected Two Toronto Men to Office in Grand Lodge.

GRAND TRUNK YARDMAN KILLED

Hamilton, July 10.—(Special.)—At this morning's session of the Grand Lodge of Ontario of the Knights of Pythias, the Committee on State of the Order read a report and recommended that the Supreme representatives be instructed to support the change in the Supreme Statutes necessary to allow members to be initiated at the age of 18 years and over. JAPS GAIN VICTORY.

Striking White and Indian Fishermen Attempt Interference. Vancouver, B. C., July 10.—The striking white and Indian fishermen of the Fraser River followed 1000 Japanese boats yesterday, with the intention of interfering with the latter, but were forced to return without accomplishing anything. Fifteen patrol boats of the strikers followed the Japanese boats, but they had only got started, when 20 Japanese boats, manned by 300 Japanese, everyone showing a rifle, put into the river, and the strikers retired without a shot being fired.

Betram, vice-president of the Diesel Metal Co.; W. G. Mitchell of Todman & Mitchell, and L. J. Cosgrave, president of the Cosgrave Bros. Co.

KISSED THE PRETTY NURSE.

Physician in German Hospital at Brooklyn May Be Dismissed.

New York, July 10.—Dr. Reuss, one of the youngest of the young physicians of the German Hospital in Brooklyn, has been disciplined by the Medical Board and his dismissal recommended to the Board of Managers, the charge against him being that he kissed one of the young and pretty nurses connected with the institution.

ALLEGED ANTI-BRITISH TALK.

Woodstock Teacher Says He Would Not Glorify War.

Woodstock, July 10.—The dismissal of Messrs. Stevenson and Errett from the staff of the Collegiate Institute of this city, for alleged anti-British sentiments, expressed in the classroom, is causing a warm discussion. The fact that the gentlemen were dismissed upon the ground that they were disloyal to the British Empire, is being regarded as a sufficient reason for their removal.

SIFTON ON RICHARDSON.

Father of Minister of Interior Thinks Him Dead.

One of the delegates to the Dominion Alliance, which closed its annual convention yesterday afternoon, was John W. Sifton of Ontario, Minister of the Interior. Mr. Sifton, who is a western newspaper man, and one of the stockholders of The Winnipeg Free Press, discussed the League of Nations and expressed the opinion that Richardson is politically dead. He has alienated the Conservatives by his opposition to the Manitoba railway deal, and if he is unseated, will receive little support in the constituency in the event of his undertaking to run again.

FRANCE AND BRITAIN.

Former Sells Letter One-Third of Her Exports.

Montreal, July 10.—(Special.)—L. A. Perrier, French inspector of the Equitable Insurance Co., who has just returned from Europe, has been making a study of French politics. He says the French elections will take place in May next, and the chances are that the present ruling party will be maintained, although it does not follow, he adds, that the Waldeck-Rousseau ministry will be able to hold on to office. He says France sells one-third of her exports to England, and war between the two countries is impossible.

RADIAL RAILWAYS.

At a meeting of the St. Lawrence Market Improvement Association, held yesterday (Wednesday) evening, in the office of the Steele, Briggs Company, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted: That the representatives of the Market Improvement Association respect the necessity of taking prompt and active steps to secure the running of radial railways into St. Lawrence Market, now that the improvements therein are nearly completed, as this was one of the main, or most important, causes of the city going to such a large expenditure as that authorized for said improvements.

LITTLE WILLA DROWNED.

Parry Sound, July 10.—Willie, aged 13, daughter of Mrs. Thomas Adair, was drowned to-day from the steam yacht "Bobbs." The body has not yet been recovered.

WIPED OFF FACE OF EARTH

Cloudburst Destroys the Town of Corbin, Near Helena, in Montana.

HOUSES TORN FROM FOUNDATIONS

Frame on Railways Stopped and Communication Cut Off—Texas Town Swept Away.

Helena, Mont., July 10.—A cloudburst reported to have almost destroyed the town of Corbin, 30 miles south of Helena. No loss of life has yet been reported, but it is thought certain that the escape of all the inhabitants was impossible.

Corbin is situated close to a line of foothills of the Rockies. During the night a terrific storm prevailed. Water rushed down the hills in dense volumes, and in a short time the large Peck concentrator was partially wrecked. Houses were torn from their foundations, and reduced to debris. Traffic on the Northern Pacific and Great Northern was stopped by wash, and communication was cut off.

It is estimated that the loss of the concentrator alone will run into the thousands.

Residents of this city familiar with the surrounding hills of Corbin are of the opinion that a loss of life must have accompanied the flood.

Port Swept Away.

Ashton, Texas, July 10.—Private telegrams state that Port La Vega, Calhoun County, Texas, was swept away last night by a storm. Nearly all the houses were blown away, and a large number of boats were wrecked, but no lives are known to have been lost. La Vega is on La Vega Bay, Gulf of Mexico.

TO-DAY'S STRIKE SETTLEMENT.

Whether or Not Shall Steel Mills Be Re-opened.

Pittsburgh, Pa., July 10.—The steel strike situation was quiet today pending the conference called for tomorrow in this city. Everything is ready for the meeting. All details have been arranged and the indications point to a short session and an amicable adjustment of the differences. There will be but one point presented—whether all the mills of the two companies shall be re-opened or not. For this reason the amalgamated people will not be present. The steel companies have agreed to a 10 per cent. advance in wages, but as executive officials to outline the policy of their organization.

Two more signatures to the amalgamated list were received today. They were the Standard Coal Company of Columbia, Ohio, and Monongahela Iron and Steel Company, Homestead, Pa.

Yonkers, N.Y., July 10.—At the bi-monthly wage conference here today before representatives of the Amalgamated Association and Secretary Natt of the Labor Bureau of the Republic Iron and Steel Company, the wages for builders were advanced from \$4.75 to \$5.25 per hour. Plasterers were given an advance of about five per cent. The increase dates from July 1, and affects about 40,000 employees, including workmen employed in independent iron plants, as well as employees of the Republic Company.

CHARGED WITH FRAUD.

Hamilton Woman Said to Have Victimised a Score.

Hamilton, Ont., July 10.—(Special)—Mrs. Mary Lander, 155 North Caroline-street, was arrested to-night on two charges of fraud preferred by Andrew Cameron, a dealer, and J. P. Gage, grocer. The woman, it is alleged, has defrauded fifteen or twenty merchants, including G.O.D. and having them sent to a wrong address. In each case she took some of the goods ordered with her.

WASHINGTON CROP STATISTICS.

Washington, July 10.—Crop statistics compiled by the Department of Agriculture show a reduction in the acreage of 5 per cent. from last year. The condition of the crop is not as favorable as last year. The amount of wheat, including the hands of farmers on July 1, is estimated at about 3,000,000 bushels, or 8.8 per cent. of the crop. Wheat acreage slightly above last year, but the yield shows a decrease; barley an increase, and rice is above the average.

FATALITY BURNED.

Ballston, N.Y., July 10.—Mrs. Dannel of Round Lake was fatally burned today by the explosion of a gasoline stove in her home. Mrs. Wilson, her daughter, was severely burned in trying to save the mother. The explosion set fire to the house, but the fire department extinguished the flames before much damage was done.

DIAMONDS RECOVERED.

Winnipeg, July 10.—Lillian Delaney was arrested at Port Arthur, charged with pinning out with a couple of diamonds belonging to well-known men in Winnipeg. The rings were taken from her and she left for the Soo.

SUICIDED AT THE CITADEL.

Halifax, July 10.—Gunner David Smith of the Royal Artillery, suicided at the Citadel this afternoon. He placed a cartridge in his mouth and blew the top of his head off.

Niagara Falls, July 10.—Burglars entered the store of E. C. They also went into the safe, which stood open, smashing in the wooden lockers therein, but secured no further booty.
