TROOPS SLAUGHTER PARADERS IN WARSAW WORKMEN RETALIATE BY HURLING BOMBS

Nearly 100 Persons Killed or Wounded by Wanton Attempt of Soldiers to Prevent Processions.

CAVALRY CHARGE, INFANTRY FIRE VOLLEYS FOLLOW ESCAPING MOB

Warsaw, May 1.—Nearly 100 people were killed or wounded in disturbances in various quarters of Warsaw to-day. The troops apparently were uncontrollable and violated all orders to act with moderation. They fired into crowds of demonstrators and women in retaliation for the use of firearms and bombs. What approaches a reign of terror exists to-night; the city presents a most gloomy aspect, and the temper of the entire community suggests a May-day opened with every prospect that the recent rioting would find a peaceful ending. The first disturbances occurred between 1 and 2 p.m., when a procession of several thousand workmen, carrying red flags, marched along Zielonska street. BRITISH MINISTER AT FEZ TO SUPPORT FRENCH POLICY

Visit of Gerard Lowther is More Than a Mere Trip to Present Credentials as German Press Has Said.

Paris, April 1.—The British minister to Morocco, Gerard Lowther, in the course of an interview with the Temps correspondent at Tangier to-day, made the first official declaration that the purpose of his visit to Fez is to support the French policy in Morocco. He said: "When I first arrived at Tangier I sent my credentials to the sultan before the autumn, but under the present conditions, I start for Fez in three weeks. My mission will not be merely to draw a protocol. I will converse with the sultan and the French minister on the questions under that clause of the Franco-British accord, in which the two governments undertake to lend their diplomatic support to the execution of that convention. "My government is all the more desirous to fulfill this duty since the French proposition submitted to the Sultan of Morocco strictly conforms to the spirit of the accord of April 8, threatening the interest of no third party, and guaranteeing the security of Morocco, and providing for the gradual development of the country without sudden transition. "Mr. Lowther's statement controverts the view of the German official press, that he goes to Fez merely to present his credentials.

Nebogoff Has Had Heavy Mists to Cover His Movements Along Coast Since Saturday.

Saigon, May 1.—Denne for hides the entire coast line. Cable messages from Singapore on the south and Hie on the northeast say that heavy mists have prevailed continuously since Saturday morning, thus blotting out all chances of observing the movements of the Russian fleet. 1000 OF CHICAGO TEAMSTERS TO CARRY LOADED RIFLES WHILE THEY DRIVE TO-DAY

Yesterday Marked by More Violence and the Appearance of Farley and Hundreds of His Professional Strike Breakers.

Chicago, May 1.—Conditions in the teamsters' strike were worse today than at any preceding time. The strikers were in uglier mood. The rioting was more open and vicious and the attacks on non-striker men were more frequent and daring. This was because the Employers' Teaming Association brought 1500 men into Chicago to take the places of strikers, and 600 more, it is said, will arrive within twelve hours. To-morrow, on every wagon of the Employers' Teaming Association that goes thru the streets, a rifle will be carried in open view. During the last week there has been much complaint on the part of the strike sympathizers of the readiness with which non-striker men, particularly negroes, have used revolvers. A number of strike-breakers have been arrested on a charge of carrying concealed weapons, and to-day over 1000 rifles were purchased. During the latter part of the afternoon a number of wagons went thru the streets with a rifle lying across the knees of the driver and his assistant.
