

SECOND ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE

Year 1881-82.

The year 1881-82 has been, in every respect, a period of progress for Notre-Dame Hospital. Sustained during the first months of its existence by generous assistance from the Provincial government, the Quebec and Montreal seminaries, as well as several citizens, there is reason to believe that the institution may at present rely upon a larger income guaranteed both by the generosity of the public and the zeal of devoted persons who have taken it upon themselves to assure the success of this work of charity.

At the beginning of the year which has just closed, the first regular subscription was established in favour of the hospital. Owing to circumstances the lists could not be made so perfect as was desirable, and the consequence was that the final result did not meet the expectation of those concerned. The result is very satisfactory all the same, however, inasmuch as the treasurer reports the sum of \$11,579.25 for the current year.

The last year was also signalized by the establishment of the board of governors, and that of the Ladies' committee.

According to the rules and regulations of the hospital the board of governors consists of all the life governors and of not more than twelve elected governors. This board attends to the general affairs of the institution and must meet at least four times a year.

It will be remembered that, at the close of the past year, a certain number of charitable ladies, with the view of contributing to

the work of the hospital, conceived the idea of an association destined to aid in the general support of that establishment. This association is at present regularly constituted, and the lady patronesses of the hospital, to the number of about one hundred, vie with the most ardent benefactors of the work in furthering its cause. Each lady patroness pay a yearly contribution, which varies according to circumstances, and furthermore, the ladies engage to supply the hospital with all the linen and other such effects as may be required for the use of the sick.

The business of the association is conducted by a committee consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, secretary and several councillors. The committee meets at least once a month. Besides this, two of the lady patronesses visit the sick at the hospital once a week.

The most important event in connection with the operations of the year 1881-82 was the purchase of the property actually occupied by the hospital. The property was bought for the sum of \$30,000, of which \$10,000 were paid down on the signing of the deed of sale, the balance to be met within ten years at an interest of 6 per cent per annum. This transaction definitively settles the success and maintenance of the institution. The amount to be paid is certainly considerable, but the generosity of the public will doubtless prove equal to it. A list of subscription has already been opened, specially to cover the amount of the purchase money, and Mr C. S. Rodier, whose generosity is proverbial, headed the list with one thousand dollars. Several citizens have also subscribed large sums, and there is ground for hope that their example will be followed by a great number of others. Notre Dame hospital has, thus, a future which is assured. An idea may be formed of the good it is doing to all classes of our population, when it is stated that during last year, the number of cases treated, both in the interior service and the dispensaries, was double that of the year preceding.

It may not be out of place to recall here a few of the points set forth in last year's report, as they will tend to show how the directors of Notre Dame Hospital, intend going about the care of the sick confided to them.

"The hospital is opened to all the needy sick, *without distinction of race or creed*. For such of the patients as have the means of paying something, there are in the hospital private wards where they may enjoy all the comfort desirable, and where, indeed, they may be treated by their own doctor or any physician of their choice.

"Four physicians regularly attend the wards and the dispensaries.

Furthermore, there are two resident physicians in the hospital itself. These resident physicians have charge of the admittance of patients, and must see that all the prescriptions and directions of the attending physicians are strictly carried out. It is also their duty to take care that the numerous cases of accident daily brought to the hospital are carefully attended to. According to the by-law the resident physicians shall not both absent themselves from the hospital at one and the same time, so that the sick may always rely upon immediate attendance, day or night, in cases of emergency, and this is a guarantee deserving of the highest appreciation.

"The care of the sick is entrusted to the reverend Grey Nuns, fourteen of whom reside continually in the hospital. In addition to these, two ladies of the same community come to the hospital every evening, to watch the sick during the night.

"Finally, the hospital has a catholic chaplain or almoner who provides the succors and consolations of religion to all that stand in need of them. Patients belonging to any of the protestant churches or to any other form of worship, may rest assured that they may have the assistance of the clergyman of their choice as soon, and as often as they may wish.

REPORT OF THE MEDICAL BOARD
FOR THE YEAR 1881-82.

On 31st of July, 1881, there remained in the hospital (from the preceding year) 43 patients; 20 males and 23 females.

During the year ending July 31st, 1882, 876 patients were admitted, 468 males and 408 females, making a total number of 919 patients for the whole year.

In the general out-door departments there were consultations, prescriptions, medicines, &c., given to 3,094 patients, both catholics and protestants. Out of these there were 1338 males and 1756 females.

In the out-door eye and ear department, 778 patients were treated, including 357 males and 421 females; and 5,853 prescriptions were given.

Thus the total number of patients treated at the hospital in both out-door and in-door department, was 4,791.

If we compare those figures with the statement of the preceding report we find the following increase.
