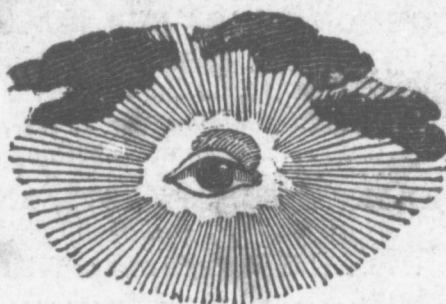

### ECLIPSES OF THE SUN AND MOON.

In the year 1837, there will be three THREE Eclipses of the Sun, and Two of the Moon.

I. The *first* will be of Sun, at the time of New Moon in April, a very small eclipse, and visible only in a small part of the Southern Ocean.

II. The *second* will be of the Moon, at the time of the full in April, a total eclipse, but invisible in the Provinces, as the Moon will be below the horizon—Visible throughout the Eastern Continent.

III. The *third* will be of the Sun, at the time of New Moon in May, invisible; the penumbra passing by to the North. The greatest eclipse (about 7 digits,) will be in the Russian Possessions, near the North West Coast of North America, a little north and east of Mount St. Elias, in the Country of the Kolinsches Indians: the penumbra coming from the Pacific Ocean on the south west will pass over the northern part of North America into the Atlantic Ocean to the Shetland Islands, where it will leave the earth at the going down of the Sun.

IV. The *fourth* will be of the Moon, on Friday October the 13th visible and total. The Earth's penumbra coming on, may be perceived at the Moon's rising.

V. The *fifth* and last will be of the Sun at the time of New Moon in October, a very small eclipse and visible in no part of the civilized world, but in the Antarctic and Southern Atlantic Oceans, and at the New South Shetland and Sandwich Islands, Cape Horn, Terra-del-Fuego, and a small part of Patagonia.

### ORIENTAL AND OCCIDENTAL STARS.

The planet VENUS will be *Morning Star*, till May 18th, when she will be in superior conjunction with the Sun; the remainder of the year she will be *Evening Star*.

JUPITER will be *Morning Star* till 1st February, when he will be in opposition to the Sun; thence *Evening Star* till Aug. 22d, when he will be in conjunction with the Sun; after that he will be *Morning Star* through the year.

MARS will be *Morning Star* till 5th February, when he will be in opposition to the Sun; thence he will be *Evening Star*, to the end of the year.

SATURN will be *Morning Star* till May 4th, when he will be in opposition to the Sun, thence *Evening Star* till the conjunction with the Sun, Nov. 12th; and then again *Morning Star*.

*First column* contains the days of the month—*second*, days of the week—*third*, Holy-days, Weather, &c.—*fourth*, Rising of the Sun—*fifth*, Setting of the Sun—*sixth*, Sun's declination in hours and minutes—*seventh*, Rising and Setting of the Sun—*eighth*, Moon's Southing—*ninth*, Moon's place in the signs—*tenth*, the time of high water at Halifax.

The top of the columns shows the Moon's phases, or the times of new and full Moon, and of the first and last quarter, or two quadratures with the Sun.

To find the length of the day, add 12 hours to the time of the Sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

The Sun's Declination, at mean noon, is taken from the Nautical Almanack. It denotes the *apparent* position of the true Sun with reference to the Equator, and the true Equinox, at the instant the Greenwich mean time clock, or chronometer, indicates 0h. 0m. 0s. or when the hour angle of the true Sun is equal to the equation of time.

How, with a refinement of cruelty almost peculiar to itself, does it fly in the face of its victims, and hold their quivering eye-balls in its fangs till they abhor the light and swim in blood!

The bodies of some drunkards have been so thoroughly steeped in spirit as literally to take fire and consume to ashes. It is said that no case of this combustion has ever occurred except among hard drinkers, and it is altogether probable, that, in every case, an inflammable air has exhaled from the lungs or skin, or both, and has been kindled by the too near approach of a lighted taper, or some ignited substance. A French Chemist, it is said, after drinking a pint of ether during the day, used to amuse himself in the evening by lighting up his breath, directed in a very small stream upon the flame of a lamp. Alcohol, taken in large quantities, would probably, in some constitutions at least, occasion a similar vapor to be thrown from the lungs; and there is doubtless more danger than has been imagined, in a

deep drinker's bringing his mouth or nose close to a lighted candle at evening. The wonder is, that instances of the combustion of drunkards should have so rarely occurred. Ploquet mentions 28 cases.

*The Drunkard* is a self-condemned convict, destined to be his own executioner, and, by his daily potations of liquid fire, inflicting on himself a public, disgraceful, lingering, painful death, bearing about with him, and exhibiting to all eyes, the loathsome displays of his doom, and tokens of his torments, in his carbuncled visage, lack-lustre eye, and bloated hydropical carcase.

What does the voice of common humanity say to us? Can we feel for human woe, and not be moved at the spectacle of wretchedness and despair which intemperance presents? Let us imagine the condition of the hundreds who are now burning with the hidden flame, and hastening to utter destruction by this most pitiless of all vices;

Mark that carbuncled, slaving, doubtful remnant of a man, retching and picking tansy before sunrise—loathing his breakfast—getting his ear bored to the door of a dramshop an hour after—disguised before ten—quarrelling by dinner time, and snoring drunk before supper. See him next morning at his retching and his tansy again; and, as the day advances, becoming noisy, cross, drivelling, and intoxicated. Think of his thus dragging out months and years of torture, till the earth refuses any longer to bear such a wretch upon its surface, and then tell me if any West Indian slave was ever so miserable.

But who is this that comes hobbling up, with bandaged legs, inflamed eyes, and a distorted countenance? Every step is like the piercing of a sword, or the driving of a nail among nerves and tendons. And what is the cause? The *humors*, he tells us, trouble him; and though he has applied to all the doctors far and near, he can get no relief. Ah, these wicked and inveterate

Let us embrace in one view the countless woes inflicted by the cruel tempers, the deep disgrace, the hopeless poverty, and the corrupting examples of all these victims. What undermines more insidiously every moral principle of the heart; what palsies so entirely every moral faculty of the soul; what so soon and so awfully makes *dead while he liveth*; what spreads through the whole frame-work of society such rottenness, or so effectually opens the door to all those powers of darkness; what so universally excludes from the death-bed of a sinner the consolation of the Gospel, or writes upon his grave such a sentence of despair, as intemperance?

In pointing out the evils produced by ardent spirits, let us not pass by their effects upon the estates of the persons who are addicted to them. Are they inhabitants of towns? Behold! their houses stripped gradually of their furniture, and

sold to pay tavern debts. See! their names upon record in the dockets of every court, and the newspapers filled with advertisements of their estates for public sale. Are they inhabitants of country places? Behold! their houses with shattered windows—their barns with leaky roofs—their gardens overrun with weeds—their fields with broken fences—their hogs without yokes—their sheep without wool—their horses and cattle without fat—and their children filthy and half clad, without manners, principles and morals. This picture of agricultural wretchedness is seldom of long duration. The farms and property thus neglected and depreciated are seized and sold for the benefit of a group of creditors. The children that were born with the prospect of inheriting them are bound out to service in the neighbourhood; while their parents, the unworthy authors of their misfortunes, ramble into

Look next at that wretched *hovel*, open on all sides to the rude and drenching intrusion of the elements. The panting skeleton, lying, as you see, upon a little straw in the corner, a prey to consumption, was once the owner of yonder comfortable mansion, and of that farm so rich in verdure and in sheaves. He might have owned them still, and have kept his health too, but for the love of strong drink. It is intemperance which has consumed his substance, rioted upon his flesh and his marrow, and shortened his breath, and fixed that deep sepulchral cough in his wasting vitals. Was ever a bond-slave more wretched in his dungeon? But your sympathies come too late. Perhaps you sold him the very poison which has brought him to this—or it went out sparkling from your distillery to the retailer, and thence

new and distant settlements, alternately fed on their way by the hand of charity, or a little casual labour—Thus we see poverty and misery, crimes and infamy, diseases and death, are all the natural and usual consequences of the intemperate use of ardent spirits.

We shall now take notice of the occasions and circumstances which are supposed to render the use of ardent spirits necessary, and endeavour to show that the arguments in favour of their use in such cases, are founded in error, and that in each of them ardent spirits, instead of affording strength to the body, increases the evils they are intended to relieve.

1. They are said to be necessary in very cold weather. This is far from being true, for the temporary warmth they produce is always succeeded by a greater disposition in the body to be affected by cold. Warm dresses, a plentiful meal just before exposure to the cold,

and eating occasionally a little gingerbread, or any other cordial food, is a much more durable method of preserving the heat of the body in cold weather.

2. They are said to be necessary in very warm weather. Experience proves that they increase instead of lessening the effects of heat upon the body, and thereby dispose to diseases of all kinds. Even in the warm climate of the West Indies, Dr. Bell asserts this to be true. "Rum," says this author, "whether used habitually, moderately, or in excessive quantities in the West Indies, always diminishes the strength of the body, and renders men more susceptible of disease, and unfit for any service in which vigor or activity is required." As well might we throw oil into a house, the roof of which was on fire, in order to prevent the flames from extending to its inside, as pour ardent spirits into the stomach to lessen the effects of a hot sun upon the skin.

Go next to the Poor House, and tell me whether you recognise that dropsical figure, lingering from week to week, under the slow torments of strangulation. How piercing are his shrieks, as if he was actually drowning! He was once your neighbor, thrifty, reputable, and happy—but he yielded to the blandishments of the great destroyer. He drank, first temperately, then freely, then to excess, and finally, to habitual inebriation. The consequences are before you. The swelling flood in which he catches every precarious breath, no finite power can long assuage.

Leaving him to be cast a wreck by the angry waters upon the shore of eternity; enter that hut, toward which a solitary neighbor is advancing with hurried steps. There a husband and a

3. Nor do ardent spirits lessen the effects of hard labour upon the body. Look at the horse, with every muscle of his body swelled from morning till night in the plough, or a team; does he make signs for a draught of toddy, or a glass of spirits, to enable him to cleave the ground, or to climb a hill? No—he requires nothing but cool water and substantial food. There is no nourishment in ardent spirits. The strength they produce in labour is of a transient nature, and is always followed by a sense of weakness and fatigue.

Those who have entirely relinquished the use of spirits, until the desire for it is removed, have experienced a wonderful transformation in their feelings, their conduct, and their prospects. And the change is visible not only in them, but their families, and all their concerns. Their windows are not broken out as before; nor their gates and garden-fences falling down. The kitchen

does not smoke as it used to, because they keep it more *clean*, have drier and better wood, and lay it on the fire in a better manner. The wife does not scold as she used to, because she is well provided for, is kindly treated, and has the utmost encouragement to labour. The children are not now in rags, but are comfortably and decently clad; they are obedient, respectful, and mannerly; and appear to be growing up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. In short, they appear almost like a new race of beings. And if they should never again adopt the practice of taking ardent spirits, there is vastly more reason than before, to hope that they will be led by the word and spirit of God to such a course of conduct as will greatly increase their happiness and usefulness on earth. Should each individual adopt the same course the following are some of the advantages which would result from it. I. They would enjoy

The evils of intemperance would soon be done away; for all who are now intemperate, and continue so, will soon be dead, and no others will be found to succeed them. 3. There will be a saving every year of a large amount of money, which is now expended for ardent spirits. There will be a saving of more than two thirds of all the expense of supporting the poor. And there would be a saving of all that idleness and dissipation which intemperance occasions. 4. There would be a saving of a vast portion of sickness; and of the lives of many persons every year.

Let these four considerations be added together, and traced in their various bearings and consequences upon the temporal and eternal welfare of men; and then let each individual say, whether, in view of all the evils connected with the practice of taking ardent spirits, he can, in the sight of God, be justified in continuing the

practice. That it is *not necessary*, has been fully proved. No one thinks it to be necessary, except those who use it. And *they* would not think so, if they were not in the habit of using it. Let any man *leave off entirely* the use of ardent spirits for only one year, and he will find by his own experience that it is not necessary or useful.

It is by the temperate and habitual use of ardent spirits, that *intemperate appetites* are formed. And the temperate use of it cannot be continued, without in many cases, forming intemperate habits; and after they are formed, multitudes will be destroyed by their gratification.

*Natural appetites*, such as are implanted in our constitution by the Author of nature, *do not by their gratification increase in their demands*. What satisfied them years ago, will satisfy them now. But *artificial appetites*, which are formed by the wicked practices of men, are *constantly increasing in their demands*.



The above is the Summer arrangement—some alteration usually takes place in the times of leaving, &c. during the Autumn and Winter, as the state of the roads at those periods will not generally allow of the Summer arrangements being continued.

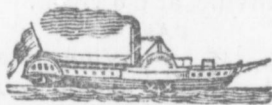
A Stage Coach also runs between Amherst and St. John, N. B. once in the week.

Another Stage starts from Miramichi for Richibucto and Bathurst, every Saturday morning, immediately after the arrival of the Steamer Cape-Breton from Pictou and Prince Edward Island, returning in time to enable persons to take passage in that Boat on her return on Monday morning.

The Parrsboro' Packet sails regularly to Windsor and Horton every week, from the 1st of April till Christmas; leaves Parrsboro' for Windsor, on Monday, (wind and weather permitting) and will sail from thence for Parrsboro' on Tuesday, immediately after the arrival of the Mail by the Royal Western Mail Coach, if practicable—leaves Parrsboro' on Thursday, for Horton, and will sail from thence for Parrsboro' the first high water at or after 8 o'clock in the morning. *Passengers who wish to cross from Parrsboro'* should be at PARTRIDGE ISLAND the evening previous to the Packet's sailing, as she often leaves the wharf at the River before daylight. The Packet frequently makes extra trips both to Windsor and Horton.
