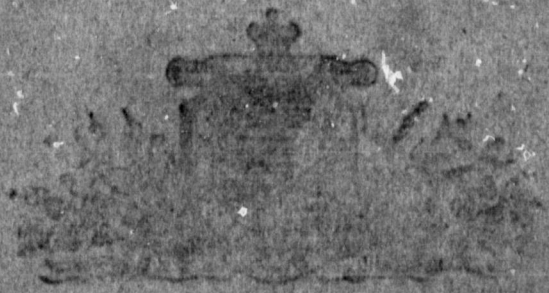

## ECLIPSES.

In the year 1849 there will be four Eclipses, two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I.—The 22nd February, an annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Quebec.

II.—The 8th March, a partial Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec, as follows :

First contact with the penumbra,.. 5h. 27m.

Do. do. shadow,.... 6h. 40m.

Middle of the Eclipse,..... 8h. 10m.

Last contact with the shadow,.... 9h. 40m.

Last contact with the penumbra,.. 10h. 53m.

(Mean time in the evening)

Magnitude of the Eclipse, 0,738, on the Southern limb.

III.—The 18th August, a total Eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Quebec.

IV.—The 2nd September, a partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible at Quebec.

**CHARGES FOR STORAGE IN THE CUSTOM HOUSE STORES, QUEBEC.**

*Act 10 and 11 Victoria, Cap. 31.*

**Section 30.**---All charges incurred on Goods for landing, cartage, storage, unpacking, repacking, weighing or gauging, paid, in order to carry this Act into effect, shall be at the expense of the Importer of such Goods.

One package at least in each Invoice to be opened, or more if necessary; and, in case of suspicion or fraud, the whole to be opened.

The dues, according to the annexed Tariff, are to be charged and collected for Goods. &c., stowed or taken into the Examining Warehouse at the Port of Quebec. All unclaimed goods are to be sent to the Examination Warehouse, and goods will be received on storage from parties who may wish it.

Parties can either insure their goods against loss by Fire, or can have the value of the same covered by duly notifying the Officer of Customs of their wishes in that respect, and paying the cost thereof.

Philosophical Apparatus, &c, imported for the use by any public Lecturer for the purpose of gain, and to be re-exported, shall be allowed to be entered under Bond of two good and sufficient persons for their exportation within the specified time.

Arms or Clothing which any contractor or contractors, Commissary, or Commissaries, shall import or bring into the Province for the use of Her Majesty's Army and Navy, or for the use of the Indian Nations in this Province: provided the duty otherwise payable would be defrayed or borne by the Treasury of the United Kingdom or of this Province.

Specimens of natural history, mineralogy or botany. Seeds of all kinds, Farming Utensils, and Implements of Husbandry, and Animals for the Improvement of Stock, when specially imported in good faith by any Society incorporated or established for the encouragement of Agriculture.

Wearing Apparel in actual use, and other Personal Effects not merchandise, Implements and Tools of Trade of handy crafts-men, in the occupation or employment of persons coming into the Province for the purpose of actually settling therein.

[The Native Produce and Manufactures of all or any such of the other British North American Colonies as shall admit the Native Produce and Manufactures of Canada, free of duty, shall be entitled to exemption from duties under this Act, with the exception of Spirituous Liquors.]

#### Regulations and Rates.

All letters sent by post in Canada and other Provinces of British North America, are charged by weight.

The scale of weight for charging postage is the same as that by which letters to and from the United Kingdom are charged, viz:—

For a Letter not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce . . . .	1 Rate.
Ditto ditto	1 ounce . . . 2 Rates.
Ditto ditto	2 ounces . . 4 Rates.
Ditto ditto	3 ounces . . 6 Rates.

And so on, adding two rates for every additional ounce. After the first ounce, fractional parts are not noticed; thus, if a letter exceed one ounce, it becomes liable to four rates, and if it exceed two ounces, six rates.

The Rates of Postage on Letters are—For a Letter not exceeding half an ounce, (without regard to the number of pieces of which it is composed)

And so on. Letters re-directed are rated afresh for the further distance.

Between the Province and the United Kingdom, a uniform charge of 1s. 2d. sterling, or 1s. 4d. currency, per half ounce. English Letters re-directed, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d currency additional per half ounce.

Letters may be pre-paid or not, at the option of the sender.

#### Newspapers.

Colonial Newspapers, not exceeding two ounces, to or from any part of the British North American Provinces, pay one half penny, pre-paid or not, at the option of the sender.

If sent to any British Colony beyond sea, (not intended to pass through the United Kingdom) or to any foreign country, except the United States, one half penny, to be pre-paid.

If sent to any part of the United States—one penny,—to be pre-paid.

Newspapers from the United States pay, on delivery, one penny Provincial, in addition to the United States postage. United States Newspapers re-posted in Canada, subject to letter postage.

Colonial Newspapers sent free to the United Kingdom or to any British Colony by way of England; and British newspapers, duly stamped, received free, from the United Kingdom to any part of Canada.

With exception of these last, (which are not limited as to weight) a newspaper to pass under the foregoing regulations must not exceed two ounces, otherwise it will be liable to pamphlet postage,—i. e. one penny per ounce.

British Newspapers can be re-posted in Canada, subject to one half penny postage.

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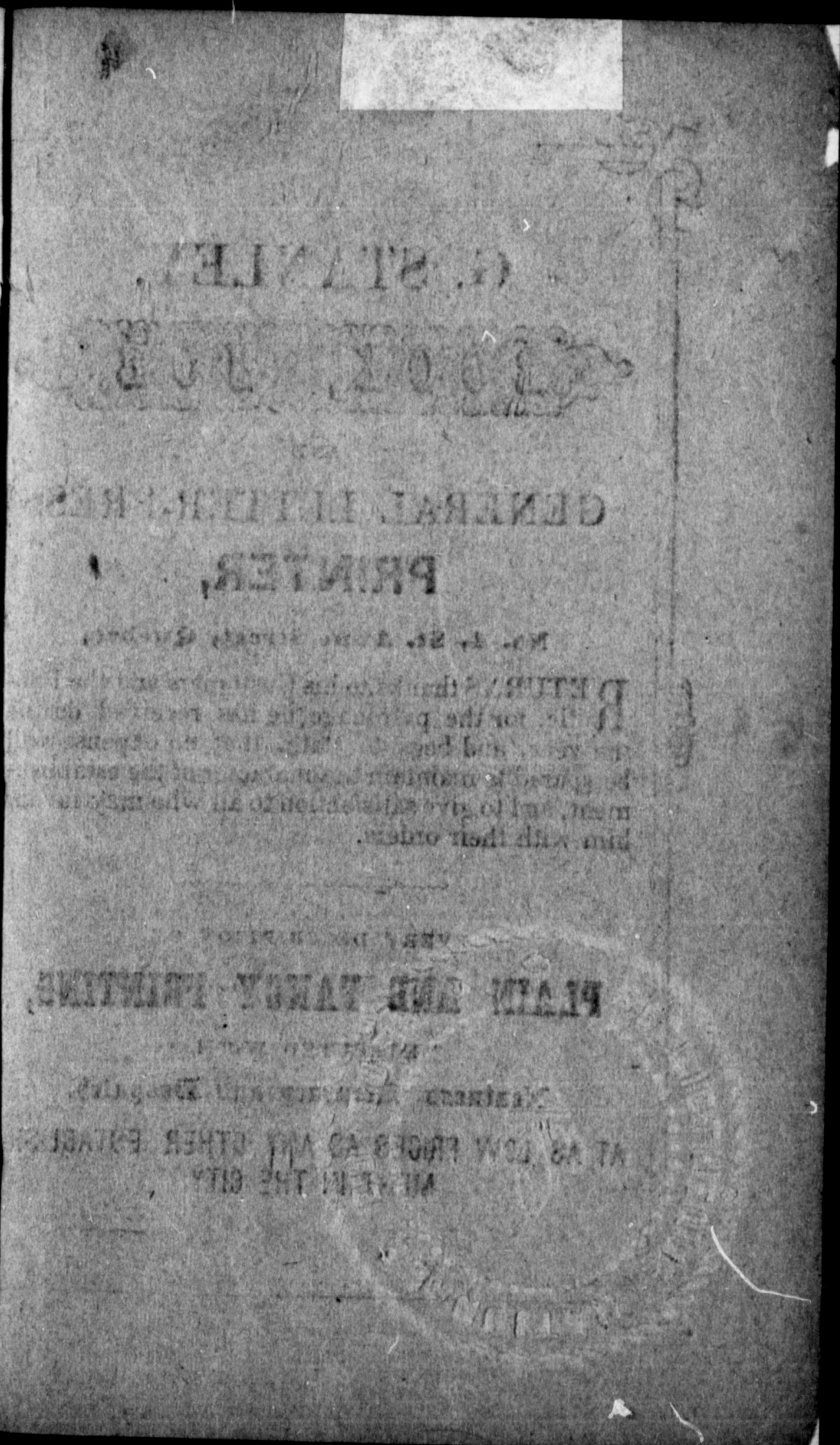
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
