These figures hardly bear out the statement that Nova Scotia is supplanting New Brunswick in the deal trade for while the increase of Nova Scotia deal exports between 1882 and 1890 has been only 14 millions the decrease of New Brunswick exports has been 83 millions. The truth of the matter is our deal exports have always been subject to great fluctuations. Between 1882 and 1885, our deal exports declined 102 millions, and it must be remembered that while our deal exports for 1890 were smaller than in 1889 they were larger than for either 1885, 1886, 1887 or 1888.
