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AFTER THE FLOOD.

The waters having subsided the damage done by Sunday's storm is more apparent. The waters had subsided and dry land was again visible in the public streets when yesterday morning's sun arose. With daylight a better idea was obtained of the ravages of the rainstorm of the previous night. Here and there in the streets deep and long furrows had been ploughed up, while in a few instances excavations wide and deep stood open-mouthed in the road bed. Around these furrows were placed by the Works Department a number of men and horses, and the heavy machinery of business found their gorges floating about in their cellars. The wretchedness in Front street was to have escaped with little or no damage.

Several claims for damages against the city have been laid with the Mayor. His Worship told The World that he did not know what time the city would take until he had a conference with the City Solicitor and the Board of Works. The loss of one foot in an hour and about ten inches more water was given to the city.

A horse buggy and its human freight suddenly disappeared in Parliament street during the storm. The water had undermined the road bed and it is only required the weight of the horse and buggy to cause the cave in. Willing hands were sent to work with planks, sawing, etc., and the horse and buggy were extricated. The carpet warehouse of John Kay & Co., King-street west, was flooded and a large quantity of stock was badly damaged. The firm of Simpson, Smith & Co., Queen-street, near the Woodbine, gave way, letting out 4 1/2 feet of water and carrying away the greater part of its contents. Quite a number of buildings house basements were flooded. Church-street during the storm, the tenants being kept busy hauling out until late in the afternoon. The lake shore of the Island is white with the thousands of small fish washed up by the storm on Sunday evening.

At the store of Messrs. Hollis, Ross & Co., 127 King-street east, there is a large stock of goods in the flooded portion of the building, and very great damage was caused by the water. There was six feet of water in the cellar of Elliot & Co.'s drug manufactory in York-street. A large quantity of valuable stock was in the flooded portion of the building, and very great damage was caused by the water. Mr. James H. Culling, druggist, 383 Colborne-street, and R. H. Johnson, licentiate, 384, have put in claims for \$20 and \$100 respectively, for damage done by the sewage backed up into their cellars. The family of J. L. Rosen, who live at 12 Queen-street west, were flooded out of the house by the rain which came through the roof. The family tinware was spread on the floor to catch as much of the water as possible, and the inmates of the house took up quarters on the roof. The water was over the roof and over the water in their domestic had abated.

Only one school suffered, that being the Paradise Public school. It was some four inches deep in the basement during Sunday afternoon, which by yesterday had subsided to two inches. The cellar of the Bell clothing store was turned into a small pond, and more or less damage was done. Taylor Bros. & Co., 60 Adelaide east, and Mr. Ellingworth, 63 Adelaide east, are among the sufferers by the flood, that being subject to the complaint of flooding. The foundations of new buildings came in for a heavy dose of water. The new building in Melville-street, west of Jordan-street, was a particular sufferer, the water being up to the second floor. So was the Canada Life building.

ASSEMBLED BY THE Mayor Fleming Requests the Syndicate to Revisit Itself. The Mayor has written to Solicitor McWilliams of the Alexander expedition reminding him that the ideas of time asked for the drafting of a revised agreement has expired, and requesting him to avoid further delay in the matter. Mr. McWilliams says that he has prepared a new agreement, which will be presented to the council as soon as it is approved by Col. Alexander, in whose hands it now is. Should the revised agreement be accepted, as expected, the work on the matter before the end of July. STATISTICS. A Statistician Who Says Fewer Licenses Has Not Meant Less Drunkenness in the city of Toronto have been compiled by Mr. James Thompson. Important Typewriter Judgment. New York, June 16, 1892.—Judge Lacombe, sitting in the United States Circuit Court here, has on the motion of the Remington Typewriter Company, granted an injunction against the agents of the Franklin, restraining the sale of that machine on patents. The decision is an important one, as it proves the control of the fundamental patents, and may affect other makers of typewriters. The Remington people have heretofore been quite passive in this respect, but now they are likely to proceed against all other typewriter manufacturing companies. The case is a very important one, and the decision is likely to be a landmark in the history of the typewriter industry.

A CANADIAN IN IRELAND.

Mr. Barrett Promised a Ballyragh Meeting Support of Canadian Organizers. Mr. William Barrett, W.M. of L.O.L. No. 111, has returned from a visit to Ireland, where he attended a Ballyragh at the residence of Mr. Archibald Wherry. Mr. Barrett in his address, according to the report in The Freeman's Journal, said he was proud to see so many ladies present, yet with all their hostess in the Ballyragh they had not one female lodge member. The speaker urged them to be firm in their resistance to Home Rule, and said he could assure them on behalf of thousands of their fellow-countrymen and brethren in Canada that if the Irish ladies laid their shoulder to the wheel they would get help in the shape of both men and money, if necessary, from their friends across the Atlantic. The men of Canada would not submit to Home Rule in any form.

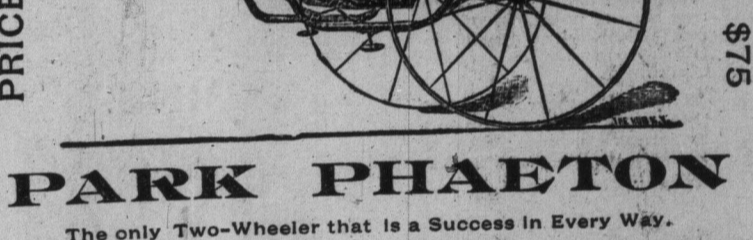
