

REPEAL PASSES THE SENATE.

THE VICE-REGENT HAS GIVEN HIS ASSSENT TO THE REPEAL OF THE ACTS RELATIVE TO THE DEPORTATION OF ALIENS.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—Shortly after 3 o'clock Senator Calhoun of Georgia, who was wheeled into the senate chamber in his invalid chair in anticipation of a vote this afternoon, but there were still several senators who desired to be heard. The debate was continued until 7:40 o'clock, and was closed by the speaker, and then the Vice-President stated that if no further amendment was offered, the vote would be taken on the engrossed and third reading of the bill. That was agreed to by a vote of 75 yeas and 17 nays. Then the vote was taken by yeas and nays on the passage of the bill as amended, and it was passed—yeas 43, nays 32.

BRIBED BY THE WOOD.

The victim to-day was Emilie Zillman, nee Kuehne of Hammer, Prussian Silesia, who had been convicted of the murder of her husband, Dr. Wilhelm Zillman, a prominent member of the House of Representatives.
