Montreal Stock Market.

**SOME SHARES ARE TRANSFERRED
—ABSOLUTELY NO NEW
FEATURE.**

Montreal, July 26.

The trading to-day was of no great magnitude or importance or significance. The total of shares sold was 2,343 neither stocks dealt in nor the cause of them being sold were beyond the usual, and the range of prices to-day indicate absolutely nothing new. Were one to conclude from the Montreal St. Ry. and Twin City prices he would say that Traction are in favor and their stock is rising; which conclusion would be found untenable in view of Richelieu and Ontario, also Toronto Railway being at lower valuation to-day. Payne's advanced price would point to mining stock strengthening, but Montreal-London did not advance so this conclusion about Mining stock will not hold. About Montreal Cotton it can be said that one of the prices was below last week's, but higher than any other for 3 weeks. Nothing special therefore, can be learned from it about Industrials generally. The banks being where they were as to price are thus with the other stock sold to-day of no significance as to how the market tends.

Montreal St. Ry. was ex div. and as such was sold at the highest price this week 325. The transaction was on the smallest possible scale. At the closing 320 was offered to a demand for 325. Increased earnings are not helping this stock apparently, but then neither are enormous receipts and increases pushing up St. Paul Omaha and others selling on Wall Street.

Twin City has not for a month at least a higher price than it got to-day, 68 on a 100 share transaction. The last dealt was on Thursday and the price then was 69½ and 67½ was the highest before to-day in a month. There was asked 69½ and offered 67.

Richelieu & Ont. fell off ¼ in a sale of 10 shares at 105½. At close there was wanted 112½ and offered 109. The market is getting too much accustomed to large earnings and increases to be affected bullishly by them and the same indifference is noticeable at New York.

Toronto Ry sold at 115½ to-day less by ½ than yesterday's highest, but as the sales of small dimensions this stock's position is unchanged. 116 wanted at close and 115½ offered.

Payne sold to-day in two lots 560 shares at 139 and 125 at 140. The latter is 1 higher than the highest of yesterday. The offer of 135 at close does not much look like further advance unless when taken with the demand for 140.

Montreal-London sold at the same price 45 and the number of shares dealt in was 1500. Business closed with a demand for 45 and an offer of 40.

Montreal Cotton to the extent of 26 shares were sold, 2 at 160 and 24 at 158. This while not so high as Thursday's last week was 2 or 3 over the fortnight previous.

Bank of Montreal at 260, Merchants Bank at 170 and Bank of Commerce at 150 remain unchanged in their price. The number of shares traded in is given below.

GOOD INQUIRY FROM SMALL INVESTORS — HOLDERS CEASED PRESSING SHARES FOR SALE— BUSINESS FAIRLY SPREAD OVER THE LIST—REPUBLIC DECLINES TO 119.

The market opened very dull but as time wore on quite a little business made its appearance. Ten different stocks were dealt in. Prices were generally lower than those of previous deals. Thirteen thousand eight hundred shares changed hands. There is no encouragement to speculation in mines in sight but the demand from small buyers seems to be improving.

Republic continues its declining course, but under 120 it is a safe buy. 3500 shares changed hands, the last price being the lowest yet touched.

Golden Star was again on the decline selling down to 40½. It closed at 41 bid, 41½ asked.

Montreal Gold Fields was sold at 15. More could be had at the same figure.

Old Ironsides brought 107. There seems to be small offerings in this stock from time to time. The friends of the company claim it to be a very fine purchase.

Big Three was sold at 14½. There is good reason to buy this stock at present quotations.

Virtue was not traded in but could have been sold round 45. It was offered at 47½ and 43½ was bid. No great quantity of stock is for sale. For the balance of this week there will be but short sessions of the Mining Exchange.

**STAGNATION IN ALL STOCKS.—
GOOD EARNINGS DO NOT
ELEVATE PRICES, NOR DO SINIS-
TER RUMORS LOWER THEM.**

New York, July 26.

There is practically no feature in the market for Americans in London. The feeling abroad generally seems to be rather better, owing to the improvement in the outlook in the Transvaal and sentiment towards Americans is said to be friendly, but does not find any expression in large purchases.

L. N. appears to be the favorite, being bought upon the expectation that when stock sells ex-div. it will quickly recover the 2 p.c.

Wall Street is starving for news of some sort, which will move prices one way or the other, but at present there seems to be nothing in sight. There is the usual crop of vague dividend rumors, Penn., General Electric, and R. I., being the roads most talked of. The earnings of the former are said to be fairly enormous, and the stockholders are hopeful of larger returns; as to G. E. the earnings are said to be at least 20 p.c. upon the stock, and the fact that Flower has been a moderate buyer of R. I. is taken by many as an indication of an advance in the div. rate to 6 p.c.

Certainly the crop receipts from the territory tapped by the R. I. are most encouraging, and should nothing happen to depreciate present conditions, Kansas will raise the largest corn crop in its history.

Railroad earnings continue to be all that can be desired. Mop. for 3rd week of July shows a gain of \$33,000, while the Omaha for the month of June shows an increase of \$245,941. However, Wall Street has become so accustomed to good earnings that they hardly create a ripple. This was shown by the fact that next to no new buying developed in yesterday's market as a result of the extraordinary earnings of the St. Paul road for the 3rd week in July.

The Gas situation continues unsatisfactory. There is a possibility that some of the stockholders in the warring companies may apply to the Courts for injunctions to compel their directors to sell Gas at a profitable figure, but the action, of course, is proverbially slow, and it is doubtful whether relief can be obtained from them before the interests of the stockholders will have suffered materially. A suspension of dividends on Con. Gas, is one of the bear predictions of the day, and has been backed by considerable short sales.

The loan market last night showed a healthy demand for the stock. The market as a whole, requires some new stimulant. The most important commission houses do not look for active business before the middle or end of August, but are not advising short sales in face of the universal prosperity of the country at large. There is a saying in Wall Street that a dull market is a dangerous one to sell short, and from the way in which the market has acted during the last week, it seems as if there might be some truth in the saying.

New York, Noon, July 26.

There was very little difference between the opening of to-day and that of yesterday. London houses did little or nothing, their total transactions probably not amounting to 7,000 shares, possibly they bought a little on the balance.

The feature of the market was S. S. Pfd., which reached the highest price it sold at in many years. The cause of the advance continues unexplained, but rumors continue to circulate, treating vaguely of pending deals, which will result in putting the road on such an improved financial basis as to enable it to make some return to the Pfd. stockholders.

There was continued buying of General Electric by the Room, but the character of the selling was a great deal better than the buying. Three or four leading houses on the Floor have sold some 12,000 shares during the last three days. It is believed that every share of this is long stock.

After first half hour commission houses became somewhat more active than they were yesterday; their orders seemed to be mainly on the buying side. The larger operators continue to hold aloof, believing that no material changes can take place, till more definite news is received in regard to the crop.

The crop news continues to be of a most bullish nature. A despatch from Nebraska estimated the corn crop at 318,970,000 bushels for that State alone. This is nearly fifty millions more than 1896, which year broke all previous records. The report goes on to say that the time for hot winds has practically passed and that nothing but the most extraordinary unusual weather can hurt the crop. If this is true of other States, such as Kansas, there can be little or no doubt as to the future of the corn carrying roads. At the moment the market is strong, but professionally,

He spent ten days in personally visiting different creeks, and interrogating miners as to richness of their claims. From a number of these miners he purchased nuggets, some of them weighing sixteen and a half ounces. These are now on exhibition at the Bank and as they were purchased by Botsford from men who found them, no suspicion can possibly be attached to them in any way. Atlin is not a transportation company's fake like Cape Nome.

Hon. T. Noose, newly appointed Japanese Consul to Fusan, Corea, arrived yesterday from Chicago. He thinks the present is a most opportune time for foreign capitalists to invest in Japan. Labor, though increasing rapidly in price, is still very much cheaper than in Europe or on this continent, and for years those who invest in Japan will enjoy the benefits of this advantage.

Robt. Jaffray, President of Crows Nest Coal Co., is here to await the arrival of new admiral of Pacific Station, who will arrive on E.M.S. Warspite. Jaffray hopes to induce the Admiralty to take Crows Nest Coal in place of Welsh fuel for warships.

CHICAGO MARKET.

GRAIN OPENS HIGHER AND ADVANCES IN THE EARLIER SALES.—DAY'S RANGE SMALL, HOWEVER.—PROVISIONS LOWER.

Chicago, July 26.

The opening market showed what has been unusual for some time a complete absence in grain produce of any prices lower than the closing price of the previous day. July and September corn and also September oats did not advance beyond this in the opening, but they did not sink below it. In all classes of wheat there was progress to the extent of $\frac{1}{8}$. The same appeared in December corn and oats while July oats rose $\frac{3}{8}$ higher. The opening was thus a novelty and was so in line with Liverpool cables, reporting wheat $\frac{1}{8}$ higher and corn $\frac{1}{4}$ higher and with the bullish sentiment which has been kept in check a good while that it introduced sales at higher prices. Movement in grain to-day was from a firm opening to steady and higher developments.

The upward movement showed also in provisions after the 5 or 10 cent lower openings had been made. Advances in provisions however, were on a smaller scale than they have been of late. Pork was 12 to 15 lower, lard 3, and short ribs 2 to 5. Hogs received to-day 36,000 at Chicago. Omaha 8000 and sold from 5 to 10c lower.

Weather reports tell of lower temperature and conditions favorable to ripening grain.

Car lots of wheat to-day 121; shipments, 10,000. Corn 609; shipments 239, 933- Oats 215; shipments 34,470.

Primary receipts, 1,000,451; shipments, 256,215. Last year 680,728; shipments, 295,292.

On the curb wheat is at 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ rising to 71 $\frac{3}{4}$, 71 $\frac{1}{2}$. Corn 32 rising to 32 $\frac{1}{4}$, 32 $\frac{3}{4}$.
