## ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.

The Annual General Meeting of the Church Society was held in the Temperance Hall, Temperance Street, Toronto, on Tuesday the 11th June, 1867, at 11, A.M. The Lord Bishop of Niagara in the Chair.

After reading of prayers, by the Rev. S. Givins, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

The Report of the Society for the year ending 30th April, 1867, was presented by the Sounding Committee, and read by the Secretary.

After some discussion, it was moved by The Provost of Trinity College, and seconded by J. M. Grover, Esq., That this Society do hereby memorialize the Synod of the Diocese, praying that a Committee of Synod be appointed, to report during the present session some plan for providing the several parishes and missions of the Diocese with Books and Tracts for parochial distribution and for the use of School Libraries and Sunday Schools.—*Carried.*

It was further moved by the Rev. Canon Read, and seconded by J. M. Grover, Esq., That the Report of the Society for the past year, just read, be adopted, and printed for free distribution, under the direction of the Secretary.—*Carried.*

The report of the Committee on Indian Missions having been presented, and read by the Rev. S. Givins,

It was moved by the Venerable Archdeacon Fuller, and seconded by the Rev. F. L. Osler, That the Committee on Indian Missions be requested to add to the Appendix of the Church Society's Report a full Statistical Statement regarding the Indians around Lakes Superior and Huron, as far as can be ascertained. *Carried.*

The Meeting then proceeded to the election of Vice-Presidents, Committees, and Officers for the ensuing year.

Moved by Rev. Canon Brent, seconded by Rev. S. Givins, That the Clergy Trust Commutation Committee be re-appointed.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Brent, seconded by Rev. S. Givins, That the Very Rev. Dean Grasett, B.D., C. J. Campbell, Esq., and L. Moffatt, Esq., be Treasurers of the Society for the ensuing year.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Read, seconded by J. W. Gamble, Esq., That William P. Atkinson, Esq., be re-elected Secretary of this Society for the present year.—*Carried.*

Moved by S. B. Harman, Esq., seconded by Rev. Canon Read, That it is desired to record on this occasion the high appreciation by the Society of the efficient manner in which Mr. Atkinson has discharged his duties as Secretary of the Church Society.—*Carried.*

Moved by A. Gaviller, Esq., seconded by Rev. Dr. McMurray, That W. Gamble, Esq., and James Browne, Esq., be appointed Auditors.—*Carried.*

The Meeting then adjourned.

### SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.

By order of the Lord Bishop of Toronto, a Special Meeting of the Society was held in the Temperance Hall, on Tuesday the 11th inst., at 3.15, P.M., for the purpose of receiving the Report of the Committee appointed to consider and report upon the Resolutions of the Rev. H. Holland, concerning the Rectory Lands.

The Lord Bishop of Niagara in the Chair.

The Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, in the absence of the Rev. H. Holland, presented, as the Report of the Committee, the following

#### BY-LAW.

*To make provision for carrying out certain powers given to the Church Society, under the Act passed in the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, numbered sixteen, and intituled "An Act to provide for the sale of Rectory Lands in this Province."*

WHEREAS according to the provisions of an Act of Parliament in that behalf, the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto is vested with power and authority to sell and dispose of any lands granted by the Crown as a glebe of, or as appurtenant to, or belonging to, or appropriated for, any Rectory in the said Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called and in whomsoever the title thereof may be vested, subject to the provisoes in the said Act contained for protecting the interests of the existing Incumbents of said Rectories, in effecting such sales and dealing with the proceeds thereof,

And whereas it is necessary and expedient to create and appoint a Special Committee of the said Church Society to carry the said Act into effect and to lay down certain general rules for the guidance of such Committee,

Be it therefore enacted, under the authority of the Act incorporating the said Society, and with the consent of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, as follows :

## I.

There shall be a Committee of the Church Society to be called "the Rectory Lands Committee," which shall be chosen every year at the Annual Meeting in June, and shall consist of six members, three being Rectors of Parishes, and three Laymen, and of this Committee three shall be a quorum.

## II.

This Committee shall have the supervision of all the Rectory Lands within the Diocese, and shall make such rules and regulations for the sales of such lands, as they shall from time to time see fit, and shall report all such rules and regulations, and any change or alterations thereof at the next quarterly meeting of the Society, and the Society shall have full power and authority to alter or annul the same or any part thereof.

## III.

This Committee shall also make, and have charge of, all investments arising out of the sales of the Rectory Lands, and shall keep separate accounts for each Rectory, both as to the Principal and Interest arising from sales, and of the investments thereof, and the payment of the Incumbent or Incumbents out of the income thereof.

## IV.

The Committee shall keep all necessary books of account, and may appoint any officer for keeping the same, and remunerate him therefor, and all charges of management shall be apportioned among the several Rectories in proportion to the income of such Rectory derived from the sales of its Rectory Lands or any part thereof, or the investments therefrom.

## V.

All sales shall be carried out, and all securities and investments be taken, under the superintendance of the Solicitor of the Society.

## VI.

The Committee shall report to the Society whenever required, and always at the Annual Meeting in June, when their Report shall include all transactions up to the thirtieth April then last past, and shall shew the account of each Rectory for which any sales have been made for the past year, exhibiting the sum for which any sale has been made; the amount paid; the amount unpaid, and how secured; any investment made; the interest payable: the principal and interest, if any, in arrear; and the charges of management, and any other expenses incurred during the year, and which account shall be audited and verified by Auditors to be appointed by the Society for that purpose.

The above By-Law having been put to the Meeting and carried, clause by clause, it was moved by Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, seconded by the Rev. Canon Ritchie, That the By-Law, now read clause by clause, be adopted.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rev. Canon Read, seconded by Ven. Archdeacon Palmer, That the following gentlemen compose "the Rectory Lands Committee," viz.: *Clergy*—Very Rev. The Dean of Toronto, Rev. F. L. Osler, Rev. Canon Read. *Laymen*—Charles Magrath, Esq., R. B. Denison, Esq., Herbert Mortimer, Esq.—*Carried.*

The closing prayers were then read, and the Meeting adjourned.

## MANITOULIN ISLAND MISSION.

(Concluded.)

I therefore proceeded to visit the remaining Indian families in the village. First I called at George Obedosway's house to see how he was. I found him very weak. He had been bled by an Indian and feels very ill. Read a portion of Scripture and prayed with him. I then visited Mrs. McGrah, Catherine Quoewis, and Kitty Obedosway, and afterwards called on Mr. Lewis, a new settler, also on Mr. A.,

P.L.S., who with his wife and family occupy part of George Obadosway's house. Had an interesting religious conversation with Mrs. A. Found in-course of conversation that their two little girls were unbaptized; having spoken to them respecting the sin of neglecting this holy ordinance, and in a Christian land of allowing their children to grow up in a state almost tantamount to heathenism, they at length requested me to baptize them. I accordingly promised to do so, upon my return to Little Current the next time. I also promised to send them some books on the Church of which, though intelligent persons they seem to be entirely ignorant. Here is seen the necessity of some well-written tracts on the Church and her claims, which should be sowed broadcast through the country, and if judiciously written, and used in a new settlement, may give the Church a start and a position for all time to come. The hour of seven having arrived, I again held Divine Service in the school-house, pursuant to notice given in the morning; 46 were present. Returned according to appointment to Mr. A's to tea. After reading a portion of scripture and prayer, I returned to Mr. Bartlett's hospitable cottage.

THURSDAY, February 7th,—Mild—Thawing—Rose at 5 a.m., started at 6 o'clock with Mr. Fraser and my travelling companion, for Manitowaning. Reached Manitowaning Point on snow shoes 15 minutes to 12 o'clock. Made tea and took breakfast. Walking very heavy, snow shoes weighing nearly 10lbs, with the snow sticking to them. Arrived at 3.30 p.m., at Manitowaning, very tired. Found all well at home, thanks to our Heavenly Father. This missionary journey has involved a travel of 60 miles, all on foot.

## CONVOCAATION OF THE PROVINCE OF CANTERBURY.

THE two Houses of Convocation assembled on Tuesday, June 4—the members of the Upper House in Queen Anne's Bounty Office, those of the Lower House in the Jerusalem Chamber.

### THE UPPER HOUSE.

His Grace the Archbishop presided. The Right Rev. Prelates present were the Bishops of Winchester, St. David's, Lichfield, Oxford, Lincoln, Salisbury, Llandaff, Bangor, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, and Ely.

### THE CONSECRATION OF CHURCHYARDS.

The Bishop of OXFORD moved the following resolution:—

"That we deem it most inexpedient to abandon the religious service now in use in the consecration of portions of land added to existing churchyards, and we should approve of any steps taken to diminish the expenses now incurred in such consecrations."

The Bishop of LICHFIELD suggested that "inexpedient" was too weak a phrase to employ upon such a subject.

The Bishop of OXFORD at once altered the commencement of the resolution by substituting the words "We should be most unwilling" for the words "We deem it most inexpedient."

After some discussion the resolution was agreed to in the following form, and was ordered to be sent to the Lower House:—

"Resolved—That we should be most unwilling to abandon the religious service now in use at the consecration of portions of land added to existing churchyards, and are willing that the expenses incurred at such consecrations should, as far as possible, be diminished."

### DIOCESAN SYNODS.

The Bishop of WINCHESTER laid before the House the report upon this subject drawn up by the Committee appointed in February last; and it was agreed, after some discussion, that the Report should be printed and considered on a future day.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 5.

The Archbishop of Canterbury took his seat shortly after eleven o'clock, there

being also present the Bishops of London, Winchester, St. David's, Oxford, Lincoln, Norwich, Salisbury, Gloucester and Bristol, Bangor, Llandaff and Lichfield.

#### UNION WITH THE CHURCH OF SWEDEN.

The Bishop of LICHFIELD presented a petition upon this subject from the clergy and laity of his diocese.

#### THE TWENTY-NINTH CANON.

The Archbishop of CANTERBURY said he had received a letter from the Archbishop of York, the president of the Northern Province, relative to the amended 29th Canon, which had not been communicated to that province.

The Bishop of OXFORD moved an amendment, which provided that no person should be a sponsor at baptism who had not received or was not competent to receive the Holy Communion by reason of age.

The Bishop of LONDON seconded the motion.

The Bishop of WINCHESTER said he was sorry that persons came to be sponsors who had not received the Holy Communion. At the same time he felt that if they refused non-communicants they would be compelled to exclude many children from baptism altogether. If they adhered to the old Canon they would be obliged to order that all children brought for baptism should be attended by god fathers and godmothers who were communicants; and within a few hundred yards of the place in which they were assembled, a portion of his own diocese, it would be impossible to find communicants as sponsors, and children must go unbaptized.

After a discussion, in which the Bishops of Salisbury, Gloucester and Bristol, Norwich, Lichfield, Lincoln, Llandaff, and Oxford took part, the Archbishop put the question to the meeting, and it was agreed to; immediately after which the Prolocutor of the Lower House was sent for, that he might take it down for consideration.

#### THE COLONIAL CHURCH.

Addresses from many Colonial Churches, in reference to the manner in which they might be affected by proposed legislation, which had been addressed to the Archbishop and many other prelates, were ordered to lie on the table.

The Bishop of Grafton and Armidale was present during a portion of the proceedings.

#### PROPOSED REVIVAL OF DIOCESAN SYNODS.

The Bishop of WINCHESTER said it would be in their lordships' recollection that in February last a Committee was appointed to consider the question of restoring or reviving Diocesan Synods. The Committee had drawn up a report, which they would now submit. In this Report the Committee came to the conclusion that the ancient Synods, in which decrees should be promulgated, would not be applicable to the present state of the Church. But Conferences of bishops, clergy, and laity, for considering matters relating to the well-being of the dioceses would be very useful. The bishops should be left to call them, and should preside over them. The question of representation would have to be considered. The clergy and laity should have equal votes, and it must be distinctly understood that such Conferences must not claim the authority to make decrees, as in the ancient Synods. Obviously there would be many suggestions which would arise out of these details, but he trusted that there was nothing in the report which would not commend itself to the favourable consideration of the House. He moved that the report be received.

The Bishop of OXFORD seconded the report.

After some discussion, it was arranged that the report should be printed, and considered on Friday.—*London (Eng.) Ecclesiastical Gazette.*
