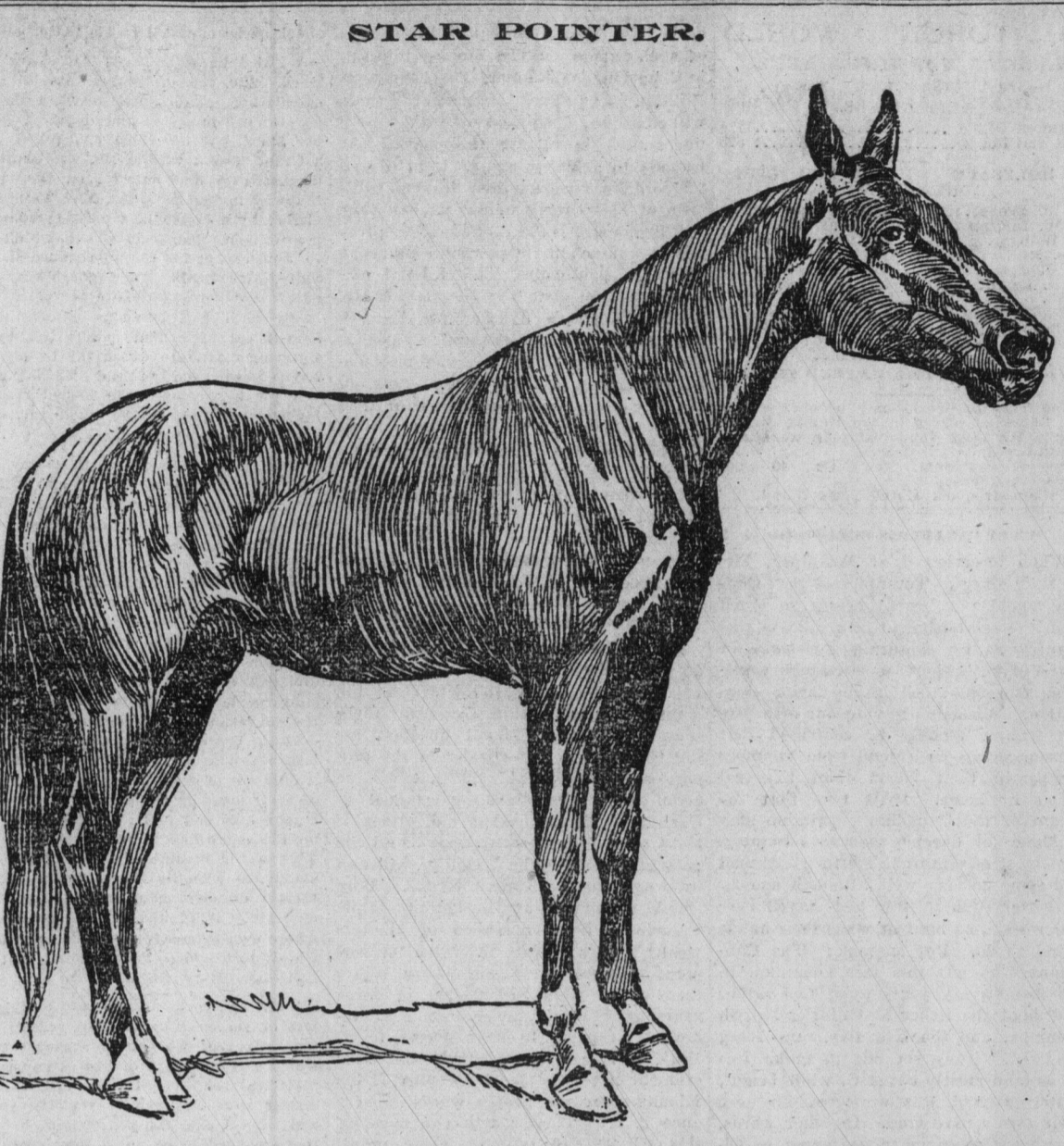

One of the Quietest Safe Robberies on Record—Whoever Opened the Vault Changed the Combination and Relocked It—Bank Officials at Napanee Did Not Suspect Theft, Which Was Only Disclosed After the Safe Had Been Opened by an Expert—A Chance for a Clever Detective.

Mr. Gamble of Toronto, general manager of the Dominion Bank, stated yesterday that the outside estimate of the loss to the bank was \$100,000.
