Mr. J. P. Whitney Talks to The World of the Proposal to Abolish University Residence.

WHAT A POSSIBLE REMEDY IS Cut at Least Some of the Strands of the "Painter" of Government Control.

The World took advantage of Mr. J. P. Whitney's presence in the city yesterday to interview him on the important letter of Mr. John King, treating of the abolition of University residence.

His Personal Feeling. "Hank" of the "University," Mr. Whitney replied: "Yes, I read the letter of Mr. John King in today's issue of The World in regard to the abolition of residence at University College. It is quite natural that Mr. King and all other graduates of the University should feel and express a lively interest in everything connected with that institution."

Residence is Desirable. "Then, you consider University residence desirable" queried the reporter. "Not being a University man myself," said Mr. Whitney, "I should hesitate, perhaps, to express any very positive opinion. However, the inference I have acquired from all sources leads me to the conclusion that residence is a desirable adjunct to a collegiate course."

Important Public Question. "You evidently attach much importance to the question, Mr. Whitney?" "I do not," replied Mr. Whitney, "but I am strongly inclined to believe, with Mr. King, that under present circumstances the abolition of residence is a very serious question that I am right, and that the first remedy to be applied will be to cut at least some of the strands of what Mr. King terms the 'painter' of Government control."

Remedy Suggested. "The last question asked by the reporter was: 'What remedy would you suggest for the present unsatisfactory state of affairs?' Mr. Whitney replied: 'I am strongly inclined to believe, with Mr. King, that under present circumstances the abolition of residence is a very serious question that I am right, and that the first remedy to be applied will be to cut at least some of the strands of what Mr. King terms the 'painter' of Government control.'

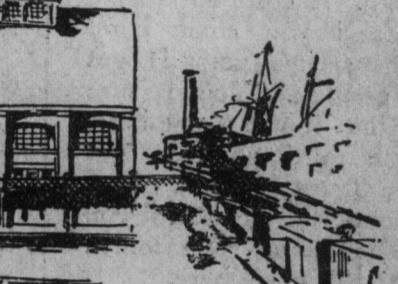

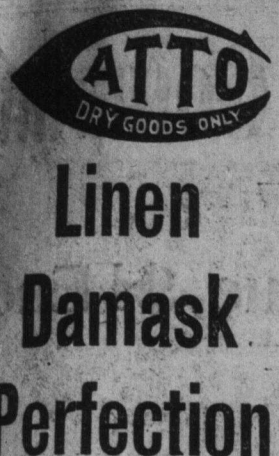

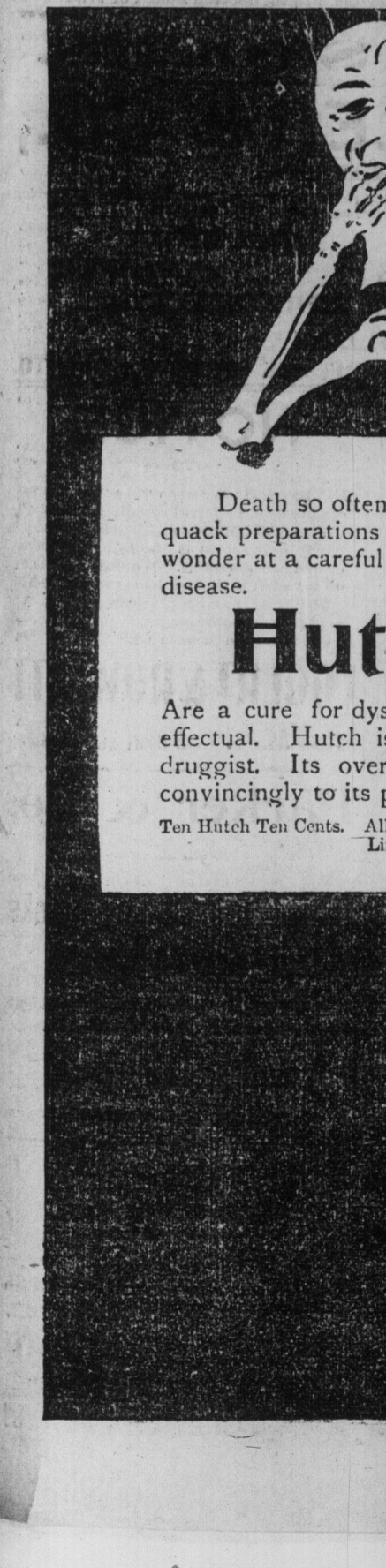
