**GENERAL GASELEE'S DESPATCHS ABOUT THE RELIEF OF PEKIN**

Gen. Dorward Also Reports, Giving Little News, But Paying Tribute to the Gallantry of American Officers Who Did Great Service to the British Forces.

London, Nov. 6.—The Gazette to-night prints Gen. Gaselee's despatches to the Secretary of State for India, respecting the operations for the relief of Peking, and Gen. Dorward's report of the operations about Tien Tsin. Gaselee, among half a dozen others, mentions for special services five Americans, "who gallantly supported our fighting line, viz., Major Quinlan and Capt. J. R. M. Taylor," both of the 14th U.S. Infantry.

**LU CHUAN LIN PROMOTED.**

**GUNBOATS AT CANTON.**

The German fleet, which is reported to be operating in the vicinity of Homan and Fatt, has caused a rumor that the Germans intend to obtain a concession, owing to the increased trade and crowded conditions of Shamen.

**BRAVE CAPTAIN CHALMERS.**  
Lost His Life in Trying to Rescue His Comrade, Major Sanders.

London, Nov. 6.—Lord Roberts, in a despatch dated Johannesburg, Nov. 5, reports to the War Office as follows: "Smith-Dorrien states that Major Sanders and Captain Chalmers, of the Canadian Mounted Rifles, behaved with great gallantry in the action of Nov. 2. Sanders rode under a heavy fire to bring in a horse, and Chalmers followed him, and was wounded and his horse was killed. Sanders implored him to leave, but was refused, and the gallant Chalmers was, I grieve to say, killed."

**BOERS CONTINUE THEIR LYING.**  
Lord Roberts reports that while the Boers are disorganized and their ammunition and supplies scarce, ex-President Steyn is endeavoring to bolster up the Boer cause by spreading false stories.

**AND THEY ALL WENT HOME.**

New York, Nov. 7.—At 12:30 this morning, National Committee members, Gibbs and Hille held a conference at the committee headquarters. The following statement was given out: "On the returns received at Republican headquarters up to this hour the Republican National Committee claim to have elected McKinley and Roosevelt by an electoral vote of 284, with the possibility of 21 votes in addition, making a total of 305. These 21 votes consist of the 13 votes in Kentucky, and 8 in Nebraska."

**EX-GOVERNOR STONE GIVES UP.**  
Acknowledges the Defeat of the Democrats and Closes Up the Headquarters.

New York, Nov. 6.—Ex-Governor Stone at midnight made the following announcement: "I give up. The returns telegraphed these headquarters from New York, New Jersey and Connecticut show that these States have gone Republican. Returns from Maryland and West Virginia are incomplete. My information from the Middle and Western States is so indefinite that I cannot form an opinion as to the result. As I do not know the facts I will wait before I say finally what I think is the result."

Oyster Bay, N.Y., Nov. 6.—Gov. Roosevelt, surrounded by his family, tonight received the returns at his home. The Governor at no time during the evening seemed anxious about the result. He did not make any special arrangements to receive the news, and depended on messages to be brought from the telegraph office in the railroad station, nearly three miles away.
