WHEAT DRAWBACK TURNED DOWN. Attorney-General Moody Holds That Secretary Shaw's Plan is Contrary to Law's Intent.

Chicago, Jan. 29.—Raymond, writing The Record Herald from Washington, says that the secretary of the treasury, William D. Hooper, has been permitted to import wheat duty free for the purpose of milling.

Section 4 of the Dingley tariff law is a re-enactment of similar provisions dating back to the tariff bearing the name of William McKinley.

It is clearly intended by this, in the opinion of every man versed in the law, that the protective tariff system should not be used to hamper the exporter.

That is to say, it is intended that if a manufacturer exports an article partly of domestic goods and partly of foreign goods, he should not be forced to pay duty on the imported article, if it is afterwards exported, and then on the domestic portion with similar things manufactured in this country.

As I have been told by various tariff experts in congress, the whole act and purpose of section 4 of the Dingley tariff is to permit American manufacturers to import certain indispensable parts of machinery or other articles which could not be readily supplied in this country, and export them to other countries.
