

THE SUSPENSION BRIDGE.

The Government of New Brunswick is making decided progress towards the construction of a bridge to replace the old suspension at the Falls. The spanning of the gorge at the mouth of the St. John is a difficult engineering feat and one that has to be approached only after mature consideration. There are only three practical ways of bridging such a gorge as we have here, by suspension bridge, a cantilever or an arch. The old type of suspension bridge is no longer regarded with favor and an arch is considered preferable to a cantilever by engineers. Provinces, yet it should be greater still if the advantages we possess were better understood. Looking no further away than the home market, there is room for about a fifty per cent, increase in all the principal agricultural products. There is no reason why New Brunswick should not be the principal source of supply for potatoes for the West Indies, and practical experiment has demonstrated that New Brunswick can produce the best looking apple in Canada and of as good a flavor. All root crops grow well in New Brunswick soil and if the farmers only thought so they could grow enough wheat for their own consumption. That we are not losing ground as an agricultural country is shown by the growth of population in the last decade. According to the returns made out New Brunswick has gained 20,000 in population and more than half of this is in the rural districts.

The growth of the towns has been slow. Indeed if the census returns are to be accepted as correct, Chatham and Milltown have less population than in 1901. The largest growth has been in Campbellton, which is probably due to the rebuilding of the town after the fire. Campbellton, however, is destined to grow, and will no doubt become the most important railway centre in the northern section of the Province. The following brief table shows the growth of New Brunswick calities and towns since 1881 so far as records have been kept:

The census of 1911 adds nine to the list of New inswick towns for which separate returns have been le. AID FOR OLD McGILL.

For the first time in its century of history McGill University, one of Canada's greatest educational institutions, is appealing for funds, and the appeal should not go unheeded by the hundreds of New Brunswickers who call the fine old university "Alma Mater."

McGill has been unfortunate in one or two matters. Notably has this been the case in the impression which has prevailed for years that the purses of great Canadians like Strathcona, Mount Stephen and McDonald, were virtually at the disposal of the university. True, the gentlemen named have made many magnificent gifts to McGill and possibly this fact has fostered the general belief, but if the university is to progress as it must, in order to keep pace with Canada's growth in prosperity and in portance, it must continue in the path of expansion. This means additional outlay and the McGill expenditure has been exceeding its means for years, until today the deficit amounts to several hundred thousands of dollars and is steadily increasing.

Current Comment

The Provincial Government has displayed commendable energy in dealing with the suspension bridge. In 1908, when the Hazen Administration took office, it was discovered that the suspension bridge was so much out of order as to be unsafe for traffic, and it had to be repaired at large expense. Since then, recognizing that changed conditions of traffic required a new bridge, they have secured the best possible advice obtainable and will erect a bridge that will be a credit to the whole Province.

But there are statistical and dynamical laws in social and political affairs no less than in physics, and it is no According to the census returns of 1911 there are eighteen cities and towns in New Brunswick. This is more than are incorporated, but the census commissioner has evidently decided to have at least one town in every electoral division. The growth of our towns in the past decade can hardly be regarded as satisfactory to those who wish to see New Brunswick winning, a place among the Provinces of Canada. While the growth of New Brunswick has been greater than any of the Maritime Provinces, yet it should be greater still if the advantages we possess were better understood. Looking no further

STOCKS FELL

BACKWARD

New York, Nov. 18.—Quotations fell backward slowly on the stock exchange today after an attempt to continue the upward movement had been abandoned. A few stocks including Union Pacific, Lebigh Valley and Amalgamated Copper, gained a point or so soon after the opening, but the pressure of stocks for sale was steady and effective, and the list gave way to below yesterday's closing range.

Losses at the close were small, in only a few cases exceeding a point where the heavy tone was attributed largely to week-end profit taking, toward the close the weakness became more pronounced on selling by professionals which followed announcement of the action of the federal court in favor of the government in case of Chicago packers. The weakness of the Wabash issues was another unsettling factor. Announcement of the 4raffic agneement between St. Louis and the San Francisco Railway and the Louisville and Nashville as a result of the recent rupture between the St. Louis and San Francisco and the Gould system led to selling of the various Gould securities among which the Wabash issues gave way most readily. The common stock yielded 4 and the preferred 2%, and the four per cent. bonds 2%. Toward the close they railled slightly and complete figures for the October foreign trade made a favorable showing, at an excess of exports over imports of nearly \$80,000,000.

The trade reviews reported that conditions throughout the country were somewhat better, bustness having been stimulated by the drop in temperature. Further tips of better conditions were received from the copper trade. Responses to the recent increase in railway equipments orders, American Car, and Foundry was marked up two points. Despite these indications, however, the fortnightly report of the number of idle cars revealed an unexpected increase in the surplus, chiefly in the eastern and middle states.


