

WE have already drawn attention to the annual meeting of the Society of Arts held on the 23rd current, under the presidentship of M. Th. de Saus ure, and are now able to furnish some further details.

Professor Soref, in delivering a most interesting report, passed in review the operations of the Industrial section, in reference to Commerce, laying great stress upon the competition that has taken place in the manufacture of chronometers. This competition was instituted with the object of testing the workmanship and precision of chronometers turned out by Generoeses manufacturers, and none but those adopted for pocket use were admitted. They were deposited in charge of the authorities at the Observatory, and underwent the most searching ordeal possible to be applied to pocket instruments of this class. The lury specially retained to decide the difficult question as to whom to award the palm of excellency unanimously decided in favor of Messrs. J. M. Badollet & Co. This firm having carried off the sole prize by exhibiting a chronometer which fulfilled in the highest degree every condition required, crowned their first success by gaining honorable mention for two other chronometers. The allusion to 'his trip'e honor was received with enturing with a happy and humorous dissertation upon subjects connected with this department.




