Cruelty to Animals.

If the police allow horses to be abused in our streets much longer, as shamefully as is now the case, the formation of a branch of the society for the prevention of cruelty to animals will be an act of common humanity needed for keeping St. John within the pale of civilization. Nearly every day in the week, Sunday in particular, drunken men are driving furiously around the town, and nobody interferes with them. One horse is run over a wharf, another falls dead in the street, and another is crippled, and it seems to be nobody's business except the driver's and the owner's. This species of barbarism has been endured long enough, and something will be done to put a stop to it. It is a disgrace to the city for such acts to be perpetrated in its streets. A drunken driver should be arrested by the first officer who can reach him, but very few officers of the force ever meddle with one. The gutter ornament is carried off to the station, and the reckless driver of a poor horse allowed to kill the animal and endanger his own and other people's lives. We hope the Police Magistrate and the Chief will wake up to this evil, and suppress it. It is time that some examples were made. Manifestly the horse-killing man and his vicious action is required so that a wholesome dread of arrest may be felt by the brutes who hold the reins over their intellectual and moral superiors.

Waiting Places.

United States waiting places have comparatively few guests this summer, much to the disgust of the hotel proprietors and other interested persons. The N. Y. Journal of Commerce says it is not the weather that keeps people in town, but the hard times, men accustomed to take to the watering places in June or early July not having the money to spare for such luxuries. "The Oceanic" has been here, and they have not recovered their financial health. They must economize somewhere, and the best place to begin is on the superfluous summer vacation. Not to pass a season at a watering place means the saving of many hundred dollars, expended in pursuing a doubtful pleasure. The Journal of Commerce cannot offer any encouragement to the watering landlords of the watering-place houses until they reduce their prices, which are altogether too high, and give a little more solid comfort and a good deal less of cheap and tawdry ornament for the hotel proprietors and other interested persons in New Brunswick should take warning by this and provide cheap and comfortable, instead of dear and flashy, hotels for summer boarders. People may patronize the extensive establishments that abound at every fashionable summer resort for a while, but they are not likely to be throwing away their money and look for cool air and sea bathing at cheaper resorts. There is no more delightful place for a summer residence than the banks of the St. John river, and the number of hotels and cottages within sight of its waters must increase every rapidly. The industry is against the crowded mansions that make summer resorts miniature cities, affording no change whatever to one who lives in hotels in town, and in favor of testing real rural life. The rivers and shores of the St. John are not yet developed, but that have not been developed and the waters of the St. John are not yet developed by a class that is rapidly increasing summer after summer, not tourists looking for pleasure, but workers wanting rest and quiet. It is for this class that preparation should be made.

A Wood Pavement Novelty.

As our City Fathers have decided on paving Prince William street, the fact that they have not yet contracted for the work, they may be interested in the last wood-pavement improvement. This is a London notion, and no city has made more paving experiments than the great capital. The Wood Slab Pavement has been used in London for many years, and the new pavement, and is testing its merits. The Tinsler Trades Journal has the following in reference to it: "The pavement is made in slabs or sheets of the dimensions of 9 feet by 3 feet more or less, according to the class of street. These slabs or sheets are made in workshops away from the streets to be paved, by fixing the wood paving blocks in proper order in a mould on to a backing or foundation of boards, by means of bituminous cement, another course of boards laid cross-grained, being cemented in this backing by a thick layer of asphalt, and the spaces between the blocks run up with bituminous cement level with the surface of the blocks. The cement sets immediately, and the whole becomes in effect a homogeneous mass of great solidity and strength. The slabs are then carried to the streets to be paved (the soil of which merely requires to be levelled) and rapidly laid down. The joints of the edges are made to overlap at the ends, and are cemented together. The advantages claimed for the new pavement are: 1. It is non-slippery and gives a good foothold to horses. 2. It can be laid down at a comparatively small cost and with great rapidity, thus displacing the stoppage to traffic. 3. It is noiseless and easy of draught. 4. It is water-tight, thus preventing the wood from decay, consequent on the penetration of water; and the wood and bituminous cement of the joints wearing simultaneously, the edges of the blocks are kept up and the level, thus securing durability. It is further alleged that the pavement can be easily taken up for the purpose of repairs to gas and water pipes, without outstaying any damage. It will be observed that the special claim for the new system consists in the plan adopted to secure
