Report of Session

O^N account of the progress which has been made by the congregation during the year, it is a pleasant task for the Session to make their annual report.

Having, during the year, watched with approval the working of the different organizations of the church, we are now glad of the opportunity to express our gratitude to all who have faithfully worked in the interests of the congregation. While so doing, we do not forget that the Great Master, who has given salvation to the world, is entitled to all praise for every blessing which has been given to this congregation in 1896.

Early in the year, after an election by the congregation, seven elders were ordained. They have performed the duties of the eldership during the greater part of the year.

With this addition to the eldership, the members of Session will endeavor to perform the duties which devolve upon them, and that they may do so most efficiently, they request the members of the congregation to render them every assistance possible in their work. There are many ways in which assistance may be given to the Session. Any member who knows that a Presbyterian family has moved into a certain district will do well to notify the elder of that district. Information in regard to sickness in families may be given to the Session by those who have heard of such sickness on account of their acquaintance with those families. When a change of residence is made by a family of the congregation the Session are always glad to be informed of the change, that the family may not be overlooked. Often the Session would not be aware of distress among the poor of the congregation if the members of the church did not send such information to the Session. It will be seen that there are many ways of aiding the elders in the performance of their duties, and we request the members and adherents to afford all the assistance possible.

During the year there were not so many additions to the membership by certificate as usual, and fewer names of members were removed from the communion roll by certificate than during any previous year for a considerable period. The roll has been carefully revised and there has been a slight gain in membership.

While there have been many deaths among the adherents of the

Managers' 18th Annual Report

JOUR Board of Managers are extremely gratified to be able to present a financial statement which will compare favorably in many respects with any presented in previous years. pleased to express our appreciation of the sustenance contributed by members and adherents. The sum raised has been practically voluntary, and for that reason the more to be commended. It is known to members of your Board that many of our people are contributing all they can afford, and in many cases putting forth extra effort to sustain payments which in easier times entailed no personal sacrifice. Such being the case, your board has been extremely careful in outlay and has endeavored to limit the expenditure as much as reasonable demands would warrant. We are particularly pleased to draw attention to the forbearance of pewholders, and to express our thanks for their co-operation in providing sittings for visitors. As managers, our gratification would be heightened by more tangible evidences of appreciation upon the part of those so generously provided for.

The attendance at both morning and evening services throughout the year have been uniformly good, the evening services being usually overcrowded.

Vacant sittings have been in urgent demand, and the readiness with which persons securing allocations have accepted and used offering envelopes is an evidence of the desire and willingness of worshippers to contribute to the maintenance of the church when reasonably supplied with pews which will make them feel they can worship regularly with us.

Your Board would suggest to the congregation the desirability of sustaining any reasonable proposition looking to future provision of adequate accommodation for the children who assemble at the Sabbath School.

The Session having decided to leave in the hands of the congregation the making of a new arrangement for the service of praise, your Board, with a desire to promote harmony and careful executive action, beg to recommend as follows: That a committee, composed of five members from the Session, five from the Board of Managers,

Mor Miss Upp Reco Poor Won and five from the congregation outside of these bodies, take into advisement the whole matter and report their recommendation to the congregation at an early date.

Following the instructions given at the last annual meeting, your Board sought and secured a reduction in the rate of interest payable upon the mortgage. The trustees of the estate holding the mortgage consented to a reduction to five per cent. without making any additional demands for security, and their offer was accepted.

In order to interest the young men of the congregation in the work of the church, the Board recommends that the duty of ushering and collecting the offerings be placed in the hands of young men who may be chosen by the Session and Managers jointly.

The following members of the Board retire this year: Messrs. Murchison, Dods, Milne, Grant, Bryce, and Wilkie, and we would impress upon the congregation the desirability of interesting new members in church work by changing entirely the personnel of the portion of the Board retiring annually. Eight new members will now require to be elected.

The Board for '96 have now cast off the burden of the year which has gone, and hopefully assume that for '97, trusting that each member of the congregation will do his or her share in making it a blessing to all.

The Treasurer's statement is herewith submitted for your approval.

All sittings on the ground floor except some 13 at the back are now allocated. There are a few most desirable sittings unallocated in the gallery. Besides several changes, sittings have been allocated to 27 families who have joined the congregation during the year.

A YEAR has passed since our last report was made and we are afforded another opportunity of referring to what has been accomplished and to the hopes we cherish as well as our desires.

It is gratifying to believe that the efforts of our faithful teachers and officers may well be regarded as having been successful on account of the results which manifest themselves through the regular attendance of scholars and their interest in their work as well as on account of the number that have connected themselves with the church through professing faith in Christ.

While our teachers are striving to do their part faithfully we would remind parents of their duty to see that lessons are prepared regularly at home, at least so far as the memory work is concerned, in order that the minds of their children may be filled with gems of purest thought and greatest wisdom from the Book of books and from the standard Catechism of our beloved Church. Too much importance cannot be attached to the careful memorizing of the Golden Texts and the Catechism, at least, and this can only be properly done at home.

We have again to refer to the pressing need which continues to exist for better accommodation for our school, and we do this reluctantly owing to the fact that attention has been so frequently and urgently called to this most important matter, apparently to so little purpose.

In his report for the year 1891, when the school was very much smaller than it is now, the Superintendent said, "the work in the school has been considerably hampered by the crowded condition of the school," and in each report since that time the needs of the school have been urgently referred to, and yet we have neither increased nor improved our accommodation for this most important section of our church. Is it any wonder then that we desire to impress upon parents the fact that their children are not receiving proper consideration? Perhaps nothing could better emphasize this neglect than to point out the circumstances of our primary class. In the small room which was originally intended for from sixty to seventy-five children, we have an average attendance of double that number, and we have had as many as one hundred and seventy-five children crowded together in the room with those in charge trying to instruct

them. Why should this be necessary in our school? Not only is the primary class room greatly overcrowded every Sabbath, but it is in no way such a room as our children should be required to occupy, and not only is this room badly ventilated and far too small, but our general accommodation lacks in the same important particulars. In fact, the needs of our school are such that we feel that we cannot too strongly urge upon parents and others who wish our school prosperity, and realize the importance of an efficient Sabbath-school to the future welfare of our children and of our church, to be much more liberal than they have ever been heretofore in their contributions to our Sabbath-school Extension Fund. Surely the urgent needs of our school, a desire to do justice to the children and to glorify the God whom we serve, should stimulate all members and adherents of our church to liberal giving for this object. Let us help ourselves to the utmost of our ability and we shall certainly be blessed in so doing.

Report of Missionary Committee

In presenting their twelfth annual report and financial statement for the year ending December 31st, 1896, the missionary committee are pleased to announce an increase in contributions as compared with the previous year.

tl

While we gratefully acknowledge our thanks to those who have so generously supported the mission schemes of our church, thereby enabling us to show a better statement than we did in our 1895 report, we are candid enough to confess to a measure of disappointment at the general results of our year's offerings, particularly in view of the fact that we find a widespread apathy manifested by a very large percentage of our congregation in this most important branch of Christian work.

Early in the past year your committee issued a printed circular, setting forth the schemes of the Presbyterian Church, and asked for a more liberal support of the same and for a more general use of the regular missionary envelope, urging members to state on a slip attached to the circular the amount they were willing to contribute monthly to the mission schemes. This appeal was delivered at the homes of over 400 members and seatholders, with the result that we received responses from less than a dozen.

Later we resolved to provide a special missionary envelope to be placed in the pews on the Sabbaths of the monthly missionary offering, hoping thereby to bring this great branch of our church work more immediately before those who apparently overlooked or ignored it. For several months this plan worked fairly well, but latterly there has been a considerable falling off in their use, even after being placed so conspicuously before the congregation, so that at the present time there are not more than eight or ten contributions per month from this source.

In regard to our giving by the regular missionary envelope the following statistics should be of interest to the congregation and are very necessary if we are to review our work thoroughly: Out of a membership of some 750 in full communion, besides many adherents, we have less than seventy who are regular contributors to missions, and this includes all annual subscribers. We have had a total of 523 contributions through the blue envelope for the entire year, or an average of 44 per month—only 6 per cent. of our full membership that contribute regularly of their means to carry light into the dark places of the earth. Surely our Heavenly Father's command to "love our neighbors as ourselves" ought to find a more warm-hearted response from the 90 per cent. of our membership than hitherto. May He open our eyes that we may behold "the fields, for they are white already to harvest," and the laborers are ready and willing to-go into the fields; but we—what are we doing to support the noble missionary band and to extend the work of carrying the glad tidings of salvation to those who live and die in heathen darkness.

Let us ever be jealous of our position as a congregation in relation to missionary work, for, as we review the past decade, we remember with pride the nine noble hearted workers who went from our midst to carry the gospel message to those who were perishing without God and without hope, and who to-day are still cheerfully toiling on.

We trust that this year our congregation may more fully appreciate the privilege that Christ has conferred upon us by permitting us to be co-workers with Him in helping on the great missionary work which He came on earth to establish and which He enjoined on us to "carry into all the world and to preach the gospel to every creature."

With this end in view, your committee would respectfully request the members, both old and young, to make a more general use of the blue envelope than in the past, and give a regular contribution to missions, however small, for we feel assured that the congregation only need reminding of the interest displayed by our membership in past years, when our offerings were much larger and our membership much less than at present, to inspire them to far greater and nobler efforts than ever before, and we would like to see the number contributing increased at least tenfold.

What we particularly desire is not so much a small increase of large contributors, but rather a large increase of small contributors. Let us not withhold our help because our means are small, for mighty issues spring out of what are considered trifles, and a cent-a-day con-

tribution from our membership would aggregate a splendid missionary revenue of nearly \$3,000 per annum.

In closing this report your committee would commend this Christ appointed work to the prayerful attention of His people, with the hope that this year we may all realize more fully than ever before that it is indeed "more blessed to give than to receive," and would ask those who are willing to help in this glorious work to communicate with the Mission Secretary or to ask for missionary envelopes from the Weekly Offering Secretary, who is in attendance every Sabbath at the south entrance to the church.

We feel assured that if we carry on this work in which we are engaged earnestly, faithfully and prayerfully, it will not only prove a blessing to those heathen women for whom we labor, but will return in abundant blessing upon ourselves.






