THE GRAND TRUNK. The official announcement of the Grand Trunk dividend for the second half of 1889 is chronicled by English papers, just to hand. It shows the gross receipts for the half year to have been \$2,203,000, and the working expenses, \$1,698,000—a net revenue of \$505,000. The net revenue credits brought the total receipts up to \$699,971. From this revenue, however, \$479,000 in one reserve charge, less interest on bonds, etc., of corporations and subsidiary lines acquired by the company had to be deducted, as well as a deficiency of \$19,100 on the Detroit, Grand Haven and Milwaukee. After disposing of these amounts, \$200,971 remained available for dividend. This balance admitted of the payment of a dividend on the 4 per cent. guaranteed stock of \$2 64 per cent, making with the dividend of \$1 144 declared for the half-year to June 30, 1889, a dividend of 4 per cent. on the stock of \$2 78 34 per cent for the year 1889, leaving a small balance to be carried forward. The Chicago and Grand Trunk, after debiting all revenue charges, shows as stated above, a surplus of \$25,200 for the year ending Dec. 31, 1889. Financial authorities regard this statement as satisfactory. So many Canadians are interested in the success of this corporation that it will be interesting to hear that the traffic returns continue to indicate that it is more than holding its own, despite the intense competition to which it has been subjected by rival corporations. It has an energetic, clear-sighted and careful staff of officers, who can be relied on to lose no opportunity to advance the interests of their employers.

Williams gives a graceful and interesting illustration of the new social and religious movement, the Epworth League. Mrs. Barr's fine story of Yorkshire Methodism gathers strength.

A NOTABLE INDORSEMENT. Mr. Meredith and his friends in the Legislature have complained loud and long about the policy of the Ontario Government in adopting the bi-lingual series of readers for the use of children of French-speaking parents while they are being drilled into a knowledge of English. The system is pursued in the Acadia district of New Brunswick, has worked admirably, and no one now thinks of dispensing with the readers. The fact is that the reformer comments itself to every intelligent man who is not blinded by prejudice or floundering around in search of party capital, as Mr. Meredith, poor fellow, has been doing for years. Let us reproduce the opinion of the Educational Journal on the subject: A report upon "Bilingual Teaching in Great Britain, United States and Canada," has been presented to the Legislature. The evidence in favor of bi-lingual teaching, the use as well as the native language of the pupil as well as the language of the country, is very strong. Much of the report is devoted to the question of teaching in the Welsh schools, and shows that the tendency is to increase the number of children in the Welsh schools, and to attempt, as highly intimated, to instruct French children in English without using their own language as the medium of instruction. Experience proves that a little reading that suggests that there would be a great danger that the children so taught would learn to use their own words without any clear idea of their meaning, and thus have the appearance of knowing the language without understanding it. This report was published by the Provincial authorities, and his colleague, Mr. Creighton, has roundly berated the Minister of Education for giving publicity to the facts. It is not difficult to decide the cause of the simulated indignation. As the Educational Journal points out, the educational policy of the Ontario Government is fitted to the attainment of the French-speaking districts in schools in the French-speaking districts in the most practical way, and that, too, with the co-operation of the parents, which an anti-French language crusade would undoubtedly forfeit.

THE FOOL AND HIS MONEY. Pelley, who is the chief witness so far against Birchell, the young Englishman charged with the murder of Benwell, tells a remarkable story of the deception practiced upon him by the alleged Blenheim murderer. Whether or not Birchell was the perpetrator of the bloody deed will in due course be decided. At present the chain of circumstantial evidence seems to be decidedly against him, and if Pelley's story of how he and the murdered man were duped by the accused is verified, the suspicion now entertained will be very much strengthened. The experiences of Pelley and Benwell, in a modified form, have again and again been duplicated in this country, and it is high time that the authorities used the highest diligence to counteract a system that utters a noble Canadian lord, or territorial magnate, for a mere song. In the total magnitude, for the payment of about \$800 in cash of Pelley the sole requisite to obtaining a passage to Canada and the share in a prosperous established farming and horse-raising business, with the surrounding luxuries of an English castle. Again, it is a share in a stock company, and guaranteed to pay fabulous profits and to secure results in which faith could only be placed by gullible men with little or no ability to discriminate, or too easy-going to make much inquiry if they possessed the ability. Think of Pelley handing over his money to this adventurer Birchell on his mere assurance that he owned and controlled a half farm residence a mile and a half from Niagara Falls, heated by steam and lighted by gas, and with barns illuminated by electricity! There is nothing impossible in this; but such a story, in the present condition of affairs, should certainly have been accepted with reserve. Yet it hardly seems a more improbable tale than that told by the Canadian Dead Meat Company, recently floated in England, in the prospectus of which there is the following extraordinary declaration: From the Canadian Statistical Abstract and Record, 1888, it appears that 44,246 head of cattle and 33,829 sheep were sent to the United States. It is believed that the 40,000 head of cattle is very much understated. From the district east of Quebec, large quantities are

sent to Chicago, a distance of 900 miles, what they are slaughtered and the proceeds sent back another 500 miles for export to Europe via New York. It seems almost incredible that shrewd men of business have placed so much money into it; and it was scarcely to be expected that a member of the Dominion Government would allow his name to be used to boom an organization bolstered up by such statements. It is nevertheless a fact that Sir Hector Langevin has his name on the directors of the organization, and that so far his action has not been repudiated by his fellow Ministers. We venture to assert that no one of them can say that the prospectus tells the truth. Not one of them will say that either a single sheep, ox, or cow has been shipped to Chicago from the district east of Quebec, slaughtered, and then sent to New York for shipment to Europe. Neither the credit of the Dominion nor legitimate enterprise can be promoted by the tactics of Sir Hector Langevin and his associates, who are really more likely to injure the good name of Canada, by such statements as those contained in their prospectus, than are men of the stamp that got away with the money of the trusting young English capitalists, Pelley and Benwell.

LONDON will soon have an opportunity to see what manner of men the tiny little fellows are who refused to make friends with Stanley while he was cutting his way through the party capital, but lurked in bushes and launched their arrows, slimy with poison, as he passed along. Among the dwarfs that Stanley's intrepid Canadian aide, took under his wing, and has him now in stock in Zanzibar, waiting for milder weather before venturing to ship him north. He will be a great curiosity as a representative of the famous African continent, who have not only seen the island but have actually died even when taken no further north than Italy.
