

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The members of the above Ministry, after the resignation of Sir Mackenzie Bowell, on the 27th April, 1896, retained their respective offices until the formation of a new Cabinet.

On the 6th January, 1896, Hon. Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, Hon. Messrs Foster, Haggart Ives, Dickey, Montague and Wood resigned, giving as reason for their action, among others not disclosed in the announcement subsequently made to Parliament by the Government, that the Prime Minister had failed to fill the portfolio rendered vacant by the resignation of the Hon. Mr. Angers, On the 15th of the same month, with the exception of Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper, who was replaced as Minister of Tustice by the Hon. Mr. Dickey, they were appoirted to the respective positions they formerly held in the Government, and Sir Charles. Tupper, Bart., was appointed Secretary of State, and the Hon. Mr. De jardins, Minister of Militia and Defence.

The Act 58-59 Vict., (Imp.) Chap. 44, assented to 6th July, 1895 provides, among other things, that if any person being, or having been. Chief Justice or a Judge of the Supreme Court of Canada, or of a Superior Court in any Province of Canada, is a member of His Majesty's Privy Council, he shall be a member of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

By a commission passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the 7th May, 1901, His Majesty the King was pleased to appoint the Chief Justice, for the time being, of the Supreme Court of the Dominion of Canada to administer the Government of the Dominion in the event of the death, incapacity, removal or absence of the Governor-General.

#### The Exchequer Court of Canada constituted a Prize Court in time of war.

By a warrant dated the 17th August, 1899, addressed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to the Exchequer Court of Canada, the said Court, upon any proclamation being made by the Vice-Admiral for the time being of Canada that war has broken out between His Majesty and any Foreign State, and not otherwise, is authorized and required to take cognizance of and judicially to proceed upon all Captures Recaptures Seizures Prizes and reprisals of all Ships Vessels and Goods seized and taken and which are or shall be brought within the limits of the said Court. The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty suggested Halifax and Victoria, B. C., as places within the jurisdiction of the Court at which it would be convenient for Prize Courts to sit.

Under this Act fourteen of the Judges of the Superior Court must reside in the City of Montreal, instead of eleven as previously. Prior to the 1st March, 1900, under Chapter 24 of the Act 59 Vict. Que., assented to 21st December, 1895, which came into force on the 1st May, 1897, by Proclamation dated the 14th April, 1897, the Superior Court was composed of a Chief Justice and thirty Puisné Judges.
