Halifax, June 1.—Our town is favored at present with many circumstances, tending to revive its prosperity. The barracks are filled with troops; there is an unusual number of Her Majesty's Navy in port; merchant versels are in demand; rents are rising; mechanics have full employment; laborers are scarce, and provisions and wages as high. But amidst these signs of improvement we notice the renewal of a pest of the old times, which we fondly imagined was effectually suppressed by the introduction of a legitimate substitute—we mean, our copper currency is again becoming a nuisance, for it is mixed, and bad coppers in abundance are circulating almost as freely as good ones.
