### The Catholics of Bermuda.

In Catholic circles abroad very little is known about Bermuda; at the same time there is much in the history of the colony to interest Catholics. Bermuda was discovered by a Catholic, St. Juan de Bermudez, on the south coast of Smith's Parish is regarded as evidence of this, and the rock with its rude carving of a cross, accompanied by certain Latin letters in Spanish, and inscribed by tradition to the Spaniard, Ferdinand Camelo, is pointed to with pride as one of the ancient landmarks of the colony. There is no authentic evidence, however, that the population of the colony comprised any Catholics prior to the third decade of the present century. The early records of Bermuda contain abundant references to Portuguese Anabaptists, Quakers and Presbyterians, but Catholics appear not to have formed any of the elements of the population until much later. It is known that the first Catholic priest in Bermuda was introduced in 1824, and that he was the Rev. Fr. John P. O'Sullivan, of the Society of Jesus. He was the first of a long line of Catholic missionaries to the island, and his labors were successful in converting many of the heathen population to the Catholic faith. The Rev. Fr. either. The schools are quasi-private schools that receive public aid under certain regulations made by the Board of Education. The teachers are untrained, and in many cases quite unfit to teach. They mostly belong to the Anglican Church, and their schools are, generally, under the patronage of the Anglican clergy. Five years ago the School Inspector attempted to force upon the children of these quasi-public schools the obligation to learn the Anglican Catechism, and other portions of the Book of Common Prayer; but his attempt was resisted by the Catholic editor of one of the local papers. There are one or two private schools of a higher grade, in the town of Hamilton, but these, too, are under the patronage of the Anglican Church, which dominates here. It will not be considered strange, then, that Catholics should desire to establish a school in which their children could receive a good, sound, Christian education. Twelve months ago, under the direction and auspices of His Grace, Halifax, a decided effort was made to raise funds to establish a convent school in Bermuda. A Lazarus was held, and, notwithstanding the opposition that arose on all sides when it became known that the proceeds would be devoted to the establishment of a convent school—the net sum realized was between eight hundred and nine hundred dollars, and with this money a school has been started in Hamilton under the direction of the community of the Sisters of Charity from Mount St. Vincent, Halifax, N.S., an order which, in Canada, enjoys a high reputation for teaching. The school is known as the Academy of St. Agnes. It is at Woodlands, a beautiful estate just on the outskirts of Hamilton. The house is spacious and airy; the grounds are extensive, and the buildings are splendidly adapted for the purpose to which the place has been put. The Sisters have been heartily received, and although their school is only a few months old, they already have a fair number of pupils, with the prospect of adding to their number; and their pupils are not confined to the children of Catholics.

Besides securing pupils from the children of families resident on the island, in the winter time, the sisters will get many pupils from among the children of the American and Canadian visitors who throng Bermuda, and it is also expected that the educational advantages which the academy of St. Agnes offers will induce the parents of delicate children to send their children to the school. Cardinal Newman, who is now in his 90th year, was also on Whit-Monday, says the Daily News, to attend Mass at the Oratory, Birmingham, the occasion being the feast of St. Philip Neri. By St. Philip Neri the first oratory was established, and the society known as the Congregation of the Oratory was organized under the permission of a bull dated July 15, 1578. The English house was founded in 1847, and owes its celebrity to its being the place selected by Cardinal Newman for his abode after his admission to the Roman Catholic Church. The crowded attendance at the Oratory on Whit-Monday is in part attributed to the keen desire to see the venerable Cardinal. Relics of the patron saint are in the possession of the community at Edgbaston, and it is stated in a local account of Monday's services, that those who were exposed for veneration at the bottom of the chancel steps, and were surrounded by yellow flowers and candles. Banners of white and white satin bearing the words "St. Philip, servant of God, pray for us," were suspended from the pillars of the church. Cardinal Newman had to be supported by two of the clergy, and required several minutes to walk only a few yards. His genuflection at the altar was accompanied with great difficulty; but, notwithstanding these painfully manifest infirmities of age, it was observed that the Cardinal looked well. At the close of the service he was led to the centre of the chancel, from which he imparted his blessing to the congregation. "When descending the altar steps," says the accounting, "he wept, he was compelled to halt several times, and without the assistance of the accompanying priests it would have been a physical impossibility for his Eminence to have got to or from the church. At the bottom of the sanctuary steps those present had an excellent view of the Cardinal's thoughts of face upon which time and care have ploughed so many furrows; and here he lifted up his trembling hand once again in benediction."

Belice of the Blessed Virgin. Let us enumerate some of the most famous relics of Our Lady, and the sanctuaries enriched by their presence. A portion of the hair of the Blessed Virgin was once in the tabernacle of the Incarnate Word. Pure as the driven snow, and from the first instant of its conception invested with a grace unequalled, it was not becoming that this virgin hair should be subjected to any other treatment during life or after death. Mary was assumed into heaven, which is the very belief of Christendom. Nothing material has been left to console our hearts for the absence of Holy Mother save a part of her hair. This inestimable treasure, so much venerated by the Catholic world, is kept in several different sanctuaries; in Rome, in the Basilica of the Holy Cross, of St. John Lateran, and of St. Mary Major; in the Cathedral of Aix-la-Chapelle, and Oviedo in Spain; in France, in the principal shrine of Paris, Pay, Besnon, Douay, and St. Omar. Providence has not permitted many objects sanctified by the possession of the Blessed Virgin to be lost; marvellously have they been preserved, through ages of persecution, when the strictest measures of inquiry had subsided, and the most holy persons, among others St. Helena and St. Pauline, to present them anew to the veneration of the Catholic world.

There are in the first place, two relics. One of them is preserved at the most precious object in the treasury of Aix-la-Chapelle. It was presented by Charlemagne, who had himself brought it from Constantinople, as a gift for which the city of Charlemagne is indebted to the liberality of Charles the Bald. For ages it has not ceased to signalize its presence there by the most striking miracles. There exist also two robes, which are said to have been bequeathed by Our Lady to two pious widows, with whom she wished to leave a token of her friendship. It appears that these robes, after having been the property of the principal church in Constantinople for many years, were afterwards divided, and distributed among the different churches of the Christian world. Among these may be mentioned: "St. Lawrence outside of the walls of Rome"; the larger churches of Paris, (Glyde, Aix-la-Chapelle, Tongres, and Douay.) One of the cineraries belonging to the Blessed Virgin was for a long time preserved in Constantinople; but it is now in Rome, in the church of St. Mary Major. The city of Bruges possesses a portion of the same relic, which was brought thither from Constantinople in the middle of the thirteenth century. We find other pieces of the same cinerary, or other complete cineraries, in the churches of Arras, Tongres, and Aix-la-Chapelle. Another relic is also spoken of, which the Blessed Virgin herself is said to have given to the apostle St. Thomas, when he was on his way to India, after having arrived too late to see her before her precious death. This relic is kept in the church of Bruges, where it has been venerated since still the instrument of numerous miracles.

Finally, we may mention the wedding ring and several vails of the Blessed Virgin. It is difficult to say where this precious treasure the wedding ring is—if there be only. Three churches are contending for the honor of its possession, viz., the churches of Aix in Belgium, of Summe in France, and of Perugia in Italy. Most likely the ring is much venerated at the latter place; is the original, and the others are facsimiles that have thenceforth been made. Many miracles have been wrought by means of each. The vails of the Blessed Virgin are still more numerous. One is kept at Rome, in the church of the Holy Cross; another is preserved in Assisi, Italy, in Germany, claims to possess a third.
