It is widely known that a movement is in progress to bring into a representative federation all the churches in the world that hold to the Presbyterian form of Church government. The prepa ratory meeting is expected to agree Confederation, to be laid before a General Council of Federal Churches, to be held if possible in 1876; and that this preparatory meeting shall agree upon a provisional plan of re-presentation, that is, upon the num-ber of Deputies to be sent by each church to the first General Council.
