CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

I.

The Society shall be called the **DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.**

II.

No alteration shall be made in the Constitution of this Society, nor shall any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society be repealed, annulled or altered, except at a Meeting of the General Committee, by the vote of at least two-thirds of the members present, nor until it shall have received the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, which sanction must be given in writing, and delivered to the Secretary within six months of the said Meeting.

III.

No alteration or amendment in the Constitution, nor any repeal, cancellation, alteration or amendment of any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, shall be proposed or made at any Meeting, unless notice shall have been given in writing at the next previous Anniversary Meeting of such proposed repeal or cancellation, nor unless the terms of such proposed alteration or amendment shall have been stated in writing at such previous Meeting; from which, without the unanimous consent of the members present, no deviation, except of a mere formal nature, shall be permitted.

IV.

No repeal, cancellation, alteration, or amendment, shall be proposed, except by a member qualified to vote at the Anniversary Meeting, whose name shall be entered on the Minutes by the Secretary, together with the said proposition.

V.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however small, shall constitute the person paying the same, a Member of the Society. Provided that no member shall be qualified to vote at any General Meeting of the Society, unless of the full age of twenty-one years, nor unless he be a Life Member, or shall have subscribed and paid at least five shillings during the year preceding such Meeting.

VI.

Officers.

1. The Officers of the Society shall be a President, two or more Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, one or more Secretaries, and two Auditors of Accounts.

2. The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, and the Archdeacon the Senior Vice-President; and any Life Member may, at any Anniversary Meeting, be elected a Vice-President of the Society.

3. The Treasurer, Secretary, or Secretaries, and the Auditors, shall be annually elected at the meetings of the General Committee; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the Province, of any such Officer, the vacancy shall be filled up by the Executive Committee, at its next or any subsequent Meeting within the year; and the Lord Bishop shall, if he see fit, call a Special Meeting of the Executive Committee, for the purpose of filling any such vacancy.

VII.

(Executive Committee.)

1. There shall also be an Executive Committee, to be composed of the following Members, viz :

The Officers of the Society as provided for in the next preceding Article.

All Clergymen resident in the Diocese, duly licensed by the Lord Bishop, and Subscribers to the Society.

And twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members, or Annual Subscribers of at least One Pound; to be annually elected at the meetings of the General Committee, provided that no annual Subscriber shall be qualified to be elected, unless he shall, during the year preceding each Meeting, have paid his subscription of at least One Pound.

2. Five Members of the Executive Committee, three of whom to be Laymen, shall form a quorum.

3. The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day next following the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, and on Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

VIII.

(Objects.)

The Society shall embrace the following objects, and none other, viz :—

1. Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships; and assistance, when necessary, to those, who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught, and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.

4. The supply of such Books and Tracts as are on the Catalogue

of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of Clergymen who are poor; and towards the education of the children of such Clergymen; and towards the making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity.

8. The creation of a fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy.

9. Aid to the Endowment Fund in Particular Parishes.

IX.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services without the Bishop's license and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

X.

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most anxious to promote.

XI.

(Local Committee.)

1. The Members of the Society in each Parish, or in each Mission, consisting of two or more Parishes, shall, at the discretion of the Missionary of such Mission, constitute a Local Committee; and so also the Members residing in any District of a Parish set off under the authority of the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Rector and Church Corporation of such Parish, (there being in such District a Church duly consecrated, and a resident Clergyman licensed thereto by the Lord Bishop,) may, at the desire of such Clergyman, and with the approval of the Bishop and the Rector of the Parish, form a separate Local Committee; and in that case the District shall, for the purpose of the Society, be considered as a separate Parish.

2. Each Local Committee shall hold an Annual Meeting on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendations to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

3. Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two Lay Members of the Society to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

4. It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII.

1. The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately, on the first Thursday in July in each year.

2. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time by the President, or in his absence, by any two or more of the Vice-Presidents, four weeks' notice being first given thereof by advertisement in one or more newspapers, published in Fredericton and Saint John respectively.

XIII.

(The General Committee.)

1. The General Committee of the Society shall be composed of the following Members, viz: The Lord Bishop of the Diocese, who shall be the Chairman; but in the absence of the Lord Bishop, the Committee may elect a Chairman, the Secretary or Secretaries who shall also serve in that capacity at the Meeting of the General Committee, the Treasurer and the Auditors, the Rector or Missionary of each Parish, or of a Mission comprising two or more Parishes, and the Clergyman of any separate District of a Parish (provided that in the absence or sickness of the Rector of any Parish, the duly licensed Curate or Assistant Minister shall be considered *pro hac vice* a Member of the General Committee,) and the Lay Deputies elected by the Local Committees as before provided; all such persons being Subscribers to the Society.

Proof of the election of such Deputies by each Local Committee, to be the Certificate of the Chairman or Secretary thereof.

2. The General Committee shall meet on the two days next previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the Annual appropriation of the funds of the Society; and a report of the proceedings of such Meeting shall be made at the Anniversary Meeting.

3. The Order of Business in General Committee shall be as follows:—

Firstly. Production of Certificates of Lay Deputies.

Secondly. Secretary's Report to be read, and also a report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year.

Thirdly. Report of the Auditors to be read and laid before the General Committee.

Fourthly. Such appropriations or disposition of the funds to the objects of the Society as a majority of those present may determine.

XIV.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

That in future no application for grants shall be considered which is not made on the first day of the meeting of the General Committee, or previously. (18th Report, page 24.)

That each Missionary, receiving a salary from this Society, be requested to make an annual return to the Secretary, to be handed in by him at the first meeting of the General Committee, as follows, viz. :—

The number of Churches under his charge.

The number of weekly or other stated services held in such Churches or Stations.

The number of Communicants.

The average number of attendants.

The amount contributed in each Parish towards the support of such Missionary. (19th Report, page 24.)

That when a Missionary is absent from his Mission on account of ill health, with leave from the Lord Bishop, his Lordship be authorized, in his discretion, to pay to him the whole, or any part of the sum granted for such Mission. (23rd Report, page 33.)

That if any alterations shall be found necessary in the Schedule of Missionary Salaries, granted by this Committee, by reason of the death, absence, or removal of any Missionary named therein, the same shall be made by the Lord Bishop, with the concurrence of the Executive Committee.

That all grants by this Committee for Missionary salaries, and all sums placed at the disposal of the Lord Bishop, shall be for the service of the fiscal year in which the grants are made, and shall expire with it. (25th Report, page 30.)

That all vouchers for the payment of any sum of money whatever must bear on the face of them the authority under which they are paid, and the period for which they are claimed, together with the services performed.

That the Treasurer be directed not to pay any monies after the first day of May in each year, until authorized to do so by the General Committee at their meeting in July.

That the following be the form of draft for a Missionary's salary, to come into effect on the first of October, 1861, and that no draft be paid by the Treasurer, unless presented in person, or endorsed by the person to whom it is made payable, the Treasurer to take a receipt from the party to whom the payment is made on the same.

That for the future, the Clergy and other collectors of the funds of the Diocesan Church Society, be required in their lists of subscribers handed to the Secretary for publication in the Report, to insert in such lists the names of such persons only as have paid the amounts subscribed.

Whereas, The grants made by the Diocesan Church Society from its annual income (exclusive of the grants received from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel), are made in aid of local contributions for the support of the several Missions :

Therefore Resolved—That in future grants from this Committee will be made mainly with reference to the ability of the members of the Church in the several Parishes to support their own Clergymen,—the amount of local contributions for Church objects in such parishes, and the sums paid in aid of the general objects of this Society. (31st Report.)

That all bequests made to the Society be funded as heretofore, and the interest only applied to the general or special purposes for which they are bequeathed. (31st Report.)

REPORT.

THE special call made by the Lord Bishop last year upon the members of the Society, was responded to, as may be seen by the 31st Report, by increased contributions from very many of the Local Committees. Though with great regret the General Committee felt compelled to make no grants in aid of Church building and for books, the usual Missionary expenditure was provided for.

The Treasurer's accounts, made up to 1st May, show a considerable cash balance in favor of the Society. In this, however, is included the legacy of the late F. W. Hatheway. This amount, together with other sums paid on a mortgage, is to be invested in Provincial Securities.

It will be noticed that, in this way, the Society is gradually providing an Endowment Fund. All those who may desire to aid this object, and thus secure for future years the maintenance of the Church in this Diocese, have only by donations or bequests to increase the funds invested by the Society for Missionary purposes. Care and attention have of late been specially given to the state of these investments. They are found to be perfectly secure. Under the Constitution of the Society, the proceeds of this Fund must always be appropriated to carry out the object for which it has been provided.

The following is an abstract from the reports of the Missionaries and Local Committees, which give an indication of the work of this Society and a prospect with regard to its finances at the present time:—

ANDOVER.—Rev. W. H. Street reports an increase in the contributions for this Mission.

During the visit of the Bishop in October last, 24 persons were confirmed, the Church at the Falls consecrated, and also a Burial Ground at St. Leonards.

A Cabinet Organ has lately been purchased for the Church at the Grand Falls.

Contributions amount to \$117.50.

BATHURST, NEW BANDON, &c.—Rev. W. LeB. McKiel writes follows:—"I am happy to be able to report that the work of the Church is, in this Mission, steadily going on, and that members of the same are becoming more alive to their responsibilities and their privileges. Owing to the great depth of snow last Winter, I found it impossible, sometimes, to go to the distant Stations in the Country, but generally speaking, I have been able to fulfil my appointments. The Services, when the weather was favorable, were well attended. The number of Communicants was increased to 53. Among those baptised are included 4 adults baptised at Shippegan Island. I generally visit Shippegan and Miscou Islands during the winter, as they are the more easy of access. The Bay is frozen and the journey soon performed on the ice. In the summer the Islands can only be reached in a boat which cannot always be obtained, as they are used in the fishery.

"The Protestant part of the population numbers between 40 and 50. Owing to their isolated position they enjoy very few advantages; no schools, no churches, and in Miscou, no roads. The journey from one end of the Island to the other must be made in a boat or in a cart along the beach.

"Your Missionary is the only clergyman who ever visits them, and they are always delighted to see me, and flock to the place where I perform service.

"In Bathurst, last Winter, through the exertions of the ladies, a sum of \$34 was raised for local church purposes, and they are still to be credited in their exertions for the good cause."

Contributions amount to \$70.87, which exceeds the amount of last year by \$28.82.*

BUCTUCHE AND COCAIGNE.—Bro. A. H. Weeks is gratified in being able to send to the Society, for general purposes, a somewhat larger sum than last year, about \$29.

CAMBRIDGE.—Rev. B. Shaw writes that the usual services have been conducted with regularity and have been well attended considering the distance numbers have to travel. "In March last," Mr. Shaw adds, "I suffered from ill health and was obliged to cease working for nearly three weeks. I am thankful to say that I am now able to resume my full duty.

"Although we are not making any rapid steps either in church building or increase of church members, yet we have reason to be thankful for many mercies and some signs of improvement. Several new communicants have come forward since last year, and we have expended some money (though not so much as we hoped) upon the churches and in building a Parsonage house."

CANTERBURY.—Rev. T. Hartin reports contributions to the amount of \$36.37.

CAMPOBELLO.—Rev. J. S. Williams has inclosed the following resolutions passed at a meeting of this Local Committee:—

1. That the Campobello Local Committee begs to assure the Society of its continued interest in its welfare, and desire for the success of its operations.

They desire a renewal of the grants to the Mission, and observe that the Church School has been more largely attended during the past year than at any previous time.

"There is a Service," Mr. Williams adds, "on Wednesday and Friday through the Summer, and this year on the vigil and eve of every festival. On July 1st, 1866, the Bishop confirmed 10 persons, 8 of whom are communicants. Since the commencement of the present year, the Holy Communion has been celebrated on every Lords' Day and Festival, when the "three at the least" remained to communicate with the Priest; with the exception of one Sunday and one Holy Day on which I was absent from the Parish, on both of which I celebrated in other places. On one Sunday and two Holy Days there was no celebration through lack of company.

CARLETON.—Rev. W. Walker reports contribution to the amount of \$66.40.

CHATHAM.—Rev. S. Bacon reports that at the Annual Meeting of this Local Committee the following resolution was adopted:—

"That this Committee having hitherto invariably expressed their deep conviction of the incalculable benefits arising from the Diocesan Church Society, they can only on the present occasion declare that every succeeding year tends to increase the conviction, that, under Divine Providence, the very existence of the Church in this Province depends upon its continued prosperity, and moreover, that every one who really prays for the extension of the Redeemer's Kingdom cannot fail, by every possible means, to promote the interests of a Society which has the salvation of immortal souls for its object."

Contributions amount to \$130.33.

DERBY, BLACKVILLE, &c.—Rev. W. Cruden writes that strong efforts are being made to paint the Church at Derby and therefore the contribution to the Society will be less than that of last year. They will be from \$18 to \$20.

DOUGLAS.—Rev. Theodore E. Dowling has forwarded the following report:—

"The chief feature of interest to record about All Saints Church, Cross Roads, is that the debt on the building has been entirely removed. Since January 1st the congregation raised the sum of \$191.00 for this purpose. It may seem a small amount to some of our city merchants, but it is a large sum for twelve families in Douglas to provide. I am glad to mention this, and with great thankfulness.

"The congregation at the Upper Keswick are working in good earnest at the new church *with their own hands*. It will be ready for consecration in the first week of October.

"These two churches have received no grant from the Diocesan Church Society, and therefore I trust that the application which was made last year on behalf of a Lay Reader will not be considered unreasonable, if repeated. Since the last Report, Mr. James Vroom, of St. Stephen, has offered his services for this post. He is willing to throw himself into the work—and an arduous one it will certainly prove—provided that a decent maintenance can be secured. Our first want in this part of the Parish is a well-worked Sunday School; a room is attached to the church for this purpose. Within the last two weeks 16 children have been baptized, and the number will be largely increased before long. Now, if ever, is the time to train them in "the old paths where is the good way;" but without some such assistance as proposed

they must be left to others who will not neglect them. If, therefore the Society's funds permit, I respectfully ask for the sum of \$80.00 for a Lay Reader at Keswick.

"Before its completion, the Keswick Church has lost the assistance of a very dear friend who has just fallen asleep in the Lord. Through her untiring exertions, new church plate has been provided and daily expected from England; and other parts of the Parish can speak of her loving interest.

"The Tay Settlement was visited with a grievous mortality among the children during the winter months, and about the same time it pleased God to remove from our midst a young woman who was an ornament to the congregation, and a good example in her family. From the first she was one of our most regular communicants.

"The collections from each of these three districts for the Society have increased, and the sum of \$100.86, contributed by the whole Parish, is larger than usual."

FREDERICTON.—Rev. C. Lee reports contributions to the amount of \$902.19.

NEW ALBANY.—Rev. J. Pearson reports contributions to the amount of \$27.46.

CAKROW.—Rev. J. Neales writes as follows:—"Being anxious to increase the funds of the Diocesan Church Society, I this year made use of the persuasive agency, recommended in the Church Magazine when edited in Fredericton, by which means the amount has been made up to \$65.16.

GLENELG, NEWCASTLE, &c.—Rev. J. Hudson has the satisfaction of acquainting the Society that during the past twelve months—that is, from July 3rd, 1866, to the present date, July 1st—he has received and forwarded to the Society's Treasurer, from the little flock of faithful ones in his scattered mission field, the sum of \$100, and that this offering has been contributed by the following Parishes, and no doubt accompanied with the best wishes of all for the Society's continued prosperity.—Newcastle, \$44.80; Glenelg, \$37.98; Northwark, \$2.85; Ludlow, \$14.39.

GRAND MANAN.—Rev. G. T. Carey has forwarded to the Treasurer \$20, as contributions to the Society.

GREENWICH, &c.—Rev. D. W. Pickett writes that during the past year the Bishop visited his mission and confirmed 23 candidates—10 in Greenwich, 9 in Petersville, and 4 in Wickham. There have been 20 baptisms, 10 marriages and 19 funerals during the past year. "The loss of my horse," Mr. Pickett writes, "in the early part of last winter interrupted in some measure the work of visiting throughout the mission; but this loss has been amply made up to me by the liberality of the people, particularly in Wickham, where they very promptly handed me \$60 to assist in purchasing another.

"The services in the several churches and stations have been regularly supplied when the state of the travelling permitted. The Parish Church in Petersville has been opened once a fortnight; but in order to do this I have been obliged to omit a service in Wickham, as the dis-

"Petersville is an extensive parish, containing a large number of church members, who are very desirous to have a resident Clergyman, and will gladly pay \$400 towards his support. I trust the Society may this year have the means at its disposal to provide the balance of the salary, so that the vacancy may soon be filled."

The contributions from this mission, exclusive of Petersville, will not be less than \$75. The whole amount is \$80.64.

HAMPTON.—Rev. W. Walker reports contributions to the amount of \$103.06, of which the sum of \$10.11 is limited to the Widows and Orphans' Fund.

KINGSCLEAR.—Rev. J. Black reports contributions to the amount of \$70.32.

KINGSTON.—Rev. W. E. Scovil reports contributions to the amount of \$150.50.

LANCASTER.—Rev. W. S. Covert has forwarded the usual returns, and states that the contributions for this local committee will amount to \$30.36.

MAUGERVILLE AND BURTON.—Rev. H. Pollard writes that during an absence of six months from his mission his place was supplied for five months by Rev. E. Hanington, and the rest of the time through the kindness of the neighbouring clergy. During that period a confirmation was held, when 21 candidates were presented, some of whom are now communicants.

During the summer months the Sunday Schools in Maugerville and Oromocto were better attended than usual, and a greater interest seemed to have been taken by the laity.

Mr. Pollard adds that the grant of books formerly made by the Society is much missed in his mission. He also recommends that a grant be made by the Society to reduce the price of the Diocesan Hymn Books, that they may be more generally used—especially in Sunday Schools—or else that a cheaper Hymn book, such as that of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, be substituted.

MONCTON.—Rev. W. N. Boyer has enclosed post office orders to the amount of \$41.60, from which there was a deduction of 40 cents, owing to a mistake in the direction of one of the orders.

Mr. Boyer attributes the deficiency, compared with the contributions of last year, to the fact that the latter was made for a specific object; also to the depression of business from the failure of the bank at that place.

"I held," Mr. Boyer writes, "Divine Service at Havelock and Peticodiac once a month, 33 miles distant from Moncton; and I have administered the Holy Communion in the Parish Church of Havelock four times; average attendance is 10."

NORRON.—Rev. E. A. Warneford reports that the contributions amount to \$38.85.

PORTLAND.—Rev. Canon Harrison writes that “notwithstanding the extreme scarcity of money, and the loss of Mrs. Simonds’ subscription of \$20 (who is now in Germany), our contributions to the Society are considerably in excess of what they were last year, amounting to about \$150, of which \$15 are limited to the Widows and Orphans’ Fund.

“I regret my inability to be present at the meeting, and I pray that the Lord will direct you in all your consultations for the promotion of His glory, and the peace and prosperity of our beloved Zion.”

PRINCE WILLIAM, DUMFRIES, &c.—Rev. E. A. W. Hanington writes as follows:—“My short time of little more than six months in this mission has not enabled me to record any important changes in these parishes. There has been but little sickness, and few deaths have occurred among my people since my appointment, though very many of the younger members passed away during the preceding year.

“There has been one adult baptism in the parish of Dumfries, and I pray that this may be the first fruits of a general increase to the number of our small congregations.”

Contributions amount to \$85.29. “This is,” Mr. Hanington writes, “an excess of more than one-quarter over last year’s subscriptions, and those of last year exceeded previous collections. This increase has been made chiefly in the back Settlements, and the Society owes much to the earnest and zealous co-operation of T. Jones, Esq., who year after year assists most effectually in making the collections.”

QUEENSBURY.—Rev. W. H. Tippet writes as follows:—“I have much pleasure in reporting that the collections and subscriptions for Queensbury amount to \$61.36, which are a *little more* than they were last year, and *twice as much* as the were a few years ago. The contributions to myself during the year have amounted to \$80, part of which were given me towards the purchase of a new wagon, my old one having suffered, like its owner, a good deal of wear and tear in the missionary service.

“I have baptized four, married three, and buried five persons during the year; have held about 100 public services, and travelled about 1500 miles in the discharge of my duty. The heavy snows of January completely shut me out from one part of my parish for more than a month, but, with this exception, the Sunday services have been sustained with their usual regularity, and on three Sundays out of four the Holy Communion is administered in one or other of my churches.

“My little Sunday School at the parsonage suffered a considerable diminution in numbers in the fall of the year, in consequence of one having been opened in a Baptist meeting-house not far distant; but we are gradually recovering, and probably by the time of holding our School festival in September, we shall stand as well as usual.

“One cheering event during the year has been a visit from our Bishop, and the administration of the rite of confirmation in one of our river churches to a small but interesting class of nine young persons, of whom became communicants. With one of them it was both her first and last communion on earth, for it pleased God very soon afterwards to call her to himself.

“I cannot close my report without adding that the missionary missions have suffered a severe loss during the year in the removal by death of Mr. and Mrs. Morehouse. Mr. Morehouse was our principal warden for many years, and one of the chief agents in procuring and sustaining a resident clergyman and building the parish church. He

advice and experience were invaluable; his hospitable house was always open to me and my brethren, and your missionary is glad of an opportunity of publicly and permanently recording in the pages of the Society's report his sense of his own and the church's obligations to him and his amiable wife. The latter was long and painfully afflicted, but bore her suffering with the most exemplary patience, and was an encouraging example to us all of faith and hope and love. They died within a fortnight of each other, universally honored and lamented, and have left a gap which we can hardly hope to see filled."

RICHMOND.—Rev. N. A. Coster has forwarded a subscription list amounting to \$79.68.

SACKVILLE AND DORCHESTER.—Rev. G. G. Roberts hopes in a short time to send a list of subscribers amounting to \$160.

"The usual duties of the mission," Mr. Roberts writes, "have, with scarcely any interruption, been performed during the past year. The congregation and communicants, I am thankful to say, continue gradually and steadily to increase, and my three Sunday Schools are kept up with unabated interest and success. I am now very busy preparing candidates for confirmation, and hope to have a goodly number to present to the Lord Bishop in September next."

ST. ANDREWS AND CHAMCOOK.—Mr. Geo. D. Street reports contributions to the amount of \$130.

The members of the Society in this place are making great efforts to finish the parish church, now in course of erection; and at Chamcook a considerable amount is required from the people for the necessary repairs of St. John's Chapel. These pressing local claims, it is much regretted, at present hinder larger contributions to the Society.

Through the kind assistance of the Rev. R. E. Smith, the services are regularly kept up at Chamcook. There is a constant attendance at church, and an increasing number of communicants. Mr. G. S. Grimmer continues to render invaluable assistance both with reference to the choir and the Sunday School.

ST. GEORGE.—It is deeply regretted that the Rev. John McGivern, Rector of this parish, and one of the most devoted friends of this Society, is very unwell, and has been confined to his room since the week before Easter. The following is the report of the local committee:—

"This branch has to regret so small a sum in their collections for the present year. This has arisen partly from the severe illness of the Rector, who could do nothing personally to aid a cause in which he has always felt the deepest interest, and partly from the scarcity of money with those who are always steady supporters of the cause. We trust the Society will accept the amount of our present offerings in the spirit in which they are given. They amount in all to \$113.52, for the general purposes of the Society.

"It is to be noticed that there was an addition to the contributions last year of \$61 from the volunteers; this amount could not be expected this year."

The local committee express their heartfelt sympathy for the Rector in his present affliction, and they speak of his regret at not being able to attend the anniversary meeting.

St. JAMES.—Rev. W. Armstrong writes that he is sorry that the contributions from this parish fall short of those of last year; this is partly owing to the scarcity of money. The amount at present is \$182.—He hopes to be able to make this up to \$200.

St. JOHN—Trinity.—Mr. H. W. Frith reports contributions at present to the amount of \$354.12. He has not much doubt but that this will reach to \$400.

St. MARK.—Mr. C. H. Fairweather reports contributions to the amount of \$204.60.

St. PAUL.—Rev. W. H. DeVeber writes:—"I am happy to report contributions from this parish amounting to \$510—\$50 more than last year.

"For various reasons I was led to anticipate a considerable reduction rather than an increase. With a faint heart I appealed to my parishioners to avert the anticipated evil by adding to their subscriptions.—They responded to my appeal with more than their accustomed liberality, and with an alacrity worthy of all praise.

"I heartily thank God who enabled them to offer so willingly for His service, and to give each a pleasing proof of their sympathy for their more needy brethren.

May God put it into the hearts of all His people in like manner "to bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ."

St. MARY'S, STANLEY, &c.—Rev. W. Jaffrey reports contributions to the amount of \$51.92.

St. STEPHEN.—Rev. E. S. Medley, in consequence of serious illness, has been obliged most reluctantly to give up for a time the arduous duties he had undertaken, and is now in England. No report has, therefore, yet been received from this Mission.

SHEDIAC.—Rev. G. S. Jarvis, D. D., writes that:—Notwithstanding the separation of a part of this Parish, the contributions exceed in amount those of any previous year. Owing, however, to the suspension of the Westmorland Bank, which took place after the collections were made, there was a considerable discount on some of the payments, which reduced the amount from Shediac and DUNDAS, &c., from \$64.08 to the sum of \$57.33.

SIMONDS.—Rev. G. Schofield has forwarded the following Report:
"During the last year we have painted the Church at Black River, and by the kind assistance of a few friends at St. John, we were enabled to defray the expense—\$62—as soon as the work was completed.

At Loch Lomond, Mr. Francis has superintended the erection of a stable and wood-house, and also a new fence in front of the Church. He has also obtained the funds, about \$40, to meet the entire cost.

Since my last Report, I have commenced two new stations; one at Willow Grove, with an average congregation of 35, and the other at Golden Grove, with an attendance of about 70.

During the months of the present Summer, my arrangements are as follows:—On one Sunday, service at the Penitentiary at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 8; at Black River at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 1, and at Willow Grove at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 4.

On the alternate Sunday at the Penitentiary at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 8; at Loch Lomond at 11; at Golden Grove at 2, and at Quaco Road at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 4.

I have also a service every Tuesday at the Alms House. During the year I have had 44 baptisms, 9 funerals, and 4 marriages.

These few facts record the external history of the Parish for the year. There is, however, another record of the year's labors which cannot be expressed by words or figures; a record of the blessed influence of holy ministrations on the hearts and lives of our people,—guiding them into all truth, preserving them from sin and folly, fostering each germ of holy principle, and training them by the services of earthly Sabbaths and Sanctuaries, for the Everlasting Sabbath, and the " Temple not made with hands."

Contributions not yet completed.

SPRINGFIELD AND JOHNSTON,—Rev. G. Rogers writes as follows:—

" My duty during the past year has been, with but little variation, the same as heretofore. My register records as follows:

The Church at Johnston has been regularly kept open for Divine worship. I am happy to say that neither from illness or any other cause has this part of my Mission suffered from neglect of the ministration of the Word and Sacraments. I have often had occasion to regret the distance of this Church from the Church at Springfield, not from the actual labour required to accomplish the journey, but from the necessity of closing the Parish Church on every alternate Sunday. Thus both Parishes suffer, and the evils unfortunately are too apparent. Although laboring under the disadvantage I have alluded to, yet I have been able, to some extent, to surmount the difficulty. For some months past I have given three, out of every four services performed, in Springfield. I insert a list of the Churches and places, with the distance of each from the Parish Church at Springfield, in which Divine service was held during May:

11 A. M.	3 P. M.
May 5, Trinity Church,	Scovil's, 8 miles.
12, St. John Church, 16 miles,	McLeod's, 5 miles.
19, Trinity Church,	Irish Settlement, 9 miles.

It affords me much pleasure to report upon my Sunday Schools. On the first Sunday in May two were opened in Springfield, and one in Johnston. All are in good working order, in which the religious instruction imparted is in accordance with the doctrines and principles of our beloved Church. The success of one of the Schools in Springfield is mainly dependant upon the zeal and energy of two young Churchmen, whose exertions are deserving of the highest praise. Some twenty-five or thirty children are thus receiving religious instruction, who, by distance from the school at the Parish Church, would otherwise be excluded from its benefits. If through the medium of my report I could enlist the benevolence of the Society, or the charity of any one interested in the work of Sunday Schools, to second my efforts by a present of books or tracts as rewards to the most diligent and deserving scholars, I should feel encouragement in the work, as well as

afford encouragement and pleasure to the children. I have ventured a second time to appeal to the Society, as it is one of the objects to which it professes support.

Last July the Bishop visited Springfield and held a Confirmation service. Fourteen candidates presented themselves as recipients of that holy rite. The following day his lordship proceeded to Johnston and confirmed eleven. It is very gratifying to see that the good resolutions of several of these young persons were not as "the morning cloud and as the early dew," but they have been constant attendants of the means of grace and frequent communicants of the Holy Supper of the Lord.

It is with the deepest regret that I have to mention the loss our Church has sustained in Springfield in the death of one of her warmest and most devoted members. Mr. E. G. N. Raymond, after a protracted and painful illness, was taken from us. As a member of the Vestry, his opinion was valued and his usefulness prized. Four months earlier his aged and venerable father, at the advanced age of 94, also departed this life.

I omitted last year any mention of the repairs and painting done upon the Church. At considerable expense,—some seventy dollars,—the fabric has been put in good condition. New fences were made: all is in good repair. The Rectory is now undergoing repairs."

STUNDOLM.—Rev. R. Simonds reports \$71.30 as paid to the Treasurer of the Society.

SUSSEX.—Rev. C. P. Bliss having been obliged by ill health to resign this Mission, his successor, Rev. C. S. Medley, has only very lately assumed the duties, and has had no time, as yet, to make any report to the Society.

UPHAM.—Rev. S. J. Hanford writes that the contributions will somewhat exceed \$100.

WESTMORLAND.—Rev. D. M. Bliss writes that he hopes the Society will receive as much from this Parish as they did last year; the full returns will be forwarded as soon as possible.

WESTFIELD.—Rev. E. S. Woodman reports the contributions for this Mission will not fall short of those of last year. They are \$106.40.

WOODSTOCK.—Rev. S. D. L. Street, in inclosing the resolutions passed at the meeting of the Local Committee, writes as follows:—"There is nothing we are called upon to bring under the notice of the Society excepting the wants of the Parish of Richmond, which are really very great, and the Church there will never flourish as it ought to do until it is made a separate mission, or a resident Missionary appointed.

The work of this mission is carried on now as usual. I was left alone for a few months in the spring by the departure of the Rev. R. C. Nelson, who was obliged to return to England, after a residence of four years in this Mission. His place, however, has been happily supplied by the Rev. J. Dinsey, who has lately come into this Diocese; he has entered upon his work here with much zeal and energy, and I have every reason to believe he will prove a most valuable assistant; he has been some years in the ministry, and his experience will add much to

his usefulness. But still we are doing work which would, if carried out, give ample employment to three Clergymen. But when Richmond is made a separate Mission, there could be much more accomplished in other districts, which have now to be neglected altogether or partially attended to.

I regret that I cannot report an increase in the contributions to the Society; but when it is considered that my congregation are erecting a new Church, that many of the contributors have either left the place, or are not in a position to enable them to give now, I do think it is a matter of congratulation that so large an amount have been obtained, particularly when so little money is in circulation. This surely manifests an increasing interest in the welfare of the Society. I have endeavored, both publicly and privately, to impress upon the members of my flock the necessity of doing to the utmost of their ability in support of the Society, upon which the continuation of the Church as it is now, or its extension, solely depends.

If every subscriber would but add a few shillings every year to his last year's contribution, it would enable the Society to increase the number of its missionaries in like proportion. Without some increase of aid yearly, it is quite impossible to expect that the Church can be extended.

We have done our best here to carry out this principle, and I hope other portions of the Diocese have done likewise.

During the past year, ending on Easter Monday, the sum of \$337 was obtained in Woodstock alone by offertory collections for Church purposes, besides a donation of \$217 for the Rev. R. C. Nelson, on his leaving this Curacy. A large amount has also been contributed towards the new Church, which I hope will be ready for consecration in October next. It is worthy of remark that the contributors of the largest amount to that work are among the most liberal subscribers to the funds of the Diocesan Church Society.

The following resolution was passed at the meeting of the Woodstock Local Committee:

That this Committee would again press upon the Society the claim of Richmond for a Missionary, as soon as one can be obtained for that purpose.

Contributions amount to \$331.19.

The sum total, as compared with last year, shews a considerable deficiency. The present position of the Missions in this Diocese require a far larger amount than has been received. For what is it, after all, compared with the means of the Church, the abundance God has given to many of its members? What compared with the wants the Society stands waiting to supply? Difficulties indeed are presented. In some instances opinions differ as to the mode of carrying on this work. But should these obstacles be thought sufficient to hinder the progress of this Society; on the offerings of the people of God? Has anything been done, in connection with this Society,—anything which may not (if necessary) be amended, which should hinder Churchmen from *working together and giving together*, to ex-

tend to present and future generations those blessings, which, during the past have come down upon all through the Church of Christ?

In these matters there is something truly fearful in the idea of standing still or going back. Worse in a Society than in an individual's christian life. Every year there is an increasing need of New Missions in the country portions, and the back Settlements of the Province. In many towns and larger parishes the duties are beyond the power of any one Clergyman. Sad instances are not wanting of failing health in the case of several of the Clergy which, rest or timely assistance might have averted. It is also well known, that of late years the expense of living has greatly increased, without any increase in the stipend of the Missionary. How much must this often add to those cares and anxieties, which, in the charge and work of a Mission are necessarily very great!

The Society may justly present these points for the earnest consideration of every member of the Church,—commending them to their prayers and their united zealous exertions:—

1. That the Society may enable the Lord Bishop, either by the appointment of travelling Missionaries or otherwise, to extend the means of grace to the Country Districts and Settlements of the Province, and assistant Ministers in the larger Towns and Parishes.
2. To provide stipends, which with local resources may be more adequate to the necessary expenses of the Missionaries.
3. To supply by importation from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge a sufficient number of Bibles, Common Prayer Books, and works of devotion and instruction.
4. As far as possible, year by year, so to add to the investments, as to secure at least a partial endowment for the Church in this Diocese.

The Society will not fail to give expression to its feelings, with reference to the death of the late Rev. Canon Coster. He, it is well known, in conjunction with his brother, the late Arch-deacon, was mainly instrumental in the formation of this Society; for many years he gratuitously performed the duties of Secretary. Until prevented by that illness which preceeded his death, the late Canon Coster was ever present at the Meetings of the Society,—taking an active part in all its proceedings. A tribute of grateful respect to his memory is therefore justly due.

A REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY FOR THE PAST YEAR.

The minutes of the meeting of this Committee held in St. John on the 6th July, 1866, were published in the 31st Report. (See page 36-37.)

The next meeting of this Committee was held at Fredericton October 3rd, when the account of Barnes & Co., for printing the last Annual Report, amounting to \$122.65, was read, and ordered to be paid.

A statement of the Treasurer's Account made up to the 1st of October was presented.

A report of the Committee appointed in July last with reference to the DeWolf Estate, was read, and the Lord Bishop was requested to act in accordance with the recommendation contained in the said Report.

An Account of the Secretary for incidental expenses from July to October, amounting to \$12.60, was ordered to be paid.

The Committee met at St. John on the 2nd of January, '67, when a letter from the Secretary was read, acknowledging the receipt from Mr. W. Jack of a bond on the part of the Treasurer in conjunction with the Rev. W. E. Scovil and Major W. B. Robinson, in the sum of \$4000, and also reporting certain subscriptions unpaid.

The Treasurer's Account made up to 1st January last was submitted.

The Loan Committee was directed to invest the sum of \$2,000 received from the estate of the late F. W. Hatheway and the portion of the principal paid on the Arnold mortgage.

A correspondence between Mr. W. Jack and the Lord Bishop and Mr. E. W. Miller, on the subject of the Miller Mortgage, having been read, it was referred to the Loan Committee.

Mr. W. Jack's Account for services rendered, amounting to \$14.70, was ordered to be paid.

The Secretary was directed to write to the Local Committee referred to in his letter, and to urge the immediate payment of the sums due to the Society.

It was—Resolved, that the Rev. C. Lee and Mr. W. Carman be a Committee to make necessary arrangements for the meeting of the Society in Fredericton in July next.

APPENDIX B.

To the Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick:—

The Committee appointed to consider the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, with a view to placing it on a self-sustaining basis, and to confer with the Committee of the Clerical Mutual Life Assurance Association, appointed to consider the same subject, report that they have received from the Committee of the Clerical Assurance Association a copy of a proposed Scheme suggested by them for the amalgamation of that Association with the Diocesan Church Society, which is herewith submitted; and having considered the subject, are of opinion that it is not desirable for the Diocesan Church Society to intermeddle therewith at the present.

They have also received from the Rev. J. Pearson a Scheme for the formation of a Fund to provide Pensions for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the Diocese, which they now submit and recommend to the consideration of the Society.

In the Dioceses of Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, and Toronto, funds for these purposes are in a flourishing condition, and reports from these Dioceses might be of great importance in the formation of one among us.

The cordial support and co-operation of all the Clergy will be required, and without this, success can hardly be anticipated.

Supposing the number of the Clergy to be about fifty, and the average annual contribution for each be three pounds, and the collections from the several Parishes equal the sum the Clergy pay, three hundred pounds a year would be obtained; and to this add the interest of the twelve hundred pounds now at the credit of the Widow and Orphan Fund, three hundred and seventy-two would provide for ten widows at thirty-five pounds each per annum, and as it is to be hoped that no such number of claims will arise for many years, the accumulation of each year over and above the charges, together with increased subscriptions, donations; &c., would form a permanent fund applicable to this purpose, and render the claimants perfectly sure of their Pensions.

Any applicant after such period of time shall only be permitted to receive a policy at the option of the Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

4. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable, and to be paid by every Clergyman applying for a policy, according to his age at the date of his application:—

5. If any clergyman marry the second time, he shall pay the annual premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

6. Every Clergyman being a member of this Fund shall make and forward to the Secretary a yearly collection from every congregation in his Parish or Mission. Assistant Curates serving under a Rector or other Assistant Clergyman shall not, however, be required to make a collection, but shall pay only their own annual premium.

7. All premiums shall become due on the first day of January in each year, and must be paid within thirty days; and all congregational collections must be sent in before the first day of May. If this rule is not complied with, the policy shall be considered as forfeited, but may be regained at the option of the Committee, and upon such terms as they may prescribe.

8. Upon compliance with the above rules the Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay out of this Fund a yearly pension of \$140 to the widow of each Clergyman holding a policy during her widowhood.

9. If the widow die, or marry again, the pension shall be paid towards the support of such children of the deceased Clergyman as may be under the age of sixteen years (if boys), or eighteen years (if girls). In this case, when the children have attained these ages, the pension shall cease.

10. The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman shall be recognized by the Committee in the event of the death or marriage of his widow, and shall receive the pension to be applied by them for the support of the child or children, but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, or if Trustees should not have been named, then the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee, in the application of the pension.

11. If the wife die before the husband his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension under the limitation as to age expressed in rule 9.

12. If at any time the state of the Fund will permit, the Committee may increase the amount of pension to any sum not exceeding \$200; but such increase may be withdrawn if it cannot with safety be continued, and in any case the pension shall be of the same amount to all existing recipients.

13. Permanent removal of a Clergyman from this Diocese, except under special circumstances, to be sanctioned by the Bishop in writing and approved by the Committee, or degradation or suspension from Ministry, shall forfeit all claim upon this fund.

14. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly, on January 1st and July 1st in each year, and shall commence on the first of these days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a policy.

15. The Treasurer of the Diocesan Church Society shall be Treasurer of this Fund, and shall, from time to time, under the direction of the Committee, invest every hundred pounds of surplus money, and add same to the capital of the Fund. A yearly detailed statement of income, payments and invested money shall be published in the Annual Report of the Diocesan Church Society.

16. One of the Clergy shall be annually appointed at the meeting of the General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society, or the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society shall act as Secretary of this Fund and it shall be his duty to issue policies, receive premiums, donations and collections, which he shall hand to the Treasurer every quarter, oftener if required by him.

17. None of the above rules shall be altered except at the annual meeting of the General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at a full year's notice of the proposed change.
