Conclusion of our United States.—The New York Journal of Commerce publishes a complete summary of the statistics of commerce and navigation for the fiscal year ending on the 30th of June last. The foreign imports at all the ports of the United States (including Alaska, California and Oregon) for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1853, were \$211,232,599, against \$207,789,229, for the preceding year, showing a decrease of \$3,443,370.

**THE WHITE SEA SQUADRON.**

The steam corvette, Ariel, Commander John B. Lewis, departed from New York on the 20th ult., from the White Sea Squadron, and proceeded direct to the island of St. Peter, where she arrived on the 10th inst.

The Ariel left for the Gulf of Unga to relieve the Phoenix, which was anchored close to the monastery. Here a small boat was sent with a flag of truce to purchase provisions at the village of Lianka. The Russian soldiers requested her to approach, and she did so, but the boats were fired on.
