FINANCIAL WORLD ANOTHER DULL DAY IN THE MARKET

New York, March 18.—The heaviest declines in the stock market made itself manifest again today. The list sagged sharply at the opening but later made complete recoveries, and in many instances material gains.

Trading in the first hour was moderate and indicated that the short interest, emboldened by the seeming indifference of those committed to the bull side, had renewed operations for the decline.

Stocks recovered from their early weakness in the last hour when an extensive covering movement combined with what seemed to be excellent buying, worked a complete change throughout the list.

Many underlying conditions continue favorable. Exporters show auspicious increase and imports good declines, for the month of February and for the two first weeks of March.

These are all favorable existing factors. On the other side we have the monetary situation, tariff possibilities, and most recently, the attempt to throw Currency Reform into politics.
