Canadian, British and Foreign. [To the Associated Press.] New York, June 2. Gold 112; exchange steady. In Brooklyn, this morning, a woman named Devine killed her three young children, and dangerously wounded her husband with an axe.

There are about three hundred Presbyterian ministers and elders in town attending a meeting of the Kirk Synod and the Canada Presbyterian Assembly. Each body holds three sessions daily. The question of union will be finally discussed.
