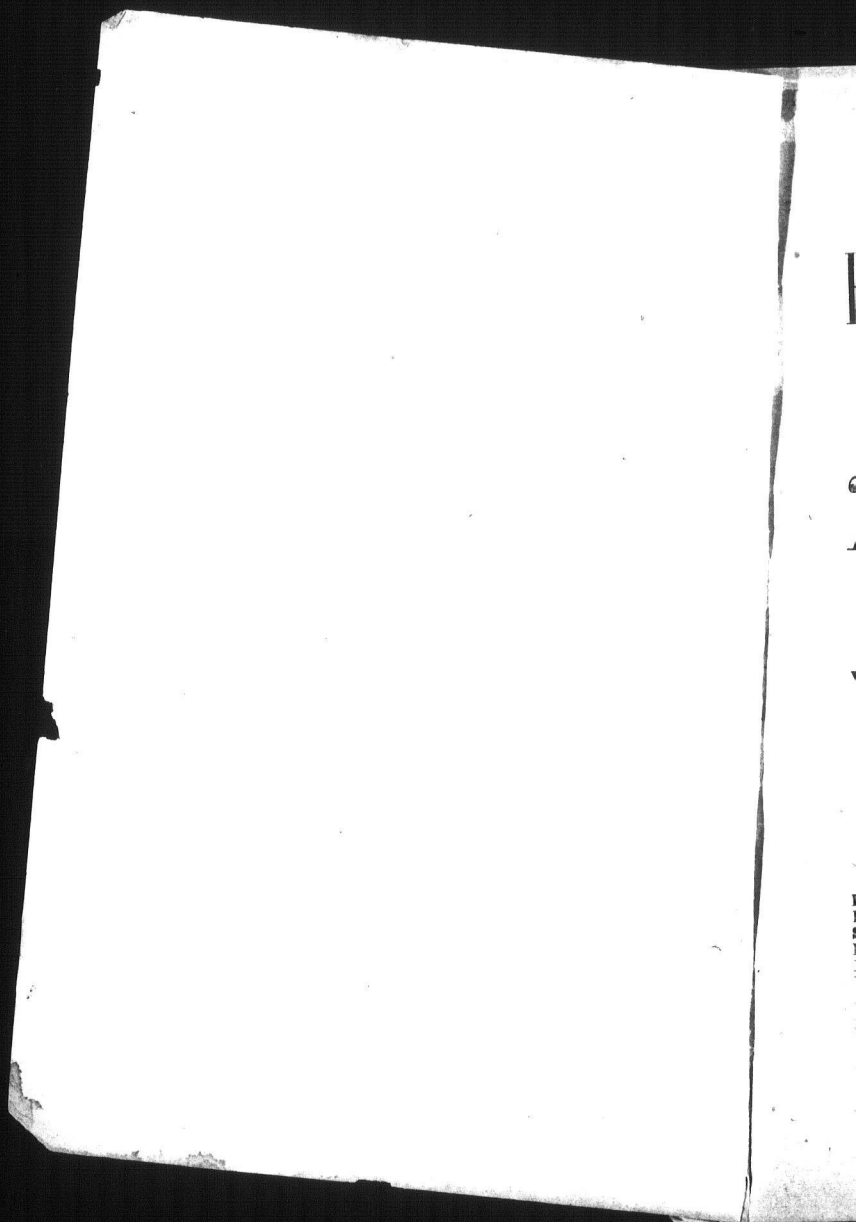

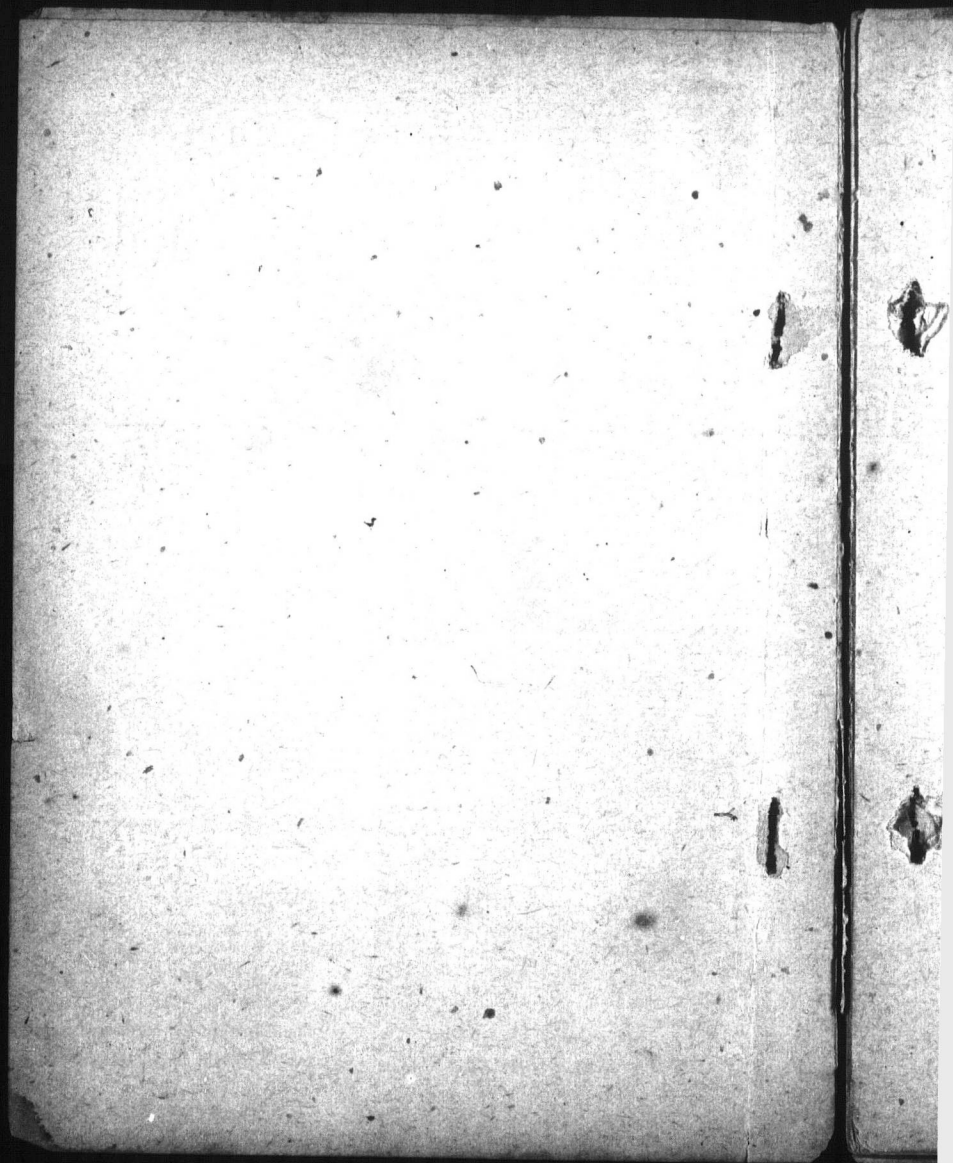

Report of Session for 1894.

DEAR BROTHERN:—Your Session in presenting their report for the year past, do so with grateful thanks to the giver of all mercies for His continued goodness to His people.

During the year we lost two valued members of the session, by the removal of Mr. J. B. Leslie, to Brampton and Mr. Wm. Jardine to Milton. In order to fill our ranks, depleted by constant removals during the past few years, we asked the congregations to add to our number, and the brethren elected to the Eldership are such as command the full confidence of the entire congregation.

The Public Services have been well attended, and your Pastor's heart has been gladdened by the numbers which listen to the preaching of the Gospel both at morning and evening service. The Bible Class, Sabbath School, and Prayer Meeting have been fairly well attended but the Sessions would urge upon our people to have all these specially in their hearts and minds and aid us by sending their children to their own Sunday school regularly, strengthening the Bible Class by their attendance and joining the weekly prayer-service either in their house, or in the Church so that we may be a spiritually united people. The Communion has been regularly observed with good attendances: in Feb. 235, in June 246, and October 235, partook. During the year 10 have been added by certificate, and 11 by profession. We have lost 4 by death, 5 have been certified to other congregations and by the renewal of the roll many who had a merely nominal connection with the congregation have not been transferred yet. We have an actual gain of 6 during the year, our total of active membership being 281 as against 275 of 1893.

We would express our sympathy with sorrowing friends for dear ones removed and voice our sense of the loss to our W. F. M. S. of our beloved sister, Miss

Wilson whom God has taken, and of Mr. S. McDowell, an Elder, who gave valuable help to the sessions at Communion seasons.

The Session would especially express its thanks to God that in spite of the stringency of the times, the Congregation by the aid of our Endeavor will be more than able to meet all the Missionary requirements of the year.

We would express our pleasure and appreciation of the faithfulness of those who lead in the service of praise and their unflinching attention to their duties.
