





BRANDON

BRANDON is situated on the south bank of the Assiniboine river, 132 miles west of Winnipeg, on Sections 23 and 24, chiefly Township 10, Range 19 west. It was first settled in 1881, and so rapid was its growth that it was incorporated as a city in 1882. Its progress since then has been steady and substantial, and it is now second to Winnipeg in size and importance.

Its Name

Both the city of Brandon and the Brandon House, the old fur trading post at the junction of the Little Souris and the Assiniboine, received their name from Brandon Hills, situated ten miles south of the city. The hills are said to have been named after Brandon Hills in Scotland by one of the early explorers, and they were known as the "blue hills of Brandon."

A Railway Centre

Brandon is the railway centre of Western Manitoba. From the east there is the Main line of the C. P. R.; from the south-east, the C. N. R.; from the south-west, the Souris branch of the C. P. R. and the Pipestone extension; from the west, the Main line of the C. P. R.; and, from the north-west, the G.N.W.C.

A Jobbing Centre


Owing to its central location Brandon is favorably situated as a distributing centre, and with increased railway facilities, together with additional large industries which are now situated in the city, the jobbing trade should largely increase.

An Industrial Centre

The position of Brandon is giving it a yearly increasing importance as an industrial centre. Already there are several mills on the banks of the Assiniboine, and with railways radiating to all parts of Western Manitoba, the number is sure to increase. The most

important industry in the city is that of the Hanbury Manufacturing Co., of which John Hanbury is president and manager. The logs are floated down from the tributaries of the Little Saskatchewan into the Assiniboine and to the mill. The Company keeps two or three hundred men in the woods all winter, and during the summer season runs its large mill night and day. In close proximity to the saw mill is the large, new planing mill and sash and door factory. This business is increasing in volume and importance every year. On the banks of the Assinibeine, too, is the flour and oatmeal mill of A. Kelly & Co. This mill has a firstclass modern equipment and its products are widely known for their high quality. A little to the west the Brandon Binder Twine Co., Limited, with the largest and most complete machinery in the Canadian west, is engaged in turning out hundreds of tons of twine and rope for the farmers of Manitoba and the North-West. The output this year is estimated at nearly 400 tons and the quality of twine manufactured is of the best. Prof. N. Wolverton, the president and manager, will be only too pleased to show through any who are interested. The number of hands employed are about 50, which will be increased later on as the factory is enlarged. A few blocks to the west is situated the large, new flour mill and elevator of Messrs. Alexander & Law Bros. which has only just been completed at a cost of \$60,000. This new mill is equipped with all modern machinery, the power being supplied by electricity generated from the Brandon Electric Light Co.'s dam on the Little Saskatchewan. Across the street the Brandon Machine Works Co. cover an entire block with what is now one of the most thriving and busiest industries in the west. From a small 'ndustry employing six hands it has grown to the proportions of a large foundry giving employment to 100 people Mr. Jas. Shirriff is the manager and his pushing energy will, no doubt, soon place this industry in the front rank of Canadian institutions. In addition to the above the Marble works of Somerville & Co. and Drysdale & Co. both deserve special mention. Empire Brewing Co., another growing institution, which with the large new brewery erected by the Brandon Brewing Co. will supply as fine a line of ale and beer as can be found in Canada.

The printing business is one of the most important in the city. One daily, three weeklies, one Friday and one Saturday paper are published. The chief employing firms are the Sun and the Times. The other important industries are the manufacture of soft drinks by the Brandon Brewing Co., the manufacture of cigars by P. B. H. Ramsay and Jas. Dillon.

A Trading Centre

The higher prices which can be obtained for farm produce in Brandon together with the lower prices at which all kinds of merchandise can be bought, have made Brandon the favorite commercial centre for the farmers of western Manitoba. The large departmental stores and the immense range of goods carried by them, show that the outside trade has assumed considerable proportions.

"The Wheat City"

In the early days Brandon was the greatest wheat market in the west and so was called the Wheat City. The railways constructed since then, with their elevators every tew miles, have rendered the amount of wheat delivered at Brandon very much smaller, but Brandon still remains in the centre of the great wheat growing portion of the province. In fact the provincial crop reports show that western Manitoba (of which Brandon is the centre) produces seventy-five per cent. of the wheat, roots and live stock of the whole province.

An Educational Centre

Brandon is the educational centre of Western Manitoba. The Third Class Normal school for Western Manitoba holds its session at Brandon annually, beginning in January. The city schools are unsurpassed in the province. Twenty-nine teachers are employed. The Collegiate Institute gives a good general training and prepares pupils for the different departmental examinations and entrance to the university and professional schools. Brandon College gives a thorough commercial and university training, and also fits pupils for the university and departmental examinations, Brandon is the meeting place of the Western Teachers' Association and the Central Parmers' Institute,



Experimental Farm

THE Brandon Experimental Farm was started in July, 1887, and the first crop was taken off in 1888. The farm consists of 700 acres, 80 acres of upland, 100 acres of side hill, the balance valley. The soil ranges from light sandy loam to gravelly loam and on to stiff clay.

The southern boundry is co-terminus with the Assiniboine river. It has a lake in the centre, abundant water and bluffs of timber for shelter. Abundance of spring water can be obtained from 15 to 20 feet from the surface.

The barn is 100×50 , with a ten foot basement. There are also a piggery, a poultry house and other suitable out-buildings. There are about five miles of avenue trees, and the nursery contains about 100,000 trees. Of the grains grown on the farm there are 75 varieties of oats; 50 of peas, 42 of wheat, 40 of barley and about 200 miscellaneous plots.

Oats yielded from 50 to 114 bushels per acre, wheat 19 to 45 bushels, peas 23 to 50 bushels, barley 35 to 68 bushels

There were 15,000 visitors last year, and 400 different lots of grain from 3 lbs. to 5 bushels were sold or distributed during the season.

There are about ten miles of road on the farm, two and a half of which are gravelled.

The superintendent, Mr. S. A. Bedford, has the fullest confidence and esteem of the farmers of the province, and is the most popular lecturer at Farmers' Institutes.


