

But, there is a fact sometimes not quite so much appreciated as it should be. The journalist is the most hard worked man in any calling; he has done more and is doing more for the average politician than is ever done for thim and, as a rule, his usefulness is gone just as soon as the men he has served have profited by his services. Day and night he works, generally unknown, sacrificing himself for the sake of party, building up men who soon forget that the promitmence they owe is due to the kindly spirit and fervent zeal of some writer superior in abblity and capacity to themselves. The Canadian journalist cannot hope for repose. He must work and work and work until the hand of death gives him the rest, which does not belong to the earth, and which under no other chroumstance he could expect. But the "average politician" is not a competent judge of these matters.
