Next Wednesday week, Feb. 7th, will be Nomination Day in this city, for the election of a Mayor and eight Councillors to serve for the term of two years, and also for the election of a Water Commissioner, whose term will expire three years hence.

The Council Board as at present constituted consists of Messrs. M. P. Hogan, C. E. Robertson, T. Z. Taylor, S. W. Crabbe, F. H. Beer, W. D. McKay, G. E. Hughes and D. L. Hooper.

These gentlemen, with Mayor Haviland at their head, have administered municipal affairs for the past two years, and bear the unique title of the "Reform" Council. No doubt all nine men will again be candidates.

While there are many questions which will engage the attention of our citizens during the campaign, that of sewerage will no doubt play the most prominent part. Although the question is one of paramount importance to any community, its discussion at the present juncture will, it appears to us, be the means of side tracking other matters, equally important, which should agitate the minds of our citizens until finally settled.
