Fearful Disaster in Philadelphia.

A terrible disaster occurred at the Blockley Almshouse on the 20th inst., caused by the walls of the Female Lanatic Asyum being undermined by workmen. It is reported that thirty or forty of the inmates were killed for wounded. Five bodies have been taken out thus far. The partition wall of the building was undermined by the workmen, who were making preparations for the introduction of new heaters, thus letting down all the floors clear to the roof.

The latest reliable accounts from the Blockley Almshouse says, eighteen insane women were killed, and 20 wounded. Therewere 229 lunatics in the asylum. The accident cocurred at 5.45 this morning. The building was supported by two immense arches, which gave way. The sitting room was filled with children. Sixteen bodies have already been taken out.
