VICTORIA, B. C., 6th May, 1880.

A Special Session of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia was held this evening at 8.30 o'clock, in the Odd Fellows' Hall, and was called to order by the Grand Master. Present:

The Grand Secretary reported a quorum present, whereupon the Grand Chaplain offered up prayer, and the Grand Lodge was declared open for special business.

The Grand Master stated the object of the Special Session, viz: "The refusal of the Grand Treasurer to pay an order drawn on him by the Grand Master, signed by the Grand Secretary, and under seal of the Grand Lodge, funds being in his hands," and explained his action and read the correspondence between himself and the Grand Treasurer.

The Grand Treasurer then gave his reasons for refusing to pay the order.

Moved by Rep. Gowen, P. G. M., of No. 1, "That the action of the Grand Master be endorsed in drawing the order on the Grand Treasurer." Seconded by Rep. Sehl, of No. 1.

On motion the question was ordered to be taken by ballot.

The Grand Master appointed Rep. Goode, of No. 4, and Rep. Partridge, of No. 1, as tellers.

22 votes cast. Yeas, 15; Nays, 7.

The resolution was then declared carried.

Moved by Rep. Goode, of No. 4, "That in the opinion of this Grand Lodge all appropriations made by the Committee on Finance and adopted by the Grand Lodge at its regular Annual Session, need not be referred to the Committee on Finance during recess before being paid." Seconded by Rep. Gowen, P.G.M., of No. 1, and carried.

Moved by Rep. Waller, of No. 2, "That the action of the Grand Master be endorsed in calling this Special Session." Seconded by Rep. Dale, of No. 1, and carried.

The Grand Treasurer asked permission to appeal the question to the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

Moved by Rep. Goodhue, of No. 2, "That the request be granted." Seconded by Rep. Goode, of No. 4, and carried.

Moved by Rep. Goodhue, of No. 2, "That \$20 mileage be paid the Representatives present from New Westminster Lodge, No. 3." Seconded by Rep. Goode, of No. 4, and carried.

Moved by Rep. Gowen, P.G.M., of No. 1, "That the correspondence in the question between the Grand Master and Grand Treasurer be referred to the Executive Committee

to decide what portions, if any, should be entered on the Records, and also the appeal to be sent to the Sovereign Grand Lodge." Seconded by Rep. Waller, of No. 2, and carried.

The business of the Special Session having been exhausted, the Grand Lodge was duly closed.

The Report of the Grand Master was then read, as follows:

VICTORIA, B. C., 14th February, 1881.

**BROTHERS AND REPRESENTATIVES.**—In the good providence of Almighty God whose blessings it ever becomes us to invoke, we are again permitted to meet in annual convocation to recite the history of the past, to legislate and counsel for the present, and thus, as far as possible, provide for a prosperous future.

This meeting should remind us that another year is past and gone, and that we are all nearer to that bourne whence no traveller returns; with another year's experience in the work of our Order.

I hope we are all in a better position to know its wants in this Jurisdiction, and that we meet here to-day firmly impressed with our duties and responsibilities of so noble and great an Institution.

The Sovereign Grand Lodge at its last session, I am glad to say, saw the necessity of repealing the Dormant Law. It appeared to give a great amount of unnecessary work to Secretaries of Subordinates without the corresponding results which it was intended to produce when passed, and we are now again working under the old principles.

The Order in this Jurisdiction not having progressed as much as many of its most ardent supporters would desire, a scheme will be laid before you for the inauguration of an Endowment Fund which will undoubtedly give an impetus to the Order in this Jurisdiction, and be a great benefit to widows and families of our deceased Brothers. I cordially recommend the same for your adoption.

I would also bring to your notice the unsatisfactory manner in which the Annual Password is forwarded to this jurisdiction, and would ask you to take some steps with regard to its future transmission, and ask that it be sent direct to the Grand Secretary.

The Petition you ordered to be sent to the Sovereign Grand Lodge, with regard to the remission of the Annual Tax, at our last regular communication was forwarded, but I am sorry to say it was not granted. Also the Sovereign Grand Lodge at its last session changed the work of the Order considerably, and this jurisdiction not having a Grand Representative present leaves us in a peculiar position with regard to it. We have tried several ways to procure the work for distribution here but have failed so far. It will, therefore, be necessary for you to make some provision for procuring the same.

I have received reports from my Deputies in Districts Nos. 1 and 2. District Deputy McColl, of No. 2 District has not yet reported, but from the Representatives present I find that some little business has been transacted by him.

From Bro. Anderson, of No. 1 District, whose report is handed in, I find he has had several questions forwarded to him for decision, and after carefully examining the same I am of opinion they are answered correctly, and therefore endorse them.

From District Deputy Bro. Brunten, of No. 3 District, only one question has been referred to him; the answer I endorse. His report contains several recommendations for his District and accompanies my report. I would also draw your attention to the letter addressed to Bro. Anderson, of No. 1 District, from a member of Dominion Lodge, without the sanction of that Lodge, as being irregular.

My official acts during the year I submit as follows, viz:

March 8th, Granted a dispensation to the three Lodges in this city to appear in public in regalia on the 11th inst. at the dedication of their new Hall on Douglas Street, and to hold a ball the same day in the name of the Order under the usual restrictions.

March 11th, By request and accompanied by the Right Worthy Grand Officers, I had the pleasure of conducting the dedicatory ceremony of the splendid Hall erected by the three Lodges in this city, which was largely attended by the Brotherhood, and which is a great credit to our Institution. Also, by invitation the Grand Officers attended the Ball given on the evening of the same day, which was also carried out successfully.

March 29th, I issued the usual annual proclamation to all the Lodges in this jurisdiction to celebrate the 26th April following.

March 30th, Granted a dispensation to New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, to hold a ball in the name of the Order on the 2nd April, and to appear in regalia at the same.

April 20, I instructed the Grand Secretary to issue notices to the Representatives in this jurisdiction calling them together for a Special Session of the Grand Lodge, to be held at Victoria on the 6th of May, on account of the Grand Treasurer refusing to pay an order which I had drawn on him.

April 26th, Received a communication from Victoria Lodge, No. 1, requesting that the appeal of Bro Robt. Foster against the action of that Lodge be decided at the Special Session to be held on the 6th of May. I answered the communication stating that it was not in my power to grant the request. (See Constitution on Special Sessions.)

May 6th, A Special Session of this R. W. Grand Lodge was held according to call on the evening of the above date. For particulars see minutes of same.

July 8th, Attended by the R. W. Grand Officers I proceeded to install the officers of Dominion Lodge, No. 4, when an objection was raised to the G. elect being installed, which was, that he had not served a sufficient number of nights as V. G. to entitle him to the office. On examination I found that the Brother had been duly installed and served a term as V. G. of the Lodge, (the Roll-call being imperfect as to his attendance.) I decided that the Brother having been installed and remained in possession of the chair as V. G. for the term, the Lodge not having declared the seat vacant as required by its Constitution, his attendance could not be taken into consideration, he having served a term as V. G., that having been duly elected he was entitled to be installed as Noble Grand. (See White's Digest, Sections 17, 46 and 1390A. Also the proceedings of the Grand Lodge of California 1854, pages 487, 521 and 536. Also Grand Lodge U. S. 1848, page 1290, also 1854, page 2215. Again see Digest of the years 1852, 53, 54 and 55, page 1, which have never been repealed.)

July 9th, Accompanied by the R. W. G. W. I proceeded to New Westminster and installed the officers of New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, the same evening. We were received with their usual courtesy, and after the Installation exemplified the work. This Lodge I found to be working harmoniously in the interest of the Order.

July 12th, Installed the Officers of Victoria Lodge, No. 1.

July 14th, Installed the Officers of Columbia Lodge, No. 2.

January 5th, 1881, Installed the Officers of Columbia Lodge, No. 2.

January 6th, 1881, Installed the Officers of Dominion Lodge, No. 4. The V. G. elect not being present and not a sufficient reason given for his absence, the Lodge wished to elect another Brother to the office which election was held under my supervision.

January 10th, 1881, Installed the Officers of Victoria Lodge, No. 1.

Although no new Lodges have been instituted during the past year, I think towns are springing up where Lodges could shortly be started with good chances of success.

Brothers, having reported all that I think is necessary the time will soon arrive when I shall be called upon to deliver up the trust which you have reposed in me during the past year; hoping that my official conduct will meet with your approval, and that wisdom and love for our Order may guide you in all your deliberations, I thank you for the kindness and courtesy extended to me, and remain,

My last Report of Membership shewed 509. The returns from Subordinates to 31st December last, give 499, thus making a loss of 10 members during the year.

The law regarding Dormant Members, I am glad to say, has been repealed by the Sovereign Grand Lodge, and the old law re-enacted of Brothers arrears to be declared in their several Lodges as ceased membership for non-payment of dues.

According to instructions received at last Session, I wrote to the District Deputy of No. 3, regarding returns and arrears from Black Diamond Lodge, No. 5, which was attended to by that Brother, and I am happy to say that this year the returns from all the Lodges have been received in good time and in good shape.

During recess, I received documents concerning an appeal against the action of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, in expelling Robt. Foster, and immediately handed the same to the Committee on Appeals.

In accordance with resolution, I prepared, on 19th July, a new Petition to the Sovereign Grand Lodge asking for remission of tax, until we have 10 Subordinate Lodges, which the Grand Master signed, and I forwarded, with I am sorry to say, no satisfactory result, as the Petition was not granted, and we now stand as owing the Sovereign Grand Lodge \$225, including the present year 1881.

During the year I received Amendments to the By-Laws of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, Columbia Lodge, No. 2, and New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, which I handed to the Chairman of Committee on Laws of Subordinates. The two former have been returned approved, the latter is still in the hands of the committee, having only been received a few days ago.

In the latter end of November I received a circular from the Grand Master regarding the change in the work, which necessitated sending for new books; this I did, and have now in stock 12 new Initiatory Charge Books and new Degree Books. These will be sent to the Subordinate Lodges as soon as we are in a position to instruct them in the new work itself, but up to the present time we are not in possession of it although strong efforts have been made to get the same. On the 27th November I wrote to Bro. Swan of Olympia, Grand Secretary of Grand Lodge of Washington Territory, to learn if they had the work. He immediately replied giving me the address of their Grand Representative (W. W. Evans, Seattle), and on 15th December (after consultation with the Grand Master and Grand Warden when it was agreed that I was to go across to Washington Territory and get the work; on my return the Grand Master would visit Nanaimo, and the Grand Warden New Westminster to instruct); I wrote to him with a view of carrying out this arrangement. I received a reply to the effect that he considered it illegal for me to impart the work to anyone outside the jurisdiction of his own Grand Lodge without a special commission from the Grand Sire. I wrote again to the Grand Representative Evans on the 22nd December, pointing out to him that I considered he was in error, that I believed he could instruct at request of the Grand Lodge without special commission. To this letter I have received a reply, and I believe the Grand Master also wrote about the same date and the letter has had the same fate. This is rather unfortunate, for had our requests been complied with, all our Subordinates would have been in possession

## AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Grand Lodge resumed its session at 3 P. M., and was called to order by the Grand Master.

Report from Committee on Appeals read as follows:

VICTORIA, B. C., 14th February, 1881.

TO THE R. W. GRAND LODGE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA:

DEAR SIRS AND BROTHERS,—Your Committee on Appeals beg leave to report that they have taken up the appeal of Bro. Robert Partridge, on behalf of Bro. Robt. Foster, against the action of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, upon charges preferred against the said Robt. Foster of being in a state of intoxication and of conduct unbecoming an Odd Fellow, and after due and careful consideration of the action of the Lodge, as well as the different grounds upon which an appeal was taken from the action of the Lodge, and have unanimously agreed that the action of Victoria Lodge in the premises be sustained.

The first ground of appeal, namely, that the decision of the Lodge was contrary to the weight of evidence cannot be sustained, the evidence being nearly all to the contrary.

The second ground of appeal, namely, that no judgment of the Lodge was taken as to the sufficiency of the exceptions, neither were the exceptions determined according to their merits, or in any way, neither was the report of the Committee sustained or rejected prior to the penalty being affixed, is in our opinion the only ground worth considering by the Grand Lodge.

With respect to this second ground of appeal your Committee are of opinion that the action of Victoria Lodge in reading the report of the Trial Committee, together with the evidence taken, and the exceptions to the report of the Committee sent in by the appellant, and voting to accept the report of Trial Committee as it stood, was actually and virtually fulfilling the action required by the Constitution of Subordinates. Sec. 4, Article VII. be equal to an expressed conviction before passing sentence.

The third ground of appeal being only an abridged repetition of the second requires no further consideration.

Your Committee, therefore, beg leave to recommend that the appeal of Bro. Robt. Foster against the action of Victoria Lodge be not sustained.

As your Committee were not placed in funds for this purpose, they deemed it advisable to refer the matter to the Grand Lodge for such action as they may see fit. The Committee consider the offer of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, a very fair one, there being some 1400 volumes in their possession.
