On Saturday night the Moorish Pacha at Casablanca was advised that troops would be landed the next day. He gave assurances that the eit--would remain calm. At 5 o'clock Sunday morning a detachment French marines, in command of an ensign, landed in the city. This force had hardly passed thru

the water gate before it received a volley fired at point blank range from a detachment of regular Moorish troops. Five marines and the ensign were wounded.

The ensign was shot thru both hands. In spite of his injuries he ordered his men to fix bayonets and charge. This the Frenchmen did, and in the fighting 150 Moors lost their lives.

The marines continued their way, clearing the ground of the enemy as they went, until they reached the French consulate, where the French citizens in Casablanca had taken refuge. The other European residents had sought safety at their respective
