Albany, N. Y., Sept. 14.—What appears to the authorities of Albany as a murder and suicide occurred early this morning on the Troy road, just outside of Albany. The dead body of Michael J. 

REV. J. W. KIERSTEAD IN EVERY DAY CLUB

"Liquor and the Man" Subject of an Interesting Descourse Last Evening.

To prove that the use of liquor lessens man's efficiency, Rev. J. W. Keirstead gave strong evidence in his address at the Every Day Club last evening. The late
J. E. Price, of the Intercolonial Railway
had told him that a man's efficiency as a trainman decreased in proportion to his use of intoxicating liquors. Mr. Hays, of the Grand Trunk, he was informed, had issued orders that men who indulged habitually in the use of liquor, were no to be employed. The regulations of the C. P. R. declared that no employe should drink while on duty, nor a man be employed if he drank to excess when off

duty.

The late Kilgour Shives, of Campbellton had told the speaker that owners of saw-mills suffered much loss through mills bemills suffered much loss through mills being shut down because enough men did not return after a spree, or because inefficient men had to take the place of skilled men, and not only sometimes destroy good lumber, but expose the mill-owner to the risk of damages for accident. Moreover, a hotel keeper had told him that as soon as his bar-tenders began to drink he discharged them.

Mr. Keirstead's argument was based on John Stuart Mill's statement, that a bargain which is not advantageous to all the parties concerned was not honorable, but was a fraud and a robbery, and the application was made to the liquor traffic, which was not advantageous to the customer.

Granting this to be true, said the speaker, could any honorable Christian man witness the fraud and robbery, and say it was none of his business? Emphatically no; but it was the duty of every honorable citizen to do all in his power to destroy the traffic. Nor could a province or a municipality justify itself in accepting money to legalize a traffic which cursed society.

Mr. Keirstead was heard with deep in terest by an audience that filled the hall. WILL OUR GLACIERS DISAPPEAR?

Glaciers, it is well known, are always either advancing or retreating. On the whole, says a scientific authority, they lose more than they gain, and there are even prophets who predict their total disappearance. A number of test measurements were taken on the Oberland in 1907, and the results have now been published. The heaviest loss, we learn, was sustained by the Elger glacier, shorn of no less than sixty-seven metres of ice. The Upper Grindelwald glacier, during the same period, dwindled by sixty-three metres, that of the Wildhorn by twelve metres, and the lower Aar glacier by seven metres. The gains to be set against these losses are those of the Lower Grindelwald glacier (fourteen metres), the Gamsschi glacier (fourteen metres), the Stein glacier and the Kanderfirn (half a metre each). It can be domonstrated by mathematics that the net loss in the cases observed amounts to exactly '119 metres.







THE "TIME" TO DRINK

"Steadily man has been forced to the conclusion that for economic reasons he can't afford to drink," writes George C. Lawrence in Appleton's.
