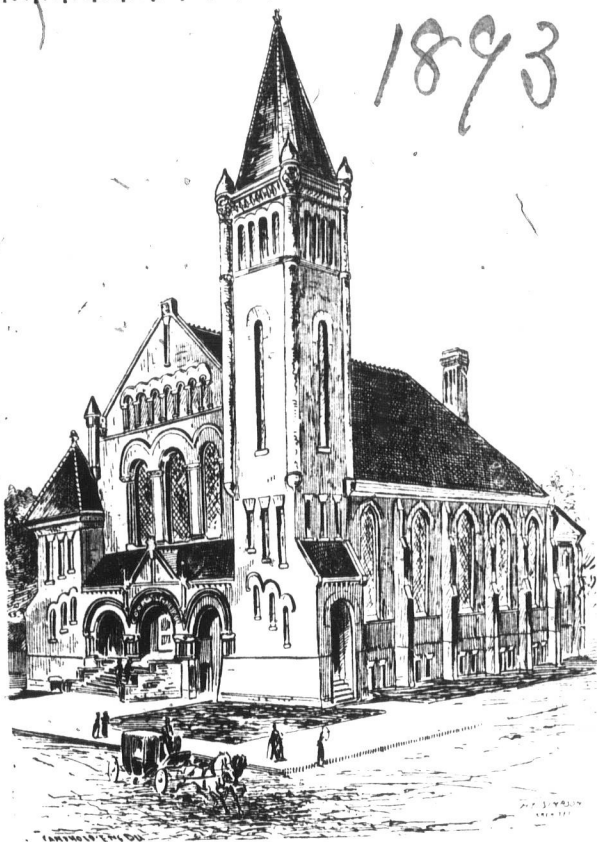

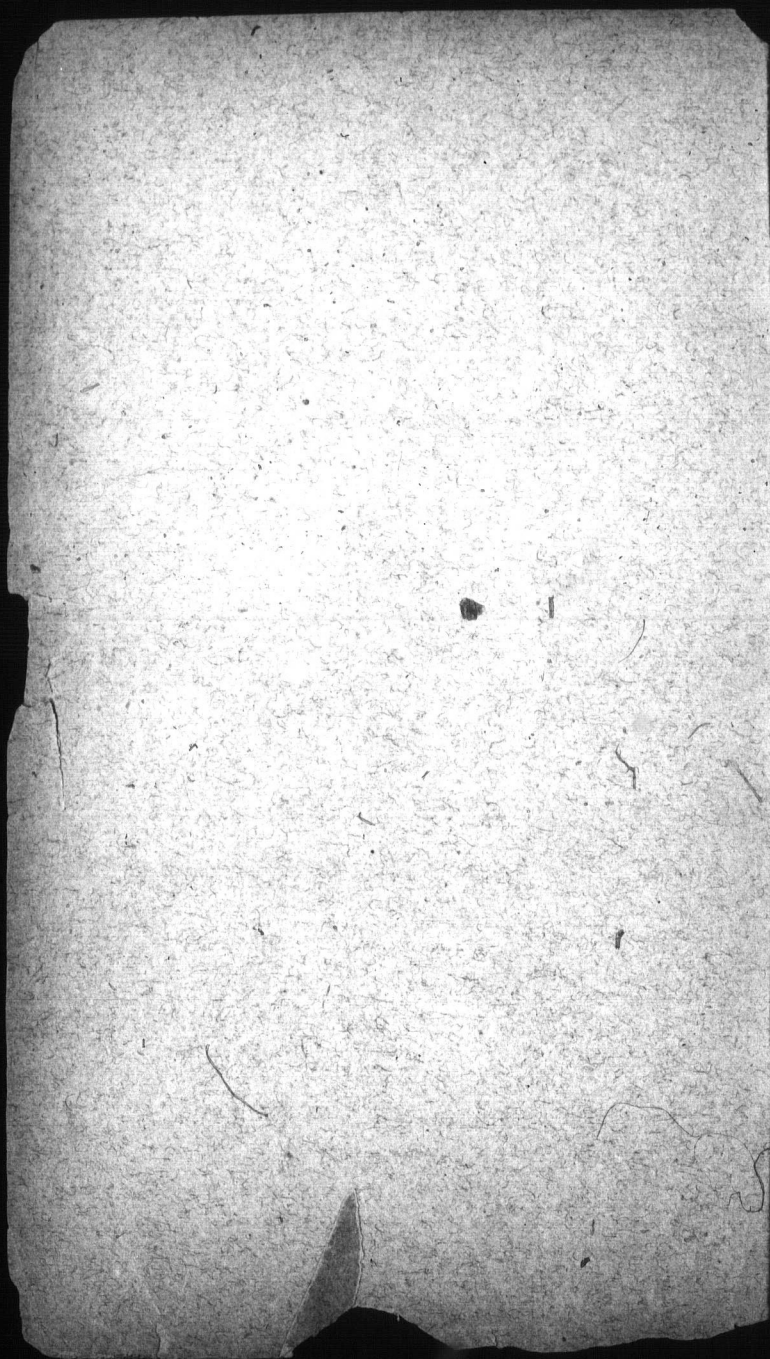

A Few Words from the Pastor.

To the Members and Adherents of Cooke's Church :—

At the close of a year during which, as a congregation we have prospered, it is fitting that we give praise and thanks to Almighty God for His presence and guidance.

By a careful examination of the Treasurer's Statement it will be found that apart from the ordinary running expenses of the congregation, between two and three thousand dollars have been expended in paying off the balance of contracts and in reducing the church debt. The total amount raised from all sources in the congregation during 1893, was \$12,543.94. This is very encouraging in view of the depression felt in every section of the community, particularly by those who have been thrown out of employment. Let us, therefore, realizing that it is "Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, saith the Lord of hosts" be encouraged by our success in the past, "go forward," striving for greater things in the future, resting assured that if we honor the Lord with our substance He will bless us. "It is more blessed," says Christ, "to give, than to receive."

The report of every Society connected with the church contains encouraging words, and all the organizations are in a prosperous condition. Let me ask you to give them your warm and hearty support, for they are all doing a good work.

From the Session report it may be seen that thirty-four of our members and adherents have been removed by death. I have had the privilege of visiting nearly all of them during their last illness, and of seeing some of them pass away from the earthly tabernacle to the house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. These death-bed scenes have been triumphant and glorious, and have shewn to me more and more the power of the gospel of Jesus Christ to take the sting from death, to bind up the broken-hearted, and to turn sorrow into joy.

Seventy-nine Certificates of Disjunction have been granted to members removing to different parts of the Province, to Manitoba, and to the United States. From many of these we have received cheery letters, in which the writers have expressed thanks to God for the blessings they received while members of our congregation. They also assured us that they are doing what they can for the cause of the Lord, and to hasten the coming of His kingdom.

One hundred and twenty-five persons united with us during the year by Profession of Faith, and one hundred and twenty-seven by Certificate. Nearly all of those who joined us by certificate came from congregations outside of Toronto.

Owing to the depression in trade and lack of employment a number of our people left the city some time ago without applying for their Certificates of Church Membership. Not knowing where they are, the Session have removed their names from the roll, and they will not, therefore, appear in this year's report.

The Lord owned and greatly blessed the preaching of His word during the year. Many who at the beginning were in the bondage of sin, are now rejoicing in the freedom and liberty of the people of God. The faith of many has been strengthened, and they have become more active in the service of their Master.

Mr. Frank Forster, one of our young men studying for the ministry, was for some time at Manitoba College, Winnipeg. Last summer he did splendid work at Kemnay, a mission-field about seven miles from Brandon. I had the pleasure of visiting him last May and was delighted to hear him spoken of in the highest terms not only by those to whom he preached, but by all who knew him. He was in Toronto for a few months in the fall, but is now in Calgary Presbytery, doing mission work, and still prosecuting his studies.

The following extract, taken from a communication of recent date, will be read with interest, giving as it does a brief account of the work being done by the other young men from our congregation who are in Manitoba:

"It is a pleasure to know that the influence of Cooke's Church is not confined to Toronto. Her young men,

through God's sovereign grace, are being led into spheres of usefulness far from home and kindred. Her Western workers seem united in those far-reaching words which stretch with equal power from another day to our own, 'The Lord hath done great things for us whereof we are glad.'

"Mr. Wm. Chestnut has been for some time a missionary in Manitoba. Since his ordination he has been stationed at Penrith as ordained missionary. So great has been God's blessing upon the work there, that when his resignation was tendered recently to both his congregation and Presbytery, the unanimous voice of both compelled him to remain.

"Mr. A. McIver spent from 1890 to 1893 in Manitoba. His first charge was at Penrith where the effects of 'the wee Scotchman who told us the truth,' are still seen in the lives of the community. During the past summer he was missionary on the Estevan Railway construction amongst the rough laborers who ply their way west through necessity. God has wonderfully blessed his work. He is now Secretary of the Y.M.C.A. in Stratford.

"Mr. S. Lundie is one of our most successful workers. He went to Manitoba in July, 1892, and attended classes in Manitoba College last winter. During the season just closed Mr. Lundie was missionary at Bird's Hill, Man., and was known as 'The missionary who said what he thought.' He was sent to Bird's Hill on the earnest appeal of a unanimous congregation, and he has by no means betrayed the confidence reposed in him by the church.

"Mr. R. C. Pollock went west with Mr. Lundie. Last winter was spent in college, and with the first breath of spring he left the college corridors for the heaviest field in the Regina Presbytery. His mission, 60 x 30 miles, was 62 miles from any railway station. His work was greatly blessed.

"Mr. John Hobman left Toronto in November, 1892, to face the storms of the coldest winter Manitoba has experienced for fifteen years. From the elders of his congregation we have the cheerful news that the past year has been productive of deep spiritual improvement. Mr. Hobman is now at Manitoba College, and is taking a lively interest in the aggressive Christian work of that Institution.

"Mr. Lyman Thompson has been in Manitoba since August. In October he enrolled as a student of Manitoba College. We trust his voice will be often heard there in defence of those principles which he lived.

"Thus our young men are combined in the cause of righteousness and truth. May their influence widen and deepen with advancing years."

At Knox College and Toronto University nine of our young men are studying and preparing for the ministry. They are Messrs. Wm Johnston, R. Pogue, P. W. Anderson, T. Eakin, G. Scott, M. McLellan, L. McLean, D. Robertson, and W. Beattie. Most of these young men were in mission-fields during the summer, and did excellent work. Mr. R. Pogue assisted us in the congregation during the past summer. We all appreciate highly his efficient work, which was owned and blessed by the Lord.

Mr. Wm. Rennie, who spent more than a year in Japan, is now studying at the Collegiate Institute, Parkdale with a view to the ministry. He walks from Swansea regularly to attend our services.

Mr. A. Barclay is engaged in missionary work at Waubesa, Ontario, and is doing well.

Miss McIntosh is teaching a school in one of the Indian Reserves in the North-West, and doing missionary work amongst the Indians.

Mr. Gabriel Maguire is still in Africa, and speaks in his letters most encouragingly of the mission work in which he is engaged.

Many of our young people are actively engaged in visiting the hospitals, teaching in various missions, distributing tracts, etc. From this it will be seen that the influence of our congregation is far-reaching, extending to the lands across the sea. These facts are very encouraging, and to God we give praise and thanks for all He has done for us and by us as a congregation. "Not unto us, Lord, not unto us, but to Thyself be the glory," for without Thee we could do nothing.

Now, brethren, would it not be grand if every one of us were actively engaged in Christian work? If we could only realize that God has a work for each of us to do. How

Session Report, 1893.

It is with feelings of gratitude to the Great King and Head of the Church, that we are again permitted to submit to the congregation our Annual Report for 1893.

As a Session we have great reason to thank God for his goodness to us. While some of our members have been unable for a time to meet with God's people in the sanctuary, and others have had to pass through the deep waters of affliction, yet He has kindly spared our lives.

We wish to rejoice especially on account of the many who were enabled by the grace of God to leave the paths of sin and join the ranks of the Lord's army, through the faithful preaching of our beloved Pastor.

It is also gratifying to note the increased attendance at the Sabbath services, especially the evening one, the church being taxed to its utmost capacity to accommodate the crowds who come to hear the Gospel, and which gives our Pastor increased facilities for sowing the good seed of the Word.

During the summer months, Mr. Pogue, one of our members was engaged as assistant to our Pastor; his labors were

much appreciated by the members of the congregation, and especially during our Pastor's absence in his native land, his visitations among the people were much enjoyed.

Trustees Report.

IN submitting the Annual Statement for the year 1893, the Trustees desire to acknowledge the manifold blessings received from our Heavenly Father. We desire to thank all the members and adherents for their liberality in enabling us to meet current liabilities, and also materially reducing the indebtedness of the Church. The general prosperity that has been ours exceeds any previous year (except when Building Fund Subscriptions were raised), and we are exceedingly pleased to report an increase in offerings and collections of \$1300. In view of the large number attending our services we are of the opinion that these two principal

sources of revenue can be still further increased without any great effort or sacrifice being made. Our membership of 1184 is encouraging, and from this large congregation, we should have at least 600 contributors by envelope, and an average giving of 25 cents per week from each, would be \$150 per Sabbath, or the sum of \$7,800 per year through offerings by envelopes. At the evening service the average congregation will exceed 2000 persons, and it would be only reasonable to expect that 1500 of these would place an offering on the collection plate of 5 cents each, amounting to \$75.00 per Sabbath, or \$3,900 per year, thus realizing the magnificent sum of \$11,700.

The expenditure for the year has been considerable, owing to the fact that a large number of unsettled accounts from the preceding year were paid off, but with a due regard to economy and an increase by weekly offerings, the year which we are entering upon should close with a reduced liability of at least \$5000. The Trustees would urge an increase to the roll of contributors by weekly offerings, and suggest to those withdrawing from Church membership to notify the Treasurer so that their names may not constantly appear in arrears.

Sabbath School Report.

ANOTHER year has passed away, and the earnest labors of our Officers and Teachers have been completed so far as the year is concerned, and anything done cannot be undone, and any duty neglected cannot be now performed. We believe our teachers have faithfully tried to perform their duties, but the order in the School is not yet up to the standard which we desire, and we again urge upon the parents of our scholars to more frequently visit the school, so as to form an opinion of the duties performed by the teachers, and as

sist in getting that order and decorum which is becoming in a school conducted in the Lord's House on the Lord's Day.

We have eight officers, thirty-one teachers, and 707 scholars at the end of the year, being an increase of seven scholars over the previous year. The largest attendance, 526, was on the 17th of February, and the smallest attendance, 201, on the 20th of August last, while the average was 397.

We still continue to pay for the support of a cot in the Sick Childrens' Hospital, and have paid \$100.00 therefor, and a pupil at Pointe-aux-Trembles School costing \$50. We have besides contributed \$23.50 to help furnish a church at the Village of Morris in the Province of Manitoba, as well as helping Mr. Bone's Mission at the Welland Canal.

The Infant Class again sent their birthday offering to the Sick Childrens' Hospital, which was conveyed to the Hospital by a Committee from the class.

As intimated in the last Annual Report, a written examination was conducted at the beginning of 1893 on the previous year's lessons for the Intermediate Classes, and an oral one for the Infant Class, and several of the competitors ranked high in the examination.

Attached hereto is a summary of the Treasurer's account of money received and expended in connection with the school during the past year.

We had the pleasure of listening to Dr. Daniel Clark, of the Asylum, on two occasions, in the lecture room. Our own Pastor also gave two very interesting and instructive lectures, one on "Scotland," the other on "The North West." Several "At Homes" were also given and a Sacred Concert by the Choir of the Church. A collection is taken up at all the meetings and the proceeds go to the Church Furnishing Funds.

The meetings of the Society are held in the Church Parlor on the second Tuesday of each month at 3 o'clock.

As a Society we thank the ladies of the congregation who have assisted us by the monthly contributions in envelopes, still we would like to have many more contributors. ANOTHER year has quickly passed and again we, Christian Endeavorers, look back on our work in the Master's service with grateful hearts for the many blessings bestowed upon us as a Society from the Great Commander and Leader. We *sow* often where we do not *reap*, but work done cannot be measured by apparent results.

Our Society, this year as formerly, has lost many of its members through various causes, such as removal from the city, etc., but we know that they have been strengthened and better fitted for work in other fields while attending our Church and Endeavor, and we would wish it to be so, for in this way our influence widens, and we know not how much good the reading of even a verse in the Lord's name may do. But looking at our progress in another light, namely, visible results, we have every reason to be thankful. There are at present 184 Active Members, and 115 Associate Members, making a total of 299 members, which is an increase of 26 within a year. Average attendance of members for the year is 130, and we are always encouraged and glad to see strangers—the Social Committee arranging that they are each and all made welcome, believing that a cordial greeting, a warm hand clasp, a kind word may be, never is lost if given in the true spirit. The average number of members taking part in the meeting is 40, which is not as large an average as we would desire, and efforts are being made by the Prayer Meeting Committee to get all active members to fulfil their pledge in this respect.

Special consecration services and missionary meetings are held monthly as usual, at the latter \$57.78 was devoted to missions, and one collection every month is given to the Building Fund of the Church.

One marked feature in the work of this year, is the strong temperance spirit which has been displayed by our members. The Temperance Committee did noble work in assisting in the recent Prohibition Campaign, and are continuing to work inside and out of the Society. Two hundred and thirteen have been spoken to on the subject of signing the pledge, with but two refusals. Temperance tracts have been purchased for distribution outside of the Society, to whom they might prove helpful.

Within the year 4000 tracts and 100 booklets were distributed to occupants in the tract district, and where possible given a helping hand by the distributor. Our flower mission work has been abundantly blessed in cheering the sick ones in the congregation and hospital on Sunday afternoons.
