



An Act to repeal certain Parts of an Act, passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America; and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province.



hereas an At was patted in the Preamble.

Fourteenth Bear of the Reign of his present Wajethy, intituled, An Act 14 Gro. III, for making more effectual Provision cited. 83, 16 for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America: And where as the said At is in many Respects

inapplicable to the present Condition and Circumstances of the said Province: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that surther Provision should now be made for the good Government and Prosperity thereof: Way it therefore please Your most Excellent Pajesty that it may

be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Ercellent Wajelly, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this peckent Parliament allembled, and by the Authority So much effec of the same, That so much of the said At as in any Manner relates to the Appointment of a Council for the Affairs of the faid Province of Quebec, or to the Power given by the said At to the said Council, or to the major Part of them, to make Ordinances for the Peace, Welfare, and good Government of the faid Pzovince, with the Confent of Dis Wajesty's Governoz, Lieutenant Go= vernoz, or Commander in Chief for the Time being. thall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Within each of the intended Provinces a Legislative Council and Aftembly to be corffi. tuted, by whole Advice His Majesty may make Laws for the Government of the Province.

II. And whereas his Wajethy has been pleased to signify, by Dis Wessage to both Bouses of Parliament, His Royal Intention to divide his Province of Quebec into Two separate Provinces, to be called The Province of Upper Canada, and The Province of Lower Canada: be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid. That there shall be within each of the faid Provinces respectively a Legislative Council, and an Assembly, to be severally composed and constituted in the Manner herein-after described: and that in each of the faid Provinces respectively his Dajelty, his beirs or Successors, hall have Power, during the Continuance of this Att, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of fuch Provinces respedively, to make Laws for the Peace. Melfare, and good Government thereof, such Laws not being repugnant to this Ad; and that all such Laws. being passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly of either of the faid Provinces respectively, and assented to by Dis Majetty, Dis Beirs or Successors, or assented to in Dis Wajesty's Wame, by such Person as His Wajesty. his beirs or Successors, shall from Time to Time anpoint to be the Governoz, or Lieutenant Governoz, of such Province, or by fuch Person as his Waselty, his beirg or Successors, thall from Time to Time appoint to administer the Government within the same, shall be. and the same are hereby declared to be, by virtue of and under the Authority of this Aft, valid and binding to all
