Railway Freight Rates.

The Board of Railway Commissioners has decided to grant a hearing to the Railway Association of Canada respecting an application for an increase of freight rates over the existing tariff to the extent of 30 per cent.

"Shall Canadian freight rates be increased generally for the particular purpose of enabling the Canadian National system to meet its operating expenses and fixed charges, or would it be better to go on with the present rates, giving dealers no additional excuse for increasing the cost of living and trusting to increase in business, the economies it should be possible to effect by co-ordination, and the return of normal conditions to gradually reduce these deficits until the day (which I personally feel is not far off) when the revenue will prove sufficient to pay for operation and, later, also to take care of fixed charges?"

"The earnings of the Canadian Railways last year were 350 millions, made up as follows: C. P. R., 177 millions; Canadian National, 94; G. T. R., 68; G. T. P., 11."

"A 25 per cent increase on these earnings would approximate \$88,000,000, the greatest part of which would be earned in Canada. Whether we shall take 88 millions in increased freight rates out of the people of the country next year in order to show a surplus for the National system is a question as to which I myself am not prepared to take the responsibility of deciding either one way or the other at the present time."

Winnipeg advices of July 18th say: Farmers of Canada will be enriched to the extent of about \$35,000,000 when the Canadian Wheat Board begins, Thursday or Friday, to pay at the rate of 30 cents a bushel for all outstanding participation certificates...

The yacht race for the America's cup is now on at New York. The first of the contests between the "Resolute," the New York defender and "Shamrock" IV, Sir Thomas Lipton's challenger, took place on Thursday last.

Eugenie, former Empress of France, died a few days ago at the home of her nephew the Duke of Alba in Spain. She was over ninety years of age, and at the time of her death had just been visiting her nephew.

Allies Reiterate

BLUNT WARNING.

Spa, Belgium, July 16.—The German delegates at the conference here have agreed in principle with the terms submitted to them by the Allies as to Germany's delivery of coal, but will ask for the explanation of certain articles in the Allied notes. They made this announcement just before entering into conference with the Allied ministers here this afternoon.

Spa, Belgium, July 16.—Having exhausted every diplomatic resource in an effort to obtain a reduction in the amount of coal demanded by the Allies, the German delegation was expected to accept the ultimatum requiring delivery of 2,000,000 tons monthly when the conference reconvened at the Villa Frainseuse late today.

Germany must deliver a total of 6,000,000 tons of coal to the Allies by October 1, under penalty of having Allied troops occupy the Ruhr or any other district, the latest Allied note set forth.

The German Government will, beginning August 1, deliver two millions tons of coal monthly for a period of six months.

The value of this coal will be credited against the German reparations obligations at the German market price. A premium of five gold marks per ton will be allowed on certain classes and qualities of coal.

The measures of control provided in the agreement drawn up July 11 will be applied, as shown in an annex to this document.

In the near future an agreement shall be made regarding distribution of Upper Silesian coal by a mixed Allied commission. As soon as possible a commission will be established in Essen on which Germany will be represented, to provide a standard of living for miners in regard to food and clothing, with a view to improving coal production.

The Allied Governments are ready to grant Germany, during the six months period, an advance payment amounting to the difference between the price paid, according to Article Two of this document and the export price, f. o. b., German ports and the English export price, f. o. b., English harbors.

Areaage of Wheat

Ottawa, July 16.—The acreage sown to wheat, including fall wheat, in all Canada, is now estimated at 17,186,300 acres, which compares with 19,125,968 acres, the final estimate for 1919, and represents a decrease of ten per cent. Spring wheat, according to the estimate of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, occupies this year 16,446,000 acres, or 11 per cent. less than last year. Fall wheat acreage this year is 740,300 acres, an increase of ten per cent. over last year.

per cent. over last year. Acreage in oats has increased 4 per cent. from 14,952,114 to 15,555,400 acres. Barley is sown on 2,558,000 acres or two per cent. less than last year; rye 729,500 acres, or 3 per cent. less; peas, 2,588,000 acres, a decrease of 3 per cent; mixed grains 309,350 acres, an increase of 1 per cent; hay and clover, 10,409 acres decrease 2 per cent; alfalfa, 229,300 acres, increase 1 per cent. The acreage in potatoes is 819,000 acres, practically the same as last year. Three prairie provinces have an estimated area sown to wheat of 15,771,000 acres against 17,750,167 last year, a decrease of ten per cent. Manitoba has 2,687,000 against 2,880,301 last year; Saskatchewan, 9,440,000 acres against 10,587,363; Alberta, 3,644,000 acres against 4,282,386 acres last year. The estimate from the Bureau of Statistics says: "Upon the whole, the conditions of field crops at the end of June is very favorable, timely rains having fallen in the prairie provinces during the critical period of growth. Expressed numerically in percentage of the decennial average 1910-19 the conditions for the whole of Canada on June 30, with the corresponding condition for 1919 in brackets, is as follows: Fall wheat, 17 (102); spring wheat, 100 (90); oats, 100 (87); barley, 98 (91); rye, 98 (97); peas, 96 (92); mixed grain, 99 (91); hay and clover, 88 (92); alfalfa, 95 (96); pastures 97 (100); potatoes, 93 (95)."

"A telegram from the Saskatchewan Department of Agriculture stated that the general crop conditions in the province are fair, rain, however, being urgently needed to ensure the anticipated crop."
