REPORT, &c.

February 11, 1841, (the second Thursday in February) being the day appointed for the Anniversary Meeting of the "Church Society of the Archdeaconry of New Brunswick," on the preceding day, viz., Wednesday, February 10, the Clergy and Lay Deputies assembled in General Committee, in the National School House, after Divine Service in Christ's Church, Fredericton.

Read the Account of William J. Bedell, Esq., the Treasurer, made up to February 1st. instant, showing a balance in his hands of £215 4s. 7d.

Read Mr. Bedell's Account of the Funds set apart for "Missionary Visits," shewing that the amount of that Fund is £571, of which £549 is at interest on endorsed notes.

Read the Secretary's Account of the Distribution of 638 Prayer Books, and 214 Testaments, imported in 1840, from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

Read a List of the Books now in the hands of the Secretary, remaining from the importations of 1839 and 1840, of the value of £34 5s. 4d., Currency.

Read Reports from the following Local Committees :

Woodstock. The Committee report that the subscriptions amount to £39 10s., of which only £34 10s. has yet been collected and paid in, including £2 4s. 10d. for Books sold. The Committee transmit a series of Resolutions, thanking the Society for making the County of Carleton the first route of one of the Travelling Missionaries, the benefits of which have already been felt. They also recommend appropriations for "Books," and aid in erecting a Tower to the new Church at Richmond.

Kingston. The Committee report collections to the amount of £21 11s., of which the sum of £1 is limited to "Missionary Visits," 3s. 9d. to "Schools," and 6s. 6d. to "Books." This amount was remitted by the Rev. W. E. Scovil, together with £2 9s. 4d. for Books sold. The Committee recommend a grant for a Lending Library for the Parish of Kingston.

Springfield. The Committee report collections to the amount of £13 18s. 6d., and request a grant for a Lending Library for the Parish.

Sussex. The Committee report a collection of £13 14s., in the Parishes of Sussex and Studholm, and one of £2 15s. 7½d. at Butternut Ridge : of which the sum of £8 is limited to "Missionary Visits," £4 to "Books," and the remainder to "Churches." This amount includes £1 12s. for Books sold for the Society. They recommend "Missionary Visits" to this part of King's County, during the present year.

St. Andrew's. The Committee report a collection of £26, and, in a series of Resolutions, recommend aid to building a new Church at Chamcork, in the Parish of St. Andrew's.

Chatham. The Committee report a collection of £21 7s. 10d., of which the sum of £11 14s. 4d. is limited to "Missionary Visits," £1 12s. 6d. to "Divinity Scholarships," 3s. 6d. to "Schools," 12s. 6d. to "Books," and 2s. 6d. to "Churches."

Glenelg. The Committee report a collection of £9 13s. 10d., of which the sum of £1 4s. is limited to "Missionary

Visits," 4s. to "Divinity Scholarships," £1 7s. to "Schools," 10s. 6d. to "Books," and 7s. to "Churches." They recommend aid to the enlargement of the Parish Church.

Bathurst. The Committee report a collection of £17 10s., all limited to "Churches," and state that the Church in the Parish of New Bandon, for which a grant has been made by the Society, will be finished in the month of August next.

Shediac. The Committee report a collection of £5 13s., and recommend an increase of the Lending Library of the Parish.

Sackville. The Committee report a collection of £6.

Gagetown. The Committee report a collection of £8 11s. 3d., and the proceeds of the sale of some Books, amounting to £1 13s. 3d.; of this the sum of £2 8s. 9d. is limited to "Books."

St. Stephen's. The Committee report a collection of £17 8s., and recommend a grant of Books to the Sunday School.

St. Patrick's. The Committee report a collection of £8 15s. 6d., of which the sum of £4 0s. 6d. is limited to "Missionary Visits," and £4 2s. 6d. to "Schools." They recommend aid to the establishment of a Lending Library.

Carleton. The Secretary reports a collection of £10 8s., and the proceeds of the sale of some Books, amounting to £5 15s. 1d., and solicits another grant in aid of a second enlargement of the Parish Church.

Douglas. The Committee report a collection of £8 8s. 9d., and request a supply of Books.

Hampton. The Committee report a collection of £6 5s., and £1 3s. 9d. for the sale of some Books. They request aid to enlarging the Lending Library.

Norton. The Committee report a collection of £4 10s. 9d., of which the sum of 18s. is limited to "Books," and 7s. 6d. to "Missionary Visits." They request aid in forming a Lending Library.

Waterborough. The Committee report a collection of £3 5s. 9d.

Andover & Grand Falls. The Rev. J. S. Thomsom reports a collection of £3 17s. 6d. for "Missionary Visits."

Resolved, That such sum be taken from the collections for "General Purposes," as will make up with the collections limited to that object, the sum of £100; the same to be added to the fund for "Missionary Visits;" and that the sum of not exceeding £150 be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee for "Missionary Visits to neglected places," for the ensuing year.

Resolved, That the sum of £150 be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee for the "Building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels," and that it be an instruction to the Com-

mitted to comply with the recommendations of the several Local Committees.

Resolved, That such sum as will purchase a Bill of Exchange for £50, Sterling, be transmitted to the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, for a supply of Prayer Books and Testaments; and such further sum as will purchase another Bill for £60, Sterling, be also transmitted for a supply of Books, and Tracts suitable for Distribution, Libraries, and Schools.

The Rev. H. N. Arnold addressed the Archdeacon as follows:

"It is my painful duty to make known through you to our Brethren of the Clergy, and our friends of the Laity, intelligence received by me last evening, that the oldest, and may I not add, one of the most useful, of the Clergy, the Rev. Elias Scovil, late Rector of Kingston, is no more! He finished his earthly course yesterday morning at 5 o'clock. I am persuaded that our friends of the Laity, with whom, in their hours of sorrow and affliction, we are so often called to participate, will sympathize with us in the loss which the Church has thus sustained, in the death of our

venerable Brother. I therefore beg to move the following Resolution:

'That this Meeting has learned with much sorrow the tidings of the death of a venerable and respected Clergyman, the Rev. Elias Scovil, late Rector of Kingston, and that whilst they bow in humble submission to the wise disposal of the Almighty, in the bereavement which the Church has been called to sustain, they desire to acknowledge the solemnity of the warning which it teaches, both to Clergy and Laity, that whatsoever our hand findeth to do in the duties of our several stations, we do it with all our might, reminded that the season for discharging the duties of life glides rapidly away from us, and that the night cometh when no man can work.' And further,

'That feeling, as we desire to feel, our utter inability to accomplish anything in the ways of religion without Divine assistance, therefore both Clergy and People add to all other means which they are using for promoting the advancement of religion, and the spiritual welfare of our fellow-beings, their diligent and unceasing prayers, that the Almighty would prosper all their undertakings for the advancement of his glory, and the good of his Church, and that the great Lord of the harvest would send forth more labourers into his harvest.'"

These resolutions having been put from the Chair, were carried unanimously.

Read the following Letter from the Hon. the Chief Justice, and the Hon. Mr. Justice Botsford, addressed to the Archdeacon:

Fredericton, Feb. 11, 1841.

"Dear Sir,

"We regret very much that a press of business in the Supreme Court, will prevent our attending the Meeting of the Church Society this day. Every year's experience adds strength to our conviction of the importance of this Society to the cause of Religion, in exciting and combining the exertions of Churchmen, for the maintenance and spreading of the Church throughout the Province, especially in these times, when the Colonial Churches must look for their existence in a great measure to their own resources, and our interest in the Society increases with our conviction of its importance.

Read the Minutes of Meetings of the Executive Committee.

The Archdeacon then addressed the Meeting, and read Extracts from Letters from the Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia, with reference to the proceedings of the Executive Committee in the business of the Visiting Missionary. Thereupon, it was

Resolved, That a Resolution passed Feb. 10, 1837, and recorded at page 49 of the Minutes, be expunged, and that it be *Resolved*, in lieu thereof, that no part of the funds raised by the Society be applied to the payment of any Travelling Missionaries, for any Missionary Visits, except such as shall be performed under the direction of the Lord Bishop or Archdeacon.

Resolved, That all Accounts of Travelling Missionaries shall be recommended by the Lord Bishop, or, in his absence, by the Archdeacon, previously to their being submitted to the Executive Committee for payment.

It was then moved and seconded, that the suggestions of the Lord Bishop, with respect to the payment of the actual expences attending the charitable visits of resident Missionaries to destitute places, out of the limits of their own districts, under the direction of the Bishop or Archdeacon, be complied with. Upon a division the same was carried in the negative.

John Ambrose Street, Esq., thereupon gave the following notice of a motion to be made at the next Anniversary Meeting, viz., That in future the following shall be considered one of the objects embraced by the Society, viz., the payment of the expences of Resident Missionaries, in making charitable visits to destitute places out of the limits of their respective districts, under the direction of the Lord Bishop or Archdeacon.

Read certain Resolutions proposed by the Rev. Dr. Alley, at the Anniversary Meeting in 1839: In reply to the Rev. Dr. Alley, the Archdeacon stated that the Lord Bishop had not yet expressed his sentiments with respect to them, and undertook again to submit them to his Lordship.

Resolved, That all future grants by this Society for any purpose, may be re-appropriated as the Society shall think fit, if not claimed within three years from the date of the respective grants.

Resolved, That in future the Treasurer's Accounts do shew the state of the different funds appropriated to the different objects embraced by the Society.

Resolved, That the Hon. The Master of the Rolls be added to the Vice Presidents of the Society.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Society be given to William J. Bedell, Esq., for his services as Treasurer during the past year. William J. Bedell, Esq., was re-elected Treasurer.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Society be given to the Rev. Frederick Coster, for his services as Secretary during the past year.

The Archdeacon stated that the Rev. A. D. Campbell had, with the consent of the Lord Bishop, relinquished his appointment of Travelling Missionary, without having visited the County of Carleton, agreeably to the arrangements made at the last Meeting: and repeated some observations made to him by his Lordship upon the proceedings of the last two Meetings of this Committee. Thereupon, it was

Resolved, That the Committee are satisfied that the direction of the Travelling Missionaries ought to be left wholly to the Ecclesiastical authorities.

They think it reasonable, however, that each Travelling Missionary, whose expences shall be paid by the Church Society, should be required to keep a journal of his proceedings, to be presented, when called for, to the Archdeacon, in order that the Society may have the means of being certified that the object of its appropriations for this purpose is in a due degree obtained: and they hope and believe that the Bishop, in the behalf of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, will never appoint to the office of Travelling Missionary (so as to put a charge upon the funds of the Church Society,) any clergyman who shall not declare himself friendly to the Church Society, and determined to use his influence for promoting its objects and increasing its means of usefulness; nor retain any clergyman in such employment at their expence, after he shall have manifested an unwillingness so to do.

That the Rev. J. S. Thomson having been appointed a Travelling Missionary by the Lord Bishop, the Committee undertake to pay such expences as the Archdeacon shall report to have been incurred by Mr. Thomson, previous to the next General Meeting.
