CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

There is the usual tapering off in the lumber demand that comes with the approach of the end of the year, but favorable weather has kept business more active than usual at this season and consumption has been fairly heavy. Indications point to some buying in a retail way during the winter months, as very few dealers have on hand a sufficient stock of lumber to carry them through the winter. The feeling as to the spring trade is somewhat optimistic, although it is a little early to venture a prediction. The improvement in the British market is being felt on this side, prices for export stock having advanced slightly. Twelve inch boards in long lengths are being held about \$1 higher than in the early fall. Very little contracting for next season's production has taken place, but the report comes from Ottawa that the manufacturers there are in favor of asking an advance upon the prices which were obtained one year ago. Hemlock prices are steady and would probably advance but for the competition from Southern pine. Mill prices on pine shingles are from five to ten cents higher than two weeks ago, while lath is also firmer. No. 1 hemlock lath has followed the lead of pine and is now quoted at \$2.10 at the mill.

NEW BRUNSWICK AND NOVA SCOTIA.

The spruce situation continues to show improvement, although trade is quiet. There is a great scarcity of certain sizes and grades in New York, and some of the Canadian mills have booked considerable orders for export to that city as well as to Boston. The water mills are mostly closed down and the steam winter mills will not be running much before January. Nothing is being done in respect to British trade, but the opinion prevails that there will be an advance in prices as soon as buyers begin to figure on their requirements for next season.

There is no change in New Brunswick shingles, but spruce lath has declined in price as the result of heavy shipments. The New Brunswick product is worth about \$2.10 at St. John and American product, \$2.35, which is a decline of about 15 cents.

UNITED STATES.

There are some indications that the lumber demand is settling down to a winter basis, but there are so many buildings still to be completed that the call for finishing material is considerable. The trade as a whole is in a very satisfactory condition and a heavy demand is anticipated after the turn of the year. With large crops of corn, oats and cotton, and little less than an average yield of wheat, the purchasing power of the farmer is greater than it has been for years, and this is expected to be the foundation for a period of industrial activity which will extend at least through the coming year.

Buffalo dealers report a material increase in the number of inquiries for white pine lumber. In many cases the buyers are anticipating their early spring requirements, as there is some probability of a shortage in the supply before the opening of navigation next spring. Some of the Chicago dealers have now lists making such advances as were necessary to bring their prices more in line with those at the producing centres. The new list issued by the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association has stimulated rather than checked the demand, it being regarded as substantial evidence of the trend of the market.

From New York, Buffalo and Boston come reports of a liberal call for hardwoods. The strongest feature is plain oak, but there is also an excellent demand for birch. Rough maple and maple flooring are moving to some extent, the latter being in good demand for factory purposes.

The scarcity of lath is an indication of the amount of building which has been in progress. No. 1 white pine have been

sold in Chicago during the past week as high as \$4. Spruce lath is much more plentiful and is selling in the Boston market at \$3.25 for 1 3/4 inch and \$3 for 1 1/2 inch.

GREAT BRITAIN.

This week we are advised that severe weather has interfered with trade in the United Kingdom, but notwithstanding business has been quite satisfactory. Confidence is gradually returning. The cotton industry has revived, manufacturers are now able to obtain their supply of raw cotton at a very reasonable price, and the outlook for that branch of trade is much brighter. This in turn has benefited the lumber trade. Some wholesale dealers are showing a disposition to defer purchases of lumber for next season until after Christmas, but others are of the opinion that there will be an advantage in purchasing at present prices, as any change in quotations is likely to be in the direction of an improvement. The London pine market is showing a decided firmness. Retail dealers who have been holding off have thought it wise to begin to replenish their somewhat depleted stocks and all the good lots of lumber have been quickly taken. Spruce is also very strong, and as stocks are gradually becoming reduced, the tendency of prices seems likely to be upward.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

William Jamieson is again operating this winter near Bloomfield Station, N.B., and expects to take out about 700,000 feet of logs.

L. J. Howe, Acting Deputy Commissioner of Provincial Lands for Manitoba, has invited tenders for a permit to cut timber on Berths Nos. 21 and 23 in that province.

L. J. Tweedie, Acting Surveyor General, Fredericton, N.B., will offer for sale on December 14 a two square mile timber berth, situate on the Albert Settlement road, Westmoreland County.

The Department of the Interior, Ottawa, are asking for tenders up to January 4th, 1905, for a permit to cut timber on Berth No. 1195, in the Province of Manitoba. The limit contains about six square miles.

The Sprague Lumber Company, of Winnipeg, have closed down their mill for the winter, after having cut about 9,000,000 feet of lumber. The company are operating quite extensively in the woods this winter.

THE BARBADOS MARKET.

Messrs. S. P. Muirson, Son & Company report as follows regarding the Barbados lumber market:

The schooner "Clara" from Mahone Bay, N. S., arrived during the fortnight with 100,000 feet of Spruce, which had been placed some time ago at \$21.50 for shipping, and \$16.50 for second quality, but we understand that this is rather short of the quantity sold, and although there is still another cargo on the way which is also provided for, we can report our market as slightly stronger, and value next arrival at about \$21.50 for shipping. In white pine, we note a sale of 129,000 feet ex "Virginia" via Martinique, which being represented to be a very fine cargo of all merchantable, secured a purchaser at \$26.13, but proving on delivery to have a large portion of refuse, an allowance of \$5, instead of the customary \$4, was made on this. Dealers are now fairly well supplied, and we must look for lower prices for next receipts.

The only arrival of shingles consists of 757 bundles of Red Cedar Laying ex "Orinoco," which failed to secure a purchaser, and have been stored by consignees along with others of same description by previous steamers. Owing to the very dry weather the demand for all kinds of shingles has been very slack, and although there is only a very small stock of Gaspe in the market, we do not think better prices than those last arrived would be obtained for next arrivals, unless quality is very superior. Cedar Laying are in fair supply and dealers' ideas have been much depressed by the report of two cargoes now on the way.

Since the above was compiled the "G. S. Troop" has arrived from Liverpool, N.S., with 75,000 feet of white pine, 18,000 spruce, and 9,000 hemlock, which has been sold at \$25.66 merchantable and \$20.06 second quality white pine, 22.06 for spruce, and \$19.06 for hemlock.

BIRCH PLANKS.

Among the side lines of the timber trade, birch deals occupy a humble though useful place. The birch of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia takes kindly to stain and some hundreds of standards are cut up annually by chair and couch manufacturers to masquerade as walnut or mahogany finished suites. To the tip-plate box trade birch deals are well-nigh indispensable, and the consumption from this source is also large. As a general rule there is no difficulty about supplies, and stocks are usually more of an incubus than otherwise. At the present time, however, buyers appear to have been caught napping, and, with short supplies, prices are up to close upon £8 c.i.f. At Liverpool the stock is within unusually small compass, and enquiries are numerous. In the Bristol Channel district, where these goods are largely bought, there is reported to be hardly a deal in first hands. The jump in the price of this—the cheapest hardwood—will be keenly felt by consumers, who have for so long been accustomed to cheap and regular supplies.—Timber Trades Journal, London, Eng.

BUSINESS NOTES.

W. F. Lawrence, planing mill, etc., Maple Creek, N.W.T., is asking for an extension of time.

The assignment is announced of Rohm & Strohm, carrying on business as lumber merchants at Caron, N.W.T. A meeting of the creditors will be held at the office of William Grayson, solicitor, Moose Jaw, on December 20.

The H. Herrmann Lumber Company, of New York, advise us that they have secured the property at East 125th street and Harlem river on a long leasehold, and will remove one of their down-town yards to the new premises on February 1, 1905. They will erect a modern factory and dry kilns for the manufacture of all kinds of woodwork, trim and dimension stock for the furniture and organ trade, etc. At their Broome street and East River yards they are at present carrying 5,000,000 feet of hardwoods.

The excelsior mill of Stephen Bros., at Windsor Junction, N.S., was burned last week. The loss is \$5,000 there being no insurance.

The Rat Portage Lumber Company have again suffered from fire, their sash and door warehouse at Brandon, Man., being completely destroyed last month. The loss will be upwards of \$15,000.

The saw mill of J. D. Sowerby & Company at Oak Bay, Que., was destroyed by fire recently. The mill was being operated by John and Richard Sowerby, sons of the late J. D. Sowerby. It is understood they will rebuild.

The barque Valona, loaded by D. & J. Ritchie & Company, sailed from Chatham, N.B., on November 26, being the last lumber laden vessel from Miramichi for this season. The total shipments from that port for 1904 are as follows:

The total shipments of lumber for the season 1904 were about 94,000,000 sup. ft., as compared with about 100,000,000 last year.

NEW BRUNSWICK LETTER.

(Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN.)

ST. JOHN, N. B., Dec. 1st, 1904.—The coming of winter has brought the beginning of a season of quiet in manufacturing circles in this section that will probably last at least until March 1st next, and it will be April 20th before the mills are all running at their full capacity. The freezing of the coves and booms wherein the logs are kept, which has taken place quite early this year, has already caused a cessation of operations at six mills and several others will close down during the next few days. To saw all winter a manufacturer must have logs piled in the wharves (which does not freeze), but in only two or three cases has this been done

this year, and then with no important quantity. In spite of the fact that such a large quantity of logs was cut last winter on the St. John, such difficulty was experienced in rafting at Fredericton and in driving farther up the river, that at no time during the season was there any surplus worth mentioning in the immediate vicinity of St. John and immediately available. There is now, it is estimated, in the vicinity of 30,000,000 feet of all marks of logs in or near the booms at Fredericton. The first of these will not be rafted to any great extent before mid-May. The stocks of logs in St. John are small and are nearly all frozen in and will not be available before mid-April, hence there will be comparatively little done in a manufacturing way before that time. This is very disappointing to the mill-owners generally, who, earlier this year, were looking forward to a long manufacturing season next year.

Reports from the camps in all districts tell of ideal logging weather and conditions. In up-river districts there has been just enough snow for yarding purposes. In the lower counties there has been no snow as yet, but the swamps have been frozen hard for several weeks past and all other conditions tend to make a successful season.

Since last writing the only change in price of New Brunswick products is in that of spruce lath, which has dropped from \$2.30 to \$2.10, f.o.b., St. John. American product laths are quoted at \$2.35

as against \$2.55 a few weeks ago. The improvement in price of a month ago caused a heavy increase in the volume of shipments. The market was too sensitive to bear up under these offerings, hence the slump mentioned above.

An advance in freight rates to American ports has occurred since last writing. Charters for long lumber are now being made to Boston at \$2.50 per M and to New York at \$3.50.

TIMBER LIMIT TRANSACTIONS.

W. H. Parsons, of New York, who owns the controlling interest in the Bay Shore Lumber Company, which recently bought the timber limits, mill and property of C. M. Howick & Company at Great Salmon River, N. B., is reported to have sold his interest in this property to David S. Cowles, of New York, and Hon. F. C. Whitehouse, of Topsham. The latter gentleman has for many years been the head of the Bowdoin Paper Company.

WANT REDUCTION IN STUMPAGE.

It is understood that a movement is on foot to petition the Ontario Government to reduce the stumpage charge on pine timber. It will be remembered that at the last sale of timber limits new regulations were imposed fixing the stumpage charge at \$2 per thousand feet on saw logs and five cents per cubic foot on board timber, as compared with a former charge of \$1.25

and 2 1/2 cents. It is contended by many lumbermen that the new rate is too high, and the Government will be asked to lower it.

THE OUTLOOK FOR LUMBER.

In reviewing the white pine lumber market, the Mississippi Valley Lumberman comments on the outlook as follows:

The condition of lumber stocks everywhere and in all hands is one which assures strong prices at the very outset of the new year. The amount of lumber in the hands of the retailers was never so small as it is at the present time. This has been brought about through the conservative policy adhered to by the dealers. They have bought stock during the past season in small quantities to meet the current demands of their customers. There is, therefore, practically no lumber in the country. The manufacturers have succeeded in disposing of their cut unusually close to the saw and their stocks on hand at the present time are small and badly broken. There are some large individual stocks, but in the aggregate the amount of lumber now on hand is considerably below what it was a year ago. The mills have followed a policy of curtailment in their cut and the entire amount of white pine manufactured during 1904 is the lightest in many years. There is, therefore, a very limited supply of white pine on hand to meet the demand which is sure to come at the opening of the year.

The wealth of the country is perhaps

the strongest feature in the present situation. Prices for farm products have attained the highest average level in ten years. Among certain grains, they are higher than ever before. This era of high prices comes at a time when the crops are not small and when there is an abundant yield of everything except wheat. The corn crop is the largest in the history of the country and it is selling at prices indicative of scarcity rather than abundance. Live stock prices have been gaining ground. There is an advance in values for all the commodities which enter into commerce. In connection with the crop situation it must be noted that the aggregate crop this year is 7.7 per cent. greater than that of a year ago, and this crop will sell for higher prices than have been realized in many years. It is the most profitable crop the farmer ever harvested in the United States. Manufacturers who submitted their views of the situation at the recent meeting of the price list committee of the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association all concurred in the belief that the present situation was strong upon the basis of the very high degree of prosperity throughout the country. On the conditions of the stocks, the light supply of lumber and the wealth of the country they, without exception, re-

garded a higher plane of values for white pine to be a logical outcome of the situation. It is, therefore, quite probable that the early months of the new year will witness an advancing list in all items of white pine. One thing is certain, that the present list will be the unyielding basis of values after the first of the year.
