## PROVIN(XIAL EXHIBITION

## RULES AND REGULAATIONS.

The following Rules and Regulations are published for the information and guidance of intending exhibiters, and a strict compliance therewith will be required:-

1. The Exhibition will be open for Live Stock, Agricultural, Horticultural, Domestic and Dairy products, Manufactures of all kinds, Minerals and Arts.
2. Animals may be Provincial Bred or Imported, but must be the property of a resident of the Province, and if Imported, musi have been the property of the exhibiter for at least three months.

3 Agricultural, Horticultural, Domestic and Dairy products, Manufastures, Minerals, and other articles, must be the growth, product, or manufacture of New Brunswick, to be eligible for a money prize; other articles may be exhibited, and if considered worthy, recommended for honorary mention, or a Diploma may be granted.

## ENTRIES.

4. All entries must be made on printed forms, which may be obtained from the Secretary for Agriculture, and the Secretaries of the several Agricultural Societies, free of charge, on application by mail or otherwise. These forms are to be filled up by reference to the classification and numbers in the Premium List, signed by the exhibiter, and forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture at Fredericton, not later than the 15 th of September next.

5 . Tickets in accordance with the entries will be furnished to exhibiters, who are required to attach the same to the article exhibited, and allow it to remain so attached during the Exhibition. Exhibiters are requested to label their articles with the name of the same, and any information desirable to be made public. They may put their own name on the article in ary way they please.
6. Exhibiters are particularly requested to take notice, that entries should be made not later than September 20th, in order to allow time for carrying out the various details. Entries not sent in by the above date may be receired conditionally until the Saturday before the Exhibition, and will be allotted such space as may be vacant, after this day no entries will be received. It is intended to publish list of entries for the information of the Judges and the public, and ouly those sent in early can appear in such list.
7. In the classes of Blood Horses and Pure Bred Ca.tle, full Pedigrees, properly certified, must accompany the entry. No animals will be allowed to compete as pure bred, unless tho possess regular Stud or Herd Book Pedigrees, and satisfactory evidence be prodnced that they are directly descended from such stock.
The English, American. or Canadian Stnd Pooks, and the English, American, Canadian and New Brunswick Herd Books, shall be the standard authority or evidence of purity of blood.
8. Exhibiters of Pure Bred Stock are required to register the Pedigree of the Animal in the Provincial Herd Book, if not already entered in one of the Merd Books, previous to Exhibition, a certificate of which must accompany the entry, and in all cases where this is not done, other satisfactory evidence must be furnished of the purity of said stock. Legard will be had to blood as established by pedigree, symmetry, size, and general characteristics, of the several breeds or races of animals, and the Judges will make due allowance for age and other circumstances, which may seem to them proper.
9. Exhibiters must come prepared to have their horses and cattle led into the ring, when directed to do so by the Superintendent of the grounds, precisely at the time specified; all animals not so brought forward, will be ruled out of competion.
10. Exhibiters of Pure Bred Sheep, Pigs and Ponltry, are required to fils certificates at the time of entry, clearly showing to the Judges, that the animals specified therein are from reliable breeders and exhibiters of such stock in Europe or America, or descended from stock (it Provincial Bied) accompanied with pedigree of the same; the names of the breeders to be inserted, also that of the exhibiter.
11. In the Live Stock Classes, the entry must in every instance be made in the name of the bona ficle owner, and muless this rule is observed no premiunn will be awarded or paid.
12. In all other Classes, entries must be made in the name of the producers or manufacturers only.
13. Manufacturers are reqnested to furnish with their article exhibited, the quantity they can produce or supply, and the price, for the information of the Judges, whose decision will be based on the combination of quality, style, and price. and the adaptation of the article to the purpose or purposes for which it is intended No person shall be allowed to enter for exhibition. more than one specimen in any Section of a Class unless the adoitional article be of a distin : named variety or pattern from the first. This rule is not to apply to animals, bnt to all kinds of grain, vegetable products, fruit, manufactured articles, etc., in which each additional specimen would necessarily be precisely similar to the first

15. All Agricultural and Horticultural products must be the growth of the present year. Mamfactured articles or Works of Art which have been awarded prizes at any previous Provincial Exhibition, shall not be entered in competition for the prizes named in the prize list, but may be awarded diplomas, or honorary mention if, in the opinion of the Judges, such articles are snperior to any other exhibited, end are deemed worthy of the same.
16. Exhibiters of machinery and other heavy articles, are requested to have the articles on the grounds, if possible, a week before the Ex. hibition opens. Lighter articles may be received until the Saturday previous to the Exhibiticn.
17. Exhibiters should ie particular to see that the proper entry cards, as mentioned in the ith Rule, are attached to each article, and should there be any onnission or error, procure others at the office
18. Articles not accompanmed by the owners, may be addressed to the care of the Secretary for Agriculture, who will receive them (if within the time specified for the delivery of such articles as above mentioned, and place them in the building, but in no case will they be opencd or piaced on exhibition, unless written authority is forwarded to do so at the same time.
19. Exhibiters on arriving with their articles, will apply at the office for information as to where their articles are to be placed.
20. Exhibiters will, at all times, give the necessary personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibition, and at the close of the show, take eutirc charge of the same.
21. Nothing will be allowed to be removed from the premises until the close of the Exbibition except live stock, which may be removed at 4 o'clock P M, on Friday
22. While crery precantion. under the circumstances, to ensure the safety of articles sant to the Exbibition will be taken, yet it is to be distinctly understood, that the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them; but should any article be accidently injured, lost, or stolen. the officers will sive all the assistance in their power towards the recovery of the same, but will not make any payment for the valuc thereof.

23 . Arrangements will be made with the proprietors of the river steamers and railroads, for the conveyance of animals and articles to and from the lixhibition, either by refund of freights paid or otherwise, as may hereafter be arraged, the particulars of which arrangement will be duly made public

## ADMISSION TO BUILDINGS ANI) YARD.

24. The entry tickets upon animals or articles will admit the person: bringing them to the Yard or Building, along with such animals or articles, without the use of any other tieket Afterwards such parties must be provided with proper a amission tiekets.
25. Necessary attendants upon stock and articles belonging to exhibiters will be furnished with admission tickets, with their names written upon them, which ticket will be good at the entranee only, mentioned on the ticket, during the Exhibition. Any person trans ererring such tickets to other persons will forfeit all privileges conferred by it, and the doorkeeper will retain the tieket.
26. Exhibiters will be furnished with a season ticket to the Building and Show Yard on the payment of one dollar. The exhibiter's neme will be written on the ticket. and it will be good at the exhibiter's entrance only; any other person presenting this tieket will be refused admittance, and the ticket forfeited The doorkeeper will sec that this rule is rigidly enforced.
27. Admission tickets to the public will be issued on Tuesday. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of the Exhibition week, at 25 cents each. Each tieket good for one admission; children under 14 years of age, 12 cents. Carriages to the yard 50 cents, cach occupant, exeept the driver, to be provided with the usual admission ticket.

## JUDGFS AND THEIR DUTIES.

28. The Judges will be appointed, and will recaive a circular informing them of the fact, and inviting them to act.
29. The fudges are invited to report themselves at the office, presenting their eircular of appointment, on or beforc 10 o'cloek, A. M., on the day of opening.
30. Judges not reporting their presence at the Business Office by 2 o'elock, P. .II, will be considered absent and their places will be supplicd.
31. The Judges will meet at the Office on the day of opening at 2 o'elock, P. M., to make arrangements for entering upon their several duties, and will then be furnished wita Books containing the number of entries in each elass. Judges are expeeted to specially report upon the class for which they are appointed, noting sueh things as are worthy of notice, as well as the general charaeter of the elass.

32, No person shall act as a Judge in any elass in which he may be all exhibiter.

33 The Judges shall award only such prizes as the animal or article may be deserving of in any class or seetion of a elass, or micy, if the animal or article is unworthy, withold the prize altogether.
34. Judges will be expected to give diligent attention to their daties, and hand in their avards at the office as soon as possible. n that the list may be prepared preparatory to paying the premiums.
35. In addition to the stated premiums offered for artieles enumerated in the list, the Judges will have the power to award discretionary prizes for such articlez, not enumezated, as they may consider worthy, and the amount of such prize will be subsequently determined. The Judges may also distinguish sueh animals or artieles as they eonsider deserving of notiee, but which have not receivad prizes, by tickets with the words "Highly Commended," or "Cominended," upon them. These tickets will not eniitle the holder to any payment.

36 In the Fine Arts and Mechanieai Departments, Diplomas will be awarded, in addition to the money prizes, to any specimen evincing great skill in its production, or deemed otherwise worthy of such distinetion, on its being recommended by the Judges and approved of.
37. In the absence of competition in any of the Classes, or if the stock or articles exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges are instrveted to award only such premiums as they think the article deserving of. They will exereise their discretion as to whether they will award the first, seeond, third, or any premium.
38. Each awar? must be written in a plain, eareful maner on the blank page opposite the number of the entry.
39. No person will be allowed to interfere with the Judges while in the diseharge of their duties. Exhibiters so interfering will forfeit their rights to any premium to whieh they might otherwise be entitled.
40. Judges will be governed by the Special Kules under each elass (if any; and the General Rules. (See under the head of entries.) Any further information required can be had on application at the offiee.

## PAYING THE PREMIUMS.

41. The premiums will be paid on the last day of the Exhibition. If not convenient to call in person they will be paid to order, and all prizes not claimed within three months will be eonsidered forfeited.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

42. Hay for food, and straw and sawdust $\quad m$, will be furnished free to exhibiters.
43. Applieation for Stallion or Bull boxes, si.
two weeks previous to the opening of the Exhibition.
44. All Bulls over one year old must have rings . .oses, to prevent danger to themselves and others.
45. All aninals (exeept Sheep and Pigs) must be provided with ropes or halters to properly secure them. Proper pens will be furnished for Pigs or Sheep.
46. Auctioneers will be on the ground after the premiums are announced, for the purpose of selling any animal or article which the owner may wish to dispose of, and every facility will be offered for the transaction of business.
47. Should any information be required in reference to animals or artieles taking prizes, the owners will be expected to transmit it when required to do so.
48. Application for space should be made early, and every facility for fitting up the same will be given. For blank forms and all information. apply to
