HALLEY'S COMET


This series of six illustrated articles on Halley's Comet will be notable as chronicling the arrival in this hemisphere (on September 11th last) of that monster, which in 1456 drove all Europe into a frenzy of fear, and which at each of its visita-tions before and since, has produced a profound impression on all mankind.

Absent for seventy-five years, its return has already been detected by the camera and large telescopes, and in Decem ber we shall begin to see it with the naked eye. Nightly it will brighten and increase in bulk and length, until at its most brilliant development the Comet will possibly stretch across one-third of the sky, reaching as far as a line of sixty full moons Not before late summer will it vanish from view, to be seen no more by mortals for another three-quarters of a century.
