MINUTES OF MEETING

OF THE

HOME MISSION COMMITTEE

(WESTERN SECTION,)

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA,

TORONTO, 9th 10th and 11th October, 1883.

AT TORONTO, and within the Vestry of St. Andrew's Church there, on Tuesday the 9th day of October, 1883, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, the Home Mission Committee (Western Section) of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met and was constituted with prayer. Rev. W. Cochrane, D.D., Convener. The Committee continued in session till 2 a.m., on Friday, 12th October.

SUPPLEMENTAL SCHEME.

The sub-committee on the scheme for the augmentation of salaries, presented a report containing the following recommendations, which were adopted:—

1. That for the present ecclesiastical year forty per cent of the Home Mission Committee's receipts from all sources (excepting grants from British churches,) where not specially designated for supplemental or mission work proper, be allocated to supplemental work.

2. That the Home Mission Committee at its present meeting prepare a list of all congregations in the several Presbyteries of the western section of the church contributing less than \$750 per annum and a manse, with a view of specifying those that should be visited by deputies.

The following resolutions were adopted in connection with the scheme:—

1. That in carrying out the instructions of the General Assembly regarding congregations in Manitoba; Resolved, that the stipends of ministers duly inducted be supplemented in the first place to \$850 per annum, and participate in the surplus fund up to \$950 per annum,—corresponding with the \$750 per annum and manse in the other Presbyteries of the church—it being understood that where there is a manse \$50 per annum will be deducted from the supplement, but this shall not be applied so as to reduce the present salary of any of the ministers now settled in supplemented congregations.

2. That the salaries in cities, and in towns where living is exceptionally high, be supplemented in the first place to \$800 per annum, with allowance of \$100 per annum for house rent, and participate in the surplus fund up to \$1,000, with the same allowance for rent.

3. That congregations receiving supplement in cities or towns, in accordance with the above regulation, be required to pay at least \$500 and \$100 for house rent before being put on the list.

4. That before a settlement takes place in any vacancy requiring to be supplemented, the congregation be visited with a view to increase the contributions of the people, and the result of the visitation reported to the committee.

Rev. Dr. King resigned the convenership of the sub-committee on supplements, and Mr. D. J. MacDonnell was appointed in his stead. The names of Dr. Cochrane, Dr. Laing, and Mr. Farries, were added to this sub-committee.

The sub-committee was instructed to prepare a statement in regard to the scheme, and especially its requirements for the year; to correspond with Presbyteries by deputies or otherwise, with a view to securing hearty co-operation in working the scheme; to arrange, in connection with Presbyteries, for the visitation of congregations; to take steps to secure contributions from private individuals; and, generally, to do what to them may seem best in the interests of the scheme.

SUPPLEMENTAL SCHEME.

The following is a list of the congregations in the several Presbyteries at present contributing less than \$750 per annum and manse, together with an estimate of the amount required to increase the salaries to the above sum, with the Committee's opinion as to the action to be taken in regard to those congregations that either do not meet the requirements of the General Assembly or from whom larger contributions may reasonably be expected. The General Assembly requires that congregations receiving aid, contribute at least \$400 per annum and manse, (or allowance of \$50 for same,) and also an average contribution of \$4.50 per communicant, (or \$4.50 per family, if the families outnumber the communicants.) The statistics are taken, chiefly, from the report of the Assembly's Statistical Committee, June, 1883.

The following resolution was adopted:—That in view of the great extent and the distance of the mission field of Manitoba and the North-west, the numerous and rapid changes within it, and the consequent difficulty of making specific grants to stations in such a way as to ensure the wisest use of the money, the Committee resolves to pay, (in two equal instalments of \$3,000, on 31st December and 31st March next,) the sum of six thousand (\$6,000) dollars to the Presbytery of Manitoba, to cover the whole expenses of the work within its bounds, (excepting grants to supplemented congregations), during the next six months, leaving to the Home Mission Committee of the Presbytery to allocate the money among the stations, and to apply it for exploratory and other work, and for the salary and expenses of the superintendent of missions, instructing the Presbytery to give full information to this Committee at its March meeting as to the application of the money, with the understanding that this Committee reserves to itself the right of making all appointments for a lengthened term to the Presbytery of Manitoba.

LAKE SUPERIOR.

SAULT STE. MARIE.—There was read a report from Rev. J. A. Morrison, missionary in this field. The average sabbath attendance at Sault Ste. Marie is 70, at East Korah 50, and at Base Line 30. The church at Sault Ste. Marie is now completed and free from debt. The report was received and the committee agreed to place on record their appreciation of Mr. Morrison's services, and of his willingness to continue in the field. It was also agreed to increase the grant to \$450 per annum, in the hope that the people will increase their contributions to \$350, making the salary \$800 per annum.

PORT ARTHUR.—The Convener reported that he had visited Port Arthur in August, and found matters in a satisfactory state. The congregation are now building a new church to cost about \$7,000, which they hope to complete and open free from debt. The report was received, and it was agreed to continue Rev. J. Herald in this field.

MANITOBA.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.—There was received and read a report from Rev. J. Robertson of his labors during the past six months. His expenses, amounting to \$210, were ordered to be paid.

SPECIAL CLAIMS.—Carberry, \$37.50—granted. South Oak River, \$44.00—granted. Greenwood, \$39.00—granted. Rev. J. Scott, \$200.00—granted. Minnedosa, \$60.00—delayed, and the Presbytery asked for details. Carrot River, \$70.00—delayed, and the Presbytery asked for details. Binscarth, \$50.00—agreed that this be paid from the special grant of \$1,000 made for the past six months, unless the missionary is paid in full by the field. Rev. D. McRae, \$303; Rev. A. H. Cameron, \$350—details asked from the Presbytery; meantime agreed to pay each of these gentlemen at the rate of \$800 per annum for services rendered in accordance with the grant made in March last for two itinerant ordained missionaries. Medicine Hat, Swift Current, Maple Creek—the Presbytery's attention called to the fact that the expense of working these fields last summer should be defrayed from the special grant of \$1,000 made in March. Special Grant of \$1,000—agreed to ask the Presbytery for a detailed statement of the expenditure of the special grant of \$1,000 made in March last.

REV. D. C. JOHNSON.—The Convener reported that the Rev. D. C. Johnson, appointed to Manitoba in June, had been compelled, on account of ill health, to return to Ontario, and that he had repaid the amount allowed him for expenses to the field. The report was received.

EDMONTON.—An encouraging report of this field, where a new church building is about completed, was received from the missionary, Rev. A. Baird. It was agreed to record the committee's high appreciation of Mr. Baird's services, and their confidence that the interests of the church in this outpost are safe in his hands.

PRINCE ALBERT.—The Convener reported that Rev. W. McWilliam had accepted the appointment to this field, and had left on the 14th September, Rev. J. Robertson accompanying him from Winnipeg. The report was received.

The Rev. J. Sieveright, who had recently returned from Prince Albert, addressed the Committee, giving details of the work there. In addition to the churches built during Mr. Sieveright's term of service, a brick manse is about completed. The attendance at the Sabbath service at Prince Albert is about 150, and the people now contribute \$800 per annum towards the salary of the missionary.

APPOINTMENT OF MISSIONARIES. — The following were appointed to Manitoba for three years on the usual terms:—Rev. John Cairns, with \$100 for expenses to the field; Rev. Richmond Logan, with \$100 for expenses; Rev. J. M. Sutherland, with \$150 for expenses; Mr. R. McNabb, with \$50 for expenses. Mr. A. B. Winchester was appointed as a catechist at a salary of \$600 per annum, with \$50 for expenses to the field. Messrs. Alex. Davidson, Alex. Robson, and Archibald McDougall were appointed to the Presbytery as catechists for six months; and the Presbytery were authorized to employ as catechists, MESSRS. Archibald Matheson, J. McAlister, James Patterson and W. Laing. The Executive sub-committee were empowered to secure, if possible, the services for three years, on the usual terms, of Rev. C. McKillop for Manitoba.

SUB-DIVISION OF PRESBYTERY.—The General Assembly's remit as to the sub-division of the Presbytery of Manitoba, together with the Presbytery's recommendation thereanent, were referred to the Executive sub-committee.

“The committee, in accepting the resignation of Dr. King as Convener of their sub-committee on the augmentation of salaries, on account of his removal to Winnipeg, desires to express its gratitude for the efficient aid he has rendered in carrying on the work of this committee, and hopes, though his change of residence makes his resignation necessary, the committee will still be favored as frequently as possible with his presence and counsel.”

Dr. Cochrane and Mr. Warden were appointed to represent the committee, at a farewell meeting in connection with Dr. King's removal to Winnipeg, to be held in St. James Square Church, Toronto, on 23rd inst.

BEQUEST OF LATE MRS. DR. BURNS.—Mr. Wm. Alexander, of Toronto, executor of the late Mrs. Dr. Burns, addressed the committee. He stated that by her will of date 4th March, 1879, Mrs. Burns left the Home and Foreign Mission committees residuary legatees. A year later she expressed a wish to have a codicil added increasing the amount given by herself and the late Dr. Burns to found the Bonar-Burns Scholarship in Knox College, Toronto. Circumstances at the time prevented the codicil being made, but very frequently she expressed to friends the desire to have the Scholarship increased in value. The estate was wound up in June last, and \$750 paid each to the Home and Foreign Mission Funds of the church. A balance of \$418 and interest remains in the hands of the executor. The committee unanimously agreed to authorize the appropriation to the Bonar-Burns Scholarship fund of their half of the balance now in the hands of the executor of the estate, reporting their action to the Foreign Mission committee and also to the General Assembly.
