

BYE-LAWS OF THE INCORPORATED DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-laws, or any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex. officio, Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to eight. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the

Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.

- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
 - 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
 - 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
 - 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
 - 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office, but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

15th. The Society shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and six other members, to be chosen annually, and to be eligible for re-election. REPORT.

THE Report of the Executive Committee for 1872 is, in some respects, more satisfactory than in the preceding year. The Church Endowment Committee have reported that the full sum of £20,000, N. S. currency, has been made up from subscriptions and donations, and that therefore the fund may be used, for its proposed object, in the year 1873. According to its prospectus, the first object of the Endowment Fund is to meet the deficiency in the block sum of the S. P. G. The D. C. S. will therefore be relieved in future from the burden, which it has for the last few years undertaken, of advancing part of the salaries of the Clergy who are upon the list of the S. P. G.

The completion of the Endowment Fund is a cause for gratitude and thanksgiving to the great Head of the Church, and of prayer that it may prove a permanent benefit to the Diocese.

The Diocesan Church Society will now be able gradually to extend its work of assistance to those who are yet unable to support their own Clergy. It will, however, be necessary that those missions which have for some time been aided by D. C. S. should yearly assume more of the responsibility connected with their own Church.

The advanced price of all the necessities of life makes it needful that the incomes of the Clergy should be increased proportionately. The whole subject relating to the ability of missions to provide for their Clergy and the amount of aid which the D. C. S. can give, is now under consideration, and a Report will be presented to the next general meeting, and suggestions made as to the best mode of securing the co-operation of the people without making the missionary collect his own stipend.

The Executive Committee claim hearty and universal support for this Society which knows no party, but embraces all shades of thought which are within the Church, and aids in supporting missionaries without any distinction as to peculiar views.

The great want of our Church in this Diocese, as in other places, is men for the work of the Ministry. Several of the missions are now vacant, the clergy having removed to the neighbouring Diocese where better provision has been made to protect them from the privations of poverty.

The Executive Committee state that the income for 1873 will probably not be more than in 1872, for although several parishes have largely increased their contributions, others have failed to make any return.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

THE Annual General Meeting of the Society was held in Argyle Hall, Wednesday, July 3rd, at half-past seven, p. m.

There were present many of the Clergy from the country and representatives from the Local Committees.

The Right Rev. the President was in the chair.

After prayers and reading the minutes of the preceding meeting, the President in his opening address drew attention to the present state of the Block Sum, and also of the Church Endowment Fund.

Canon Gilpin was appointed Secretary and Treasurer, C. Bullock, Esq., Asst. Secretary.

The following members of the Society were appointed to fill up the vacancy caused by the first five upon the roll of the Executive Committee:—Messrs. W. Gossip, E. Archbold, T. A. Brown, P. Lynch and R. J. Wilson.

In accordance with notice of motion given at the last general meeting it was resolved, that so much of the 9th Bye-law of the Society be repealed as gives permission to the local committees to receive back in books or local endowment the one fourth part of their yearly contributions.

The Church Endowment Committee presented their Report shewing that only \$653.72 was wanted to complete the capital sum with which the fund could legally be used for its objects. *This Report was printed last year.*

It was resolved that the Report be received, and the thanks of the Society be returned to the Committee for the manner in which they have brought this matter to a conclusion; and especially for their firmness in resisting the temptation to use the interest.

The Bishop stated that \$400 had been offered toward making up the deficiency.

A subscription list was at once opened and the remainder of the required amount was immediately secured.

The vacancies in the Church Endowment Fund Committee were filled up by the appointment of the following gentlemen: Messrs. Fred. Allison and T. A. Brown.

It was resolved that the deficiency in the Block Sum for 1872 so far as necessary be paid from the general funds of the D. C. S., and if requisite be taken from the "Reserved Fund."

Widows and Orphans Fund Committee to report upon. That such change be made in the Rules as will allow some benefit to those who from circumstances might be excluded from any benefit under their certificates.

Attention was drawn to the difficulty met by certain of the Clergy in obtaining their salaries, and the adoption was advocated by A. McCochran, Esq., of the plan in force in some part of Canada and known as the "Quebec Scheme."

It was resolved that the ex-Committee be instructed to obtain full information respecting the working of the system, and if they shall deem it suitable for this Diocese to prepare a scheme in accordance therewith, to be laid before the next annual meeting.

It was directed that such prepared scheme should be published previously to its presentation.

The meeting was dismissed with the Apostolic Benediction.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Oct. 18, 1872.—The Bishop read a letter from the Secretary S. P. G., offering £2400 as a Block Sum grant for 1873, and requiring definite information relative to parishes not fulfilling the conditions of the Society.

F. Allison, Esq., was added to the Committee on Capabilities of Parishes, and they were requested to report at the next meeting.

A sub-committee was appointed in accordance with the wish of the Society, to consider and report upon the so-called "Quebec Scheme" and its fitness for this diocese.

The committee named were:—The Dean, the Rev. A. Brown, Messrs. W. C. Silver, W. Gossip, W. H. Wiswell, and the Secretary.

Nov. 15, 1872.—An application from the Rev. F. M. Young was presented. It was thought that his change of residence from Barrington to Tusket rendered its consideration unnecessary.

An application from Rev. J. P. Tremain was not taken up, on the ground that the necessity for aid would be met under the schedule proposed by the Committee on Capabilities of Parishes.

With reference to an application from the Rev. C. J. Shreve, the Secretary was directed to obtain further information relative to the cost of the proposed site for the new church.

Forty dollars were granted for one year, from Oct. 1st, 1872, to Rev. Canon Hensley towards defraying the expense of missionary visits on Chester Road.

The report of the sub-Committee on Capabilities of Parishes was adopted in the following form :—

"The committee, consisting of the former Committee on Salaries, together with other members of the Society, recommend that the minimum salary to be aimed at in all cases be seven hundred dollars per annum.

The Committee have, in the annexed schedule, stated the amount which in their opinion the several parishes and missions named are capable of paying, and should be required to pay toward the support of their clergyman, irrespective of any proceeds from endowment belonging to the Parish or Mission.

The Committee state moreover the local resources available for the support of such missionary, and they also suggest to the Executive Committee of D. C. S. the grants required to make up the salary to the minimum of seven hundred dollars per annum.

The sub-Committee are of opinion that any payments made from the Church Endowment Fund to a clergyman stationed at any of the places named in the schedule should tend to reduce the grant from D. C. S."

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted :—

"That this Committee having learned that their highly esteemed Vice-President, A. M. Uniacke, Esq., is about visiting Europe for a season, hereby tender to him their hearty thanks for the constant and warm interest he has ever evinced in the well-being of the D. C. S., and trusts that He who rules the raging of the storm and guideth all things right will give him abundantly such things as are good for him to have, and bring him once more in peace and safety to assist us by his wise counsels, and strengthen us by his uniform support in building up and binding together in the bonds of love our branch of the Church of God in this diocese."

"That this Committee having learned, with a deep sense of thankfulness to the Great Disposer of all things, of the happy escape of our esteemed missionary, the Rev. C. Croucher, from great peril and danger incurred while engaged in the discharge of his duties as a minister of God, altho' suffering the loss of horse, carriage, books and vestments, tender to him our hearty congratulations and christian sympathy, and trust the life which has so providentially been spared may yet be found many years with us, gathering, as we hope, souls for the Master's kingdom."

DEC. 13, 1872.—The sum of one hundred dollars was granted to purchase a site for a new church at the head of Chester Basin—the money to be paid when the land is conveyed to the D. C. S.

The report of the sub-Committee on Capabilities of Parishes was again taken up, and it was resolved that all action under the above report be suspended until the 1st July, 1873, in consequence of the remonstrance of several of the clergy affected thereby, and the uncertainty of payments from the Church Endowment Fund.

The application of the Rev. F. M. Young was taken up, and it was agreed that the Committee could not depart from their action of the preceding meeting.

An additional grant of \$100 was made to Melford for the half year ending June 30, 1873. Also, of \$100 to Ship Harbor (Tangier) for the same period.

JAN. 17, 1873.—The Secretary of the Church Endowment Fund stated that the Fund was within \$200 of completion.

Notice of motion was given for a grant to Kentville.

Notice of motion was given for the appointment of a collector to solicit subscriptions for D.C.S. in Parishes where no local committees are in operation.

FEB. 21, 1873.—The following resolution by the Church Endowment Fund Committee was ordered to be entered upon the minutes with an expression of thankfulness :

"Whereas the whole amount of \$80,000 N. S. Currency, equal to the sum of \$77,866.67 Canada Currency, required by the prospectus to be obtained from subscriptions and donations, was fully paid up on the 18th January last, as appears by the certificate signed by E. Binney, Esq., Treasurer, and W. C. Silver, Esq., Secretary of the Committee and filed—Resolved, that under the terms of the said Prospectus, the Fund went into operation on the said 18th day of January last, and from that day was, and is now, available for the purposes contemplated and expressed in the said Prospectus."

A grant of \$200 was made toward the support of a missionary at Kentville, on condition of \$400 being paid by the people. It was agreed that the grant would not be continued beyond one year unless \$500 were made up by the people.

MARCH 21, 1873. —The Bishop, in the name of the Block Sum Committee, reported that the salaries of Messrs. Brown and Downing, appointed respectively to Amherst and Louisburg, would begin from January 1st, 1873.

A grant of \$200 for one year was made toward the support of an assistant missionary at Amherst.

The sub-Committee appointed to consider the "Quebec Scheme" presented the following report:—

1st.—The sub-Committee do not think it would be advisable, at the present time, to introduce the 'Quebec Scheme' into this Diocese.

2nd.—The sub-Committee would respectfully recommend the Executive Committee D.C.S. in future grants for the support of missionaries to make direct agreements with the Parish & Mission, and to insist upon the conditions being fulfilled, and the amount required from the people being paid into the Society.

The report was adopted, and the same Committee were requested to prepare a scheme to be submitted by the Executive Committee to the next general meeting of the Society.

The Bishop suggested certain alterations in the amount, duration and conditions of grants from D.C.S. These suggestions were referred to the same sub-Committee for consideration.

It was resolved that a plan be adopted for sending deputations into parishes for furthering the objects of the D.C.S.

The schedule of the Committee on Capabilities of Parishes was taken up, and it was resolved—

"That in view of modifications suggested by the Committee on the 'Quebec Scheme' relative to the general question of finance, and of a scheme which the said Committee have been directed to prepare and lay before the next General Meeting, the report of the Committee on Capabilities of Parishes be not acted upon."

Notice of motion for an increased grant to Albion Mines was referred to the Committee on the "Quebec Scheme" for their information.

Notice of motion was given for a grant for outfit for Rev. J. L. Downing.

It was agreed that the General Meeting of the Society be held in Halifax, on Tuesday, the 1st day of July, 1873.

A sub-Committee was appointed to prepare and present an address from the D.C.S. to His Excellency Gen. Doyle upon his departure from this Province. Sub-Committee:—The Bishop, the Dean, H. Pryor, Esq., and the Secretary.

During the past year payments have been made for pensions and expenses to the amount of \$1670, leaving \$466.30 to be added to the capital. There are now forty-nine clergymen holding certificates.

A comparison with the receipts in 1872 shews a falling off in several Parishes, and no return from a few. In several places the money, although collected and reported, has not yet been sent to the Secretary.

The following increased contributions are encouraging:—ANTIGONISHE.—An advance of about \$16. BEAVER HARBOR.—(No return in 1872.) This year has sent \$50. CHESTER has shewn that its increased exertion for the support of an Assistant Missionary, has not prevented an increased contribution to D. C. S. FALMOUTH has sent a return this year which was omitted in 1872. GRANVILLE has made an advance upon its last return. St. Luke's, Halifax, has sent in the largest contribution ever received from one Parish,—its return being above \$2000. HUBBARD'S COVE has made a much larger return than in 1872. KENTVILLE has more than doubled its collection. LUNENBURG has surpassed the amount in 1872. MELFORD (no return in 1872) has sent \$31.92. NEWPORT, from which scarce anything was sent in 1872, has this year sent \$60.50. NEW Ross (no return last year) has sent \$15.68. PARRSBORO has sent a list of contributions to the amount of \$46.85. PETITE REVIERE (in place of nothing last year) has in this sent in \$30. RAWDON has made a slight advance. SACKVILLE appears to have largely increased its return, but a part of this was sent in by mistake and is to be returned by D. C. S. SHELBURNE has sent a larger amount than ever before received from that Parish, viz—\$190.83. SHIP HARBOR also has made a larger return than in 1872. The fishermen of St. Margaret's Bay have sent in an increased amount. SYDNEY, C. B., has sent \$28 more for general purposes than in 1872.

EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS.

From the Rev. J. R Campbell, Yarmouth.

The Secretary of the Local Branch will send on the Yarmouth List, together with \$200, on account.

I am glad to be able to say that no Church person holds aloof from the Society in this Parish. Every one contributes something. How far that something is an answer to this question:—*Does my annual subscription to the D. C. S. represent the idea I have of my whole yearly duty to those of the same household of faith who cannot provide for themselves?*—must be determined by each one for himself.

Although deaths, removals, and some lessened subscriptions have operated adversely—there will be a slight advance on last year's remittance for general purposes; which was the largest ever sent from this Parish.

In Parishes, where short-sighted views of the *Endowment Fund* have been inculcated, there will be much difficulty in persuading the people that their duty is in no sense remitted.

From Rev. T. H. White, D. D., Rural Dean, Shelburne.

I forward you the names of the contributors to D. C. S. from this Mission, together with \$151.13. This is, I am pleased to say, the largest contribution ever made from this Parish. In three, out of the five, places mentioned the contributions of the people are made at the Offertory in the Church or at a School House, in an out-station, where the service may be held. I always have made it a rule to preach upon the subject of Missions on such occasions, and give the people a sketch of what our Church is doing at home and abroad. The attendance, notice having been previously given, is always excellent, I must say. I think it the most Church-like way of acting. Still, in two places, I have not yet succeeded in introducing the practice.

From Rev. H. Stamer, Hubbard's Cove.

It is with very great pleasure, at the close of another financial year of the D. C. S., I take up my pen to make a few passing remarks to accompany the return list of the Hubbard's Cove Local Branch.

I have great cause to be thankful to Almighty God for the spiritual improvement manifesting itself among the people committed to my care; as a community their moral behaviour is good; the services at the church are well attended, owing, in some degree, to the improved music introduced by the Chair. And on the first Sunday of every month it is most refreshing to witness the crowds that approach the Table of the Lord. It is a difficult matter

for a person to give a statement of his own work, and, at the same time, to keep free from being considered an egotist, and, I am sure, that this is the cause why many have not graced the D. C. S. reports by enlarging on their work.

And now, a word or two as to the amount of subscriptions which I enclose, and which exceeds that of former years by fifty per cent. It may be asked what was the cause, and the answer is simply as follows: Having parceled the Mission into different districts a month or two before the lists should be made up, I then devoted a certain time to visit each, for the purpose of distributing reports and giving all other necessary information. I then said unless their offerings were given willingly to God, and not as unto man, it would be better they would not give at all, and that no second application would be made for their money, but that it should be sent or brought to me. This mode of acting had evidently the desired effect, and it was most encouraging to witness persons coming day after day with their subscriptions which, at the end, amounted to the sum of \$76.03, and which I take great pleasure in enclosing.

From Rev. C. J. Shreve, Chester.

With all we have to do in the Parish we have exceeded the amount of last year by nearly Eight Dollars, and last year's amount exceeded that of the preceding year, so that we are progressing if it be but slowly, yet it is an advance in the right direction. We have but little from Indian Point this year—after visiting other parts of the Parish, the badness of the roads prevented our getting to that district. We must go to them for their subscriptions. They have not yet learned that it is a privilege to make offerings to God, but we hope that they will learn that good lesson shortly, and find pleasure and comfort in giving to God that which He has lent to them. It is a work of time—and God's blessing resting upon man's efforts.

It would much add to the interest of the Report if the Clergy would furnish the Secretary more generally with accounts of parochial work.

APPENDIX.

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society:

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for the object to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and no other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this Fund, subject to an appeal to the whole Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8.00, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year:

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment become due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this Sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any clergyman shall go beyond the limits mentioned in Rule 10th, without the leave of the Sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of Every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again before the expiration of ten years from her husband's death, the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension for the residue of ten years. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall, at his death, receive the pension for not more than ten years, under the above limitation of ages.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days which shall happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease

17th. The clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form * * * * under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

At the general meeting of the Society, Oct. 4th, 1865—"It was the opinion of the meeting that, for purposes of insurance in the W. and O. Fund, Bermuda should not be considered within the limits of British North America."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

*Extract from the 11th object of the D. C. S.—It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's fund shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.*

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to

the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think expedient. But should the sub-Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D.C.S.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850:—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension,

V. The Endowment Sub Committee, or toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission, a sum of money, if practicable, commensurate with the amount of the Endowment shall be set apart for the payment of the expenses of the Endowment, and the same shall be so applying for the same.

VI. If any sum of money be set apart for the endowment of any Parish or Mission, the relative thereto shall be determined by the Standing Committee, and the same shall be so applying for the same.

VII. All sums of money set apart for the endowment of any Parish or Mission, or by the Standing Committee for the same, shall be held in trust by the Standing Committee of the Diocese, and shall be used for the purpose of the same, and shall be applied for the same.

The Endowment Sub Committee, dated May 17th, 1850.

"That while we draw from its funds the minimum amount required with the Society."

"With reference to the Endowment Sub Committee standing in the Parishes to secure the security of their funds, be adopted when drawn from its Reserve Fund, to be held until the same time as the Parishes."

The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorise the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub-Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

The Endowment Sub-Committee, in a Report to the Executive Committee, dated May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

"That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its '*Reserved Fourths*,' and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Society and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

"With reference to the control of the Society over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Society to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment."

The first recommendation was adopted by the Executive Committee,—the second is still under consideration.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

FORM OF LEGACY.

"I give to the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia, the sum of _____, to be applied to the general purposes of the Society." And the Receipt of the Treasurer of the Society shall be sufficient discharge for the same.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

"All subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

"If reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

(*) The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

"All applications for aid from this Society are proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

"The Executive Committee are authorized to grant, at their discretion, a sum of money not exceeding \$160, towards an outfit for any newly ordained Clergyman of the Church who may require such assistance, previous to his assumption of actual duty in the Province."

"No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted :—

"The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers, upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for purposes of salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz., one by the parish, one by the Executive Committee of D. C. S., and another by those two."

At the General Meeting in 1870 it was determined "that in Rule 10th the words "more particularly" are not to be understood as limiting the application of the funds to the objects therein enumerated."

CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND.

THE following Report from the Church Endowment Committee was received at the general Meeting 1873, and ordered to be published.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1873.

The Committee report that as anticipated in the last annual statement, the balance of the sum required from subscriptions and donations to bring up to the minimum named in the Prospectus, viz., \$80,000, equal to \$77,866.67 Canada Currency, was received by the Treasurer on the 18th of January last, and that all the requisite conditions having been fulfilled under the terms of the Prospectus, the fund went into operation on that day.

In accordance with the stipulations in the Prospectus, the first charge upon the fund is the deficit in the S. P. G. grant.

The deficiency of the present will be paid to the Treasurer of the Block Fund Committee, upon the receipt of an order signed by the President and Secretary of the Society accompanied by a statement.

As might have been expected after the successful efforts to get the Fund into operation, but a small amount of subscriptions has since been collected. The Committee, however, trust ere long to be in receipt of several sums which will considerably augment the Funds in hand.

Although this Fund has after great and unceasing exertions been made available for the purposes originally contemplated, it is earnestly hoped that the idea of increasing it to \$160,000 will not be lost sight of, and that instead of being relaxed the efforts of Churchmen will rather be stimulated by past success to endeavor speedily to realize the desired amount and eventually far to exceed it.

The Treasurer's report and account has been audited and found correct. The amount on hand on the 21st June, 1873, was \$120,388.80, Canadian Currency.

REPORT ON THE QUEBEC SCHEME.

The Report of the Executive Committee relative to the Quebec Scheme was taken up and adopted in the following form, in 1873.

The Sub-Committee recommend the adoption of the following regulations :

1st.—That no grant be ordinarily more than \$200 per annum to one mission, one clergyman.

2nd.—That in future, where there is no special condition, grants be made for *three* years from the month either next preceding or next following the date of grant, whichever may be nearest to that date ; and that they cease, in every case, at the expiration of that period unless renewed, at the least, *six* months before their termination.


3rd.—That all parishes and missions receiving aid from the D. C. S. toward the salary of their minister, shall by their wardens, or other representatives, pay to the Secretary of the Society half-yearly, on or before the 30th of June and 31st December in each year, such proportions of the required salary as may be arranged by mutual consent of themselves and the Diocesan Church Society.

4th.—On receipt of the stipulated half yearly amount from the parish or mission, the Secretary shall accept the order of the minister for the full half-year's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties.

5th.—Should the minister accept part of the amount payable by the parish or mission in kind at *cash* prices, his receipt for the same in the form of a Bill of items, may be counted by the wardens or representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the parish or mission.

6th.—Should the sums agreed to be paid by the wardens or representatives not be paid when due, or within thirty-one days after falling due, the proportion agreed to be paid by the D. C. S. may be continued for six months, and the Executive Committee shall enquire into the cause of such deficiency and consider the subject at the ensuing meeting.
