### HUNGARIAN LEADER DEMANDS PEACE TERMS

According to reports received by mail a sensation was caused in the Hungari-an parliament on December 7 by the speech of Count Karolyi leader of the Independent party in which he de-manded that the government make peace proposals to the enemy powers, that the political unity of the Hungari-an nation should be recognized and that economic independence should be granted.
