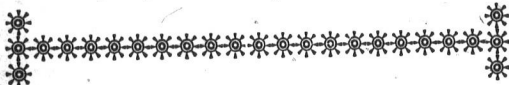

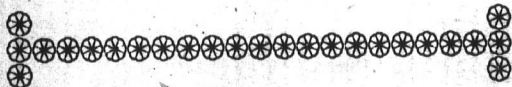

In presenting our report for the year, we cannot help feeling grateful to our Heavenly Father for the guidance and strength He has given us. Our monthly meetings have indeed been seasons of refreshing, quickening our missionary spirit, and increasing our knowledge of the lands that are out of Christ. Our quarterly prayer meetings, likewise have been very beneficial.

Ten monthly meetings have been held with an average attendance of thirty-three, and two public prayer meetings, which were well attended and interesting.

Three cases of clothing have been sent to missions in the Qu'Apelle district, also ten dollars in cash.

Death has again entered our ranks, and one of our number (Mrs. Elliot) has been called home.

We have a membership of one hundred and five, a small decrease from last year, owing to a number of removals and the formation of Auxiliaries in the Bathurst street, and Trinity Churches.

In presenting this Annual Statement we are pleased to be able to report a substantial advance made in all the branches of the Society. A deeper interest has been evinced and more enthusiasm manifested than in any former year, and we think the results are correspondingly greater.

In view of the fact that our Ecclesiastical year closed with the 30th of April, it was deemed advisable to close our society year at the same time. This makes our report extend over eighteen months. Since the last report was given at the annual meeting in October, 1892, eighteen business meetings have been held with an average attendance of twenty-four. There have also

been held three executive and ten sewing meetings. There are 74 names on the membership roll, about 55 of whom contribute through the weekly offerings. We are pleased to report an increase of 20 this year contributing in this way. If, in the year that is before us, we can still further increase the number of givers and induce those who already give to contribute more largely, the necessity for entertainments for money purposes, with all their attendant perplexities and difficulties will disappear.

During the year a small committee was formed to draft a Constitution for the Society, and we are now prepared to present to you in printed form the result of their labors.

One very important branch of work this season has been the visiting carried on by the committee for that purpose, under the direction of Mrs. Peer, who has given herself up zealously and faithfully to this particular field. This is a department that can be still further developed by the united efforts of all our members.

The experience of Mrs. Peer and her colleagues in calling upon the strangers and backward members of our Church has been most gratifying. These visits have been appreciated by many who have hitherto felt themselves strangers among us. Let us each determine next year to give up a part of our time at least to the work of this committee.

We have not been neglectful of the poor and needy, for the Dorcas Committee, under the wise direction of Mrs. Byrne, have visited the sick and needy, and dispensed food and clothing to over thirty families of deserving poor.

We feel that very much of our success has undoubtedly been due to the untiring efforts of our worthy President, who has not only labored earnestly and skillfully herself but has succeeded in infusing her own zeal and energy into many of the members.

Our Heavenly Father has guided all our work through the past, and may his glory be our aim in the future.

The year just ended has been unmarked by any special incident, but it has been one full of encouragement and advancement. We give praise to our Heavenly Father for His goodness and mercy towards us, noting especially this remarkable fact, that not one of our large school has been removed by death.

The following facts may be of interest to you:

Statistics.—The membership register of our school contains 876 names. These include 16 officers, 19 male and 36 female teachers, and 396 male and 411 female scholars. Average attendance for the year 591; for the past three months it has been the largest in our history, 565. Largest attendance on one Sunday 612. About 16,000 verses of Scripture were committed to memory by the scholars.

Classes.—The scholars are arranged in 45 classes. Our senior Bible Class meets in the church auditorium, and is under the able and efficient care of Rev. Thomas Cobb. Mr. Cobb is a veteran Bible student, and the sessions of this class are full of interest and profit to all. There are three Bible classes for young ladies only, taught respectively by Mr. J. N. Pier, Mrs. M. L. Wilson, and Mr. Charles Hudson. For young men we have two classes, taught by Mr. A. Thompson and Mr. E. S. Caswell. Our Infant class is largely attended, and the interests of the little ones are well looked after by Mr. Chard and his assistants. From the Infant Class the scholars are promoted to the Primary Class, where under the efficient care of Mrs. H. B. Somers and her six helpers, they are prepared for graduation into the main school. Our intermediate classes are taught by intelligent, earnest, and devoted ladies and gentlemen, all heartily in love with their important work of endeavouring to lead their classes to the Saviour.

Finances.—Our school is self-supporting. The receipts for the past year amount to about \$800.00. Of this amount \$50.00 has been granted to the Sick Children's Hospital, and about \$50.00 to the general missionary fund of the church.

The Library.—Our Library is large, and contains over 1,000 well-selected books. During the year the librarians prepared and had printed a splendidly-arranged catalogue, which not only gives the name of each book, but also the name of its author and a short synopsis of its contents.

We extend a cordial invitation to all to visit or unite with our school. We have classes suited to all. Of those who have children attending, we would ask earnest co-operation and sympathy. Take an interest in the teacher of your children. Give him or her your prayerful support. Come yourself. If you have had trouble in getting your children to Sunday-school, stop trying to drive them, and try the better plan of leading them.

Pray for our school, hope for it, labor for it, and God will abundantly bless.

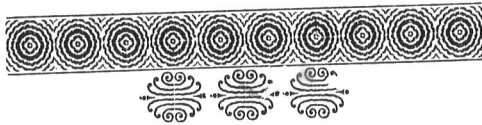
