Will be celebrated on Monday, June 23. Business transacted at today's meeting of the Board of Control.

At today's meeting of the Board of Control all the members were present. One of the most important matters dealt with was in reference to the celebration of Halifax's Natal Day, and it was decided by the casting vote of Mayor Billet that the founding of Halifax should be observed on Monday, June 23rd.

Those who favored this were Controllers O'Connor and Scanlan, and those against that date were Controllers Harris and Holden.

The topic was brought up by Controller Harris, who referred to the fact that the Natal Day of the city should be a day of civic or citizens' celebration. Controller Scanlan stated that as a native of Halifax he would not stand for a compromise in connection with changing the date to August.

Controller Harris stated that Natal Day fell on Saturday and there would be the same mix-up on or on Victoria Day between May 24 and May 28. It was very well to honor the Natal Day, but it was better to have it on a day when it could be celebrated on a holiday.

Controller Scanlan stated that ever since he was a boy, Natal Day was the day of the year, and he could not see how it could be changed. He stated that he would not stand for a compromise in connection with changing the date to August.
