Can't River empties into the main Miramichi about 4 miles above Blackville Station, on the south side. It is about 60 miles long, across the northern corner of Sanjour County and heads well up into York around Little River, a tributary of the Can't.

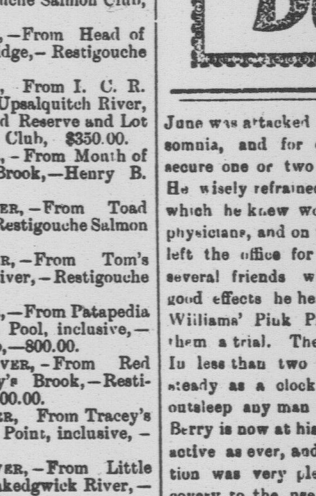
