## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

## SOCIETY OF ARTS AND CRAFTS OF CANADA.

## PREAMBLE.

THE arts have always had periods of rise and decline, and the marked decline which occurred early in the present century is said to have been caused in part by the application of steam-power to machinery ; the great ease of production causing the excessive use of ornamentation. A movement set in characterized by a return to simplicity of design, appropriate ornament, and the substitution of hand-work for machine-work wherever it was possible. A small band of workers, headed by William Morris, led the revival, which spread from England to the Continent and finally to our own country. This widespread interest in applied art has caused an activity which has sometimes resulted in extravagance, but which, on the whole, has been productive of great improvement in all manufactured articles.

## ARTICLES.

THAT this organization shall be called and known as "The Society of Arts and Crafts of Canada."

The object of "The Society of Arts and Crafts of Canada" is the encouragement of original design and its individual expression, to promote this object by holding Exhibitions of original Canadian work, the names of the designer and executant being always given ; by occasional loan exhibits ; by lectures ; and by rendering the literature on the subject of handicraft accessible to those who are interested.

Section 1. The Society shall have Associate, Working and Honorary Members. All interested in and willing to aid the work of the Society may

Article III. Member. become Associate Members by sending in their names to the Secretary and paying an annual fee of $\$ 1.00$.

Section 2. The names of all persons desirous of becoming Working Members, and who have exhibited
at the previous or current exhibition, must be proposed by a Working Member and handed in to the Secretary, in writing, for submission to the Executive, who will then notify him (or her) of his election. An annual fee of $\$$ r.oo shall then be sent to the SecretaryTreasurer.
Section 3. Honorary Membership shall be complimentary only and without fee.

Article IV.
The Officers of the Society shall consist of a President, one Vice-President, and a Secretary-Treasurer, who, with eleven Working Members, elected by the Working Members, shall form an Executive Committee to control and provide for the general interests of the Society. Five members of this Executive shall constitute a quorum.
Special Committees shall be appointed for special work.
The President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be exofficio members of all Committees.
The Society shall hold an Annual Meeting and such other meetings as shall be required to carry on the work and objects of the Society.

Article VII. Privileges of Members

Each member shall pay an annual fee of \$1.00. Any Working Member whose fee remains unpaid at the meeting previous to the Annual Meeting shall not be entitled to a vote at said Annual Meeting. Associate Members shall not be entitled to vote.
All Working Members in good standing shall be entitled to exhibit work at Exhibitions held, subject to the rules and regulations set forth in the Circular

Article VI. Fees
Article V. issued in connection with said Exhibitions. Any Working Member in good standing shall be eligible for election to the Executive.

Associate Members shall be entitled to free entrance to opening of said Exhibitions, to attend meetings and take part in discussions, but are not entitled to vote.
Article VIII.
This Society may federate with other Societies of Federation

## Article IX. Amendments

 like purpose or which offer specific advantages, if a majority vote of the Annual Meeting shall so decide on a recommendation from the Executive.This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of the Working Members present at any Annual Meeting, provided the number of Working Members present are not less than fifteen, notice of proposed amendment or alteration having been handed in to the Executive, in writing, one month previous to the Annual Meeting.

## STANDING ORDERS.

The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the First Monday in January, provided said Monday does not fall on any public holiday, in which case, or when deemed advisable in the interests of the Society, another approximate date may be substituted by the Executive.
Section 2. Such other meetings as are required shall be held at the call of the President, or at the request of three members of the Executive.
The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows :-
I. Minutes of previous Annual Meeting.
2. Correspondence.
3. President's remarks.
4. Roll Call.
5. Appointment of Members of the Society as Returning Officers and Tellers for the voting.
6. Annual report of the Secretary-Treasurer.
7. Appointment of Auditors for Treasurer's report.
8. Election of Officers by ballot.
9. Amendments to Constitution of which due notice has been given.
10. Other business.

The order of business at meetings other than the Annual Meeting shall be as follows :-
I. Reading of Minutes of previous meeting.
2. Correspondence.
3. Business arising out of Minutes or Correspondence.
4. New Business.

All new business to be brought before the meetings of the Executive must be submitted to the Secretary, in writing, at the previous meeting as a Notice of Motion.
Section 2. The Secretary shall, at any time, call special meetings at the request of the President, when the business to come up must be stated in the notification.

Section 3. At all meetings of the Society, excepting the Annual Meeting, five shall constitute a quorum. Section 4. The Society shall hold an Annual Meeting for the election of officers and the transaction - of business.

Section 5. The meetings of the Executive shall be held at such time and place as the members may appoint.

Section 6. The President shall call a meeting at any time for special business at the written request of five Working Members of the Society.

Section 7. In the event of the absence of the President and Vice-President, the members present at the meeting may elect a Chairman.

The Society shall hold at least one Exhibition during the year, date to be fixed approximately at the Annual Meeting, on recommendation from the Executive. Special committees shall be named for special work in connection with said Exhibitions.

All resolutions and motions must be presented to the Secretary in writing.
All correspondence and papers must be submitted to the Executive before being published in any paper, pamphlet or periodical, over the name of the Society.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society, except as hereinafter provided, and conduct them after the prescribed order of business.

Section 2. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside. (See Standing Order No. 3.)

SECTION 3. The Secretary-Treasurer shall present a full report of the year's proceedings at the Annual Meeting ; shall prepare the order of business for each meeting; shall have charge of all correspondence belonging to the Executive Committee, shall keep copies of all letters written; shall have charge of all printing ; shall issue all notices of meetings and keep correct minutes of meetings held; shall read said minutes at the next meeting; shall have charge of the roll and minute books ; shall receive, collect, hold and give receipts for all fees and other moneys, disbursing the same by order of the Executive. All accounts and cheques shall be initialled or signed by the President, or his (or her) representative. The Auditors shall examine the Secretary-Treasurer's accounts before they are submitted to the Annual Meeting.

Nominations for the officers and members of the Executive may be made up to the hour of holding the Annual Meeting, and the elections shall be by ballot.

Should any officer be unable to complete his (or her) year, the Executive shall have power to elect a substitute.

These Standing Orders may be amended or added to at any of the meetings of the Society by a twothirds vote of the Members present, notice of such amendments having been given at a previous meeting.
